WI confirm Zimbabwe tri-series

West Indies Cricket Board confirmed that West Indies will take part in a tri-series involving Zimbabwe and Pakistan in Aug-Sep 2015. Zimbabwe will host the tournament, but both Zimbabwe Cricket and Pakistan Cricket Board are yet to confirm the schedule.

West Indies and Pakistan, currently ranked eighth and ninth respectively in the ICC ODI rankings, will be battling for a spot in the 2017 Champions Trophy. Only the top seven teams as of September 30, 2015 will participate in the competition.

Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club got the second leg of the Manyavar Bangladesh Premier League to a spectacular start with a record-breaking 9-1

goal win over Farashganj SC at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The defending champions, who roped in Nigerian coach Joseph Afusi after terminating contract with Maruful Haque at the end of the first leg, were vindicated of their decision to see the Nigerian's second stint at the club start in a flying fashion. Wedson Anselme scored four, Mamunul Islam slotted three while Landing Darboe and substitute striker Toklish Ahmed bagged one goal each to give the Dhanmondi giants a record breaking win in the top-tier professional league, eclipsing the previous record of 8-0 wins held jointly by them and Muktijoddha Sangsad, both of which came against nowrelegated Uttar Baridhara Club last season.

The win took the league leaders six points clear at the top while Farashganj, who came

into the game with only one session of training behind them, remained at the bottom with only four points.

The defending champions took only eight minutes to open the scoring when Gambian forward Darboe fired home from the edge of the six-yard box before Wedson doubled the margin in the 25th with a spectacular angular shot that went in after thudding the inside of the far post.

Farashganj reduced the margin in the 38th minute, thanks to Nigerian striker Peter Akinyele who danced past two defenders before slotting it past goalkeeper Mazharul Islam Himel. But that was as best as it got for Farashganj because defending champions soon restored the two-goal cushion before putting six more past a hapless Farashganj goalkeeper in the second half.

Wedson, the highest scorer of last edition, made it 3-1 in the 45th minute before com-

pleting the hattrick five minutes into the second half. Mamunul then got in on the act with a spot-kick in the 52nd minute before scoring his second and third goals in the 73rd and 90th minutes to bag the fourth hattrick of the league.

In between Mamun's first and third goal, Wedson struck his fourth to take his tally to 10 for the league, just one less than highestscorer Brothers' Augustine Walson, while substitute Toklish scored in the 83rd minute with a brilliant volley.

ABAHANI SCRAPE PAST RAHMATGANJ New signing Sunday Chizoba struck a brace as Abahani edged past Rahmatganj MFS with a 3-1 victory in the second match of the day at the same venue.

Ghanaian marksman Osei Morison scored the other goal for Abahani while Mohammad and Sohel Nurul Absar scored one each for the Old Dhaka outfit.

The win lifted Abahani to 20 points, equal with Mohammedan SC, Brothers Union and Sheikh Russel KC who are yet to start their second leg.

schedules. While Rivad was working as per his rehabilitation programme, the likes of Nasir and Arafat were training under the watchful eyes of Ruwan Kalpage, Bangladesh's spin coach.

While the Tigers did employ

four pacers against India in the ODIs, both captain Mashrafe Bin Mortaza and Shakib Al Hasan, in the last few weeks indicated that the hosts may use a different strategy for the upcoming series against South Africa.

It therefore wasn't a surprise when Kalpage was repeatedly hit with questions yesterday regarding Bangladesh's strategy against South Africa. Expectedly so, the Sri Lankan wasn't too keen on answering those questions.

"I don't want to make any comments on what we are going

to do tactically. We want to keep it a secret. We have just started training with our spinners. We have got Arafat and Nasir here to train and improve on some of their basic areas," said Kalpage.

"These South African players have played in the IPL and have played on subcontinent tracks that turn a lot. They have got used to that. We can't underestimate them. They are aggressive players and we have a plan for them. We won't just go after them with spin," he added.

Apart from Arafat and Nasir, spinner Taijul Islam and Jubair

Hossain also began their training sessions in Mirpur. Legspinner Jubair, who was drafted in the squad for the third ODI against India following Taskin Ahmed's injury, hopes he can get a shot at the Proteas.

"My aim is to bowl in the right areas and if I do so then I can confuse any player of the world. I'll try this in the series

if I get a chance," said Jubair. "We are watching different players' action on Youtube. We will also see more videos when practice begins. Thereafter, the team management will formulate a comprehensive game plan for them," he added.

The Tigers will play a practice match against the HP unit in Mirpur tomorrow in a bid to kick start their preparations for the South Africa series.

SL need 153 to level series

despite a defiant century from Azhar Ali. Pakistan, who trailed by 177 runs in the first innings, were bowled out for 329 in their second knock by tea on the fourth day to leave the hosts a target of 153 runs to level the three-match series.

But heavy rain prevented play in the final session, setting the stage for an absorbing final day's play on a wearing pitch at the P Sara Oval.

Azhar anchored the Pakistan innings with a defiant 117, his ninth Test innings, but found little support at the other end as the last six wickets tumbled for 55 runs.

Wicketkeeper Dinesh Chandimal pouched five catches and also effected a stumping, while debutant fast bowler Dushmantha Chameera claimed three wickets in an impressive Sri Lankan display in the field.

Azhar was reprieved twice during his vigil in which he faced 308 deliveries and hit just six boundaries.

Azhar had added four runs to his overnight score of 64 when he was dropped by a diving Kumar Sangakkara at first slip off Prasad.

When he moved to 114, Azhar was saved by a television review after umpire Sundaram Ravi had declared him leg-before off Prasad.

But the Pakistan number three was stumped soon after when he tried to hit left-arm spinner Rangana Herath out of the stadium. Pakistan, who started the day at 171-

2, lost two important wickets in the

morning session to go to lunch at 244-4.

Sri Lanka secured a crucial wicket when overnight batsman Younis Khan edged an out-swinger from Angelo Mathews to Chandimal, ending a 73-run stand for the third wicket with Azhar.

Younis, making his 100th Test appearance, scored 40 after making six in the first innings.

Skipper Misbahul Haq, seemingly disturbed by a band playing in the stands, requested the umpires to stop the music saying it upset his concentration.

ICC asked to clarify Modi's claims

Cricket Association of Bihar (CAB) secretary Aditya Verma on Sunday shot off a letter to the International Cricket Council (ICC) seeking clarification on allegations against three international cricketers' involvement in "illegal things".

Former Indian Premier League (IPL) chief Lalit Modi alleged on Saturday that Indian cricketers Suresh Raina, Ravindra Jadeja and West Indian Dwayne Bravo had taken bribes from a bookie. The trio are all members of IPL franchise Chennai Super Kings.

Modi claimed through a series of tweets on Saturday that real estate tycoon of HDIL.co Baba Diwan had given apartments to the players in addition to money.

He said when he was the IPL chief he "had banned him

[Baba] from bidding for any IPL teams". Modi claimed Diwan was a good friend of Gurunath Meiyappan and Raj Kundra, who have been implicated in the 2013 IPL betting and match-fixing case by the Supreme Court. Modi also posted a letter which he claimed he wrote to

ICC CEO Dave Richardson in June 2013, passing all the information and urging him to act upon it. Verma also addressed his letter to Richardson, urging him to save the integrity and credibility of the ICC.

"It is my humble request to you kindly save the integrity and credibility of ICC. Yesterday, Mr. Lalit Modi mail of 2013 came in a electronic media, Modi said that he wrote to you about the involvement of 3 Players of CSK in illegal things," Verma wrote in the letter.

"They received crores of money in cash and get flats in Delhi, Noida and Mumbai. This is a very serious charges against top 3 international cricketers who are also the member of CSK cricket team in IPL," Verma wrote.
