Bangladesh's neverexperienced-before 2-0 lead in the threematch ODI series against India has so far been a master-

stroke of Mustafizur Rahman. The 19-year-old left-arm pace bowler was the wrecker-in-chief in those two magnificent victories for the Tigers. His debut five-for in the first ODI followed by a six-for in the second were so dominant that they overshadowed any other individual contributions from the Tigers' ranks.

But it will be unwise not to recall the fantastic opening stand between Tamim Iqbal and Soumya Sarkar and the two early wickets by Taskin Ahmed in the opening game and most importantly, the back-to-back half centuries from a cool and composed Shakib Al Hasan.

Shakib's efforts might not have gotten that much attention as the country was gripped by 'Mustafizur mania', but Bangladesh captain

was no mean achievement.

"It is natural that all the discussions are now focused on Mustafizur. His achievements against a team like India have certainly overshadowed contributions of other players in our team. But some members of our team have silently contributed with big roles in our two wins against India. As a captain I feel very proud of the way Shakib batted in both the games against them", the inspirational Tigers captain told the Daily Star yesterday.

Shakib struck 52 in the first game and was involved in a crucial 83run fifth wicket stand with Sabbir Rahman. It was an effort that took Bangladesh past the 300-mark from a disturbing 146 for four.

Astro-turf all cleared to be laid

Bangladesh Football Federation (BBF) is set to resume installation work of the Astro-turf at the Birshrestha Shaheed Mostafa Kamal Stadium in Kamalapur after the National Board of Revenue exempted over one crore taka in vat, advance income tax and port demurrage for the turf, which is being provided by the FIFA under its Goal Project 4.

Nine containers full of raw materials of the Astroturf had been confined at the Chittagong port and the Kamalapur Inland Container Depot since February due to failure of the BFF in meeting the vat, tax and port demurrage.

The BFF however was seeking the release of the raw materials without any payment as these materials fall into sport goods category.

Later, the finance minister and the shipping minister came forward and waived the taxes to give all clear for the release of the materials.

"Part of the raw materials will be carried from Chittagong tonight (Tuesday) and the rest of it will be taken to the stadium from Kamalapur ICD from next week, "said BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag.

The installation work will start soon after a visit by a FIFA consultant on June 1," added Shohag.

Shohag hoped that the installation work should be completed within 35 days of start of its installation.

However, Chandika Hathurusingha's charges have suddenly looked unbeatable with subcontinental superpowers India and Pakistan suffering unexpected series defeats with fullstrength sides.

Former Proteas paceman Andre Nel said picking an under-strength side for the ODIs will ask serious questions of South Africa's depth.

AB de Villiers, Hashim Amla and Faf du Plessis will make the trip for the three-match ODI series but with no Dale Steyn or Vernon Philander, the bowling looks a little light.

"They have a nice mix of slightly older and younger players who are gelling well, which is why it is a bit of a concern that we are taking a slightly weaker team to

Bangladesh. Their senior players have morphed into a dangerous senior core that delivers consistently. They need to be taken more seriously now but I hope our younger guys can stand up and be counted on," Nel said.

"Just because their Champions Trophy qualification is secured doesn't mean they will be less of a threat. After beating Pakistan and India, they will want to continue that momentum. If they can beat South Africa and India in back-to back series', that'll prove how good they are."

Despite snaring career-best ODI figures of 5-45 against Bangladesh in Guyana during the 2007 World Cup, Nel had to watch on as the army of leftarm spinners tied an inextricable web.

The 67-run reverse remains South Africa's sole defeat against Bangladesh in all formats, with Mashrafe Mortaza, Tamim Iqbal, Shakib-Al-Hasan and Mushfigur Rahim all fresh faces. They are now the leaders of a side whose youngsters are now the aggressors.

Their newfound, in-your-face brand

of cricket has been encapsulated in the performances of 19-year-old left-arm seamer Mustafizur Rahman, who's taken 11 wickets in his first two games.

Pace bowling has been one of their long-standing weaknesses but the muscle of Taskin Ahmed and Rubel Hossain has added teeth to their penetrative spin bowling. It is an improvement that has impressed Nel even though he expected AB de Villiers' side to rise to the challenge.

"Their bowlers under Heath Streak and Hathurusingha have been very good. The biggest thing that has come from them are their improved skill levels as you need skill to thrive on those pitches. That is one department where they have become really good," Nel said.

"Since senior players are persistently taking responsibility, the younger players are also realising that they need to contribute in their way. They've learnt the art of establishing and building partnerships. They also play for each other now and they are getting smarter in the way they play their cricket, which is why they are far more effective now."

If Brazil are to win their fifth Copa America in seven editions, they are going to have to do it the hard way.

The South American super-power decided

Argentina, Colombia and Brazil, the teams ranked third to fifth in the FIFA World rankings are all in the same side of the draw, while on the other side you find the likes of 61st ranked Peru up against

89th placed Bolivia.

In fairness, Chile (19th) are actually drawn in their quarterfinal against the highest ranked team in their half, Uruguay, the defending champions ranked eighth by

And it is Argentina and Colombia who have been hardest hit, as the two highest ranked sides face each other in the last eight.

Whichever negotiates that clash of the titans, they will expect to find Brazil in the semis as the Selecao are up against Paraguay.

Paraguay may have reached the final four years ago, just a year after making it to the World Cup quarterfinals, but they have been in freefall since, failing to reach last year's World Cup and dropping to 85th in the world.

Ranked 15th after their World Cup 2010 exploits, Paraguay won only four out of 19 international matches from the beginning



Catania rocked by fixing scandal

Italian police have arrested seven people in connection aimed at helping Serie B club Catania beat relegation to the country's third division.

Catania club President Antonino Pulvirenti, sporting director Pablo Consentino and ex-sporting director Daniele Delli Carri were all placed under house arrest along with two agents and two managers of online betting sites.

Reports in Italy said the seven are being held on charges of sports fraud after being accused of fixing the results of at least five of Catania's league matches last season.

Among the matches in question are Catania-Livorno, Catania-Avellino, Catania-Trapani, Catania-Latina and, in

relation to another probe, Messina-Ischia.

Dubbed "the Goal Train", the scandal is just the latest in a series of affairs to hit Italian football. Previously rocked in the past with a match-fixing affair by the Calcioscommesse (2012) and Calciopoli (2006) scandals, the most recent affairs in Italy have been far less significant but have shown that match-fixing remains a problem in the lower leagues.

Last month an investigation dubbed "Dirty Soccer" by the Italian media led to 50 arrests in connection with illegal matchfixing in 31 matches, mainly in Italy's lower professional leagues.

"At least five games, maybe six were fixed and sums of money given to players," said Catania's public prosecutor Giovanni Salvi. "Other individuals are being investigated but they will remain unnamed."

Catania, based in Sicily, were relegated from Serie A in 2014.
