'We were outplayed'

India skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni described the series defeat to Bangladesh as disappointing and admitted that the visitors were outplayed by the hosts.

Speaking to reporters following the match at Mirpur yesterday, he said, "It was quite disappointing... we were completely outplayed. We didn't put up runs on a decent wicket and our start wasn't right either." When asked if this was his

career's most disappointing moment, Dhoni said, "No. We can't forget the World Cup," referring to the 2007 World Cup, where India were eliminated in the first round.

While Dhoni mainly blamed his batsmen for the defeat, he said that fatigue could have also played a role in their abysmal displays.

"Well it has been a long season... four months in Australia, two months in England. It could be a reason... very difficult to say. It's almost the same team that keeps playing in such conditions."

Siddikur ends on third

Bangladesh's premier golfer Siddikur Rahman claimed his second top-ten finish of the Asian Tour season after ending the Queen's Cup in joint third position yesterday. The 30-year-old golfer returned a card of three-under (68) in the final round for an aggregate of 10-under (274) to end four shots behind eventual champion Prayad Marksaeng of Thailand.

traded four birdies for a single bogey. This was the second time, after a seventh-place finish in the Hero Indian Open, that Siddikur managed to finish inside top ten this season.

The two-time Asian Tour winner

"I will head home to prepare for the Omega European Masters next month. My coach will be going there with me for the first time. Hopefully it will be a good outing in Switzerland," Siddikur hoped.

The fine effort earned Siddikur a paycheque of 16,950 dollars, lifting him up to 24th position in the AT Order of Merit and is likely to bring him back into eligibility list for the 2016 Rio Olympics.

While it was one of those tough days for India captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni, who encountered a hostile press

conference with journalists trying to crucify him for yet another disappointing defeat, his Bangladesh counterpart Mashrafe Bin Mortaza received a completely different ovation. One enthusiastic local reporter held the Tigers' captain up while he was on his way to the press conference.

And when he finally arrived at the media briefing room along with a success in one-day cricket. shy Mustafizur Rahman for a second successive time, the mood turned

extremely festive.

A broad smile on Mashrafe's face even before he uttered a word explained how big an achievement the series victory against India was.

"It is one of the biggest achievements actually. I think the boys are really confident. Maybe we didn't expect to win that way. But we were always going to play to win and fight till the last ball and obviously I know that if we play our best cricket, it will be competitive and we can win as well. I will say that a lot of luck was also involved," said Mashrafe in response to a question about whether it was their biggest

The inspirational Bangladesh skipper expressed his satisfaction

over the success but he was not at all overwhelmed.

"Look, consistency was our biggest problem. At the moment things are going well for us and I hope it will continue. In cricket, momentum is very important. Hopefully the boys will keep it up. There were a lot of challenges in the last 15 years but keeping this form is going to be a greater challenge for us. I think it's a good pressure. When you win everything comes out well. Hopefully the boys will now deliver regularly," he said on his upcoming challenges.

Mashrafe once again said that it was their fearless approach which was bringing them success and also said that he always loves to play attacking cricket.

Terming Nasir Hossain as one of the best off-spinners in the team, Mashrafe said that as per his analysis India lost quite a few wickets to off-spinners in the last one and a half years. And that was the reason why Nasir was brought on early in the game on Sunday. The bowler took two wickets and bowled a tidy

Regarding the third and final game, Mashrafe said: "No, there is no pressure, nobody told us ahead of the match that we will win this series 2-0. India also said that we have nothing to lose so now we will just come on the field and enjoy. It we do that the result will be there. But we are not worried or thinking about a whitewash. We are just hoping to do our best."

Nasir revels...

Yesterday was no difference. With Shikhar Dhawan and Virat Kohli cruising, Mashrafe Bin Mortaza decided to bring in Nasir. In only his second over of the day, he trapped the dangerous Virat Kohli in front. Three miserly overs later, he got rid of Dhawan with a beautifully tossed up delivery.

The arrival of Nasir in the eleventh over of the match also put a lid on the run flow. He never did anything special; but just ensured bowling to his field, something that was evident with the way he bowled against Mahendra Singh Dhoni.

Off the 32 deliveries he bowled to Dhoni, 19 of them were dot balls. The number of times he forced the India skipper to merely defend the ball to either a square leg or short mid-wicket, was very noticeable. But of course, it wasn't the first time that Nasir bowled with

such impeccable accuracy. His bowling average this year, in fact, has overshadowed the top bowlers of Bangladesh. In 2015, Nasir bowled 50.4 overs, taken eight wickets at an

average of 29.62. Only Mustafizur and Arafat Sunny have better bowling averages. But then again, they both played lesser number of matches. While Nasir has played eight ODIs, Mustafizur and Arafat have featured in two and four ODIs respectively.

What makes Nasir's bowling stats a lot more phenomenal is the fact that he has bowled almost thrice as many overs this year as compared to the first three years of his career.

Since 2011 to 2014, Nasir bowled 60.1 overs, gained three wickets and averaged a disappointing 100.33. Nasir was never able to provide a clear-cut answer regarding his bowling improvement.

However, many reckon that it was the decision to drop the player prior to the Zimbabwe series last year that brought out the best in him. It was big decision, considering that Nasir's World Cup

slot was at stake. The player, as he would go on to state later, feared that his career would come to an end. It was his ability to force the selectors to bring him back for

the World Cup that changed the course of his career yet again. At the moment, Nasir knows that he doesn't have an assured place in the side. A powerful Sabbir Rahman can bat in the same position as he did in his first three years, while a

host of spinners are always in contention.
