



Thailand wraps up trafficking probe

Rights groups skeptical about govt action

Thai police yesterday said they had "shown sincerity" and wrapped up the country's biggest investigation into human trafficking, as rights groups questioned whether

they had even scratched the surface. Thailand began a crackdown on trafficking networks and suspected camps hidden deep in its jungle-carpeted mountains last month following the discovery of more than 30 bodies buried in camps in the south.
