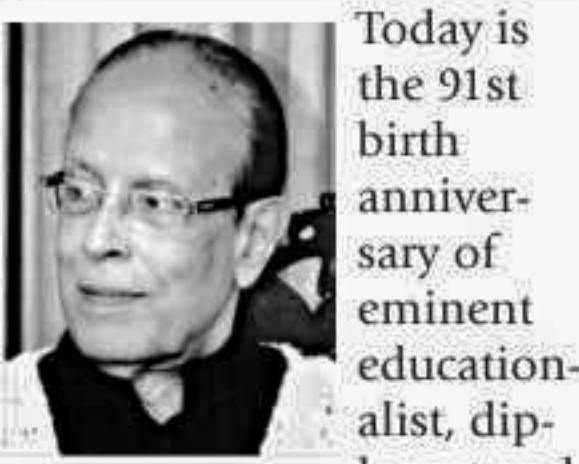


Khan Sarwar Murshid's birthday today

Today is the 91st anniversary of eminent educationist, diplomat and intellectual Prof. Khan Sarwar Murshid. Born in Comilla in 1924, he was at the forefront of most of the political and cultural movements of the country from the 1952 Language Movement to the 1971 Liberation War. He was a professor of English at Dhaka University, a member of Mujibnagar Commission during the Liberation War, ambassador to Poland and Hungary, and chairman of Transparency International Bangladesh. He died on December 8, 2012.

Delhi okays Bangladesh mission in Guwahati

India has accepted Bangladeshi government's proposal to open a new deputy high commission in Guwahati in Assam. The new commission in Guwahati will have consular jurisdiction over the states of Assam, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Manipur, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh. Bangladesh already has diplomatic representation in India's New Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai and Agartala. Foreign ministry officials said Dhaka has also proposed that Bangladesh visa office in Agartala should be upgraded to an assistant high commission. Bangladesh's government has given concurrence for the opening of Indian assistant high commissions in Khulna and Sylhet.

MERIT LIST FOR COLLEGE ADMISSION Many worry over not finding their names

A group of students, whose names were not on the first merit list published by the education ministry, demonstrated before the Dhaka Education Board yesterday demanding that the government ensure their admission into colleges. Around 100 aspirants and their parents gathered before the office of the board at Bakshi Bazar. They were worried as they did not find their names on the list. "I gave names of five colleges of my choice, but my name was not on the list. I obtained GPA-5 in the SSC examination," said Shimul of Mohammadpur, adding, "Names of two of my friends were on the list." "I want my daughter to get the opportunity to study at the college of her choice as she did well in all her examinations," said an upset father. After a delay of four days due to a technical glitch, the education ministry early Monday published the first merit list with names of over 10.93 lakh students for admission into class XI at different colleges. In the first list, the ministry did not

nominate over 62,000 students for any college. Some of those students demonstrated yesterday. Besides, some students complained of errors in the names. The officials assured them of solving their problems, and said a second merit list would be published soon. However, students and guardians were still worried as there are only a limited number of seats in popular colleges sought by most students. **LEGAL NOTICE** A Supreme Court lawyer yesterday served a legal notice to the authorities asking them to cancel, in 24 hours, names of 42 candidates that were sent to Viqarunnisa Noon School and College, Bangla version for admission into class XI. Eunus Ali Akond served the notice claiming that the authorities concerned of the government and Dhaka Education Board sent the names illegally as the 42 candidates passed SSC from institutions other than Viqarunnisa. He said there was no advertisement or seat for admission of students from other institutions.

Savar RMG workers protest 'unpaid overtime'

Several hundred RMG workers yesterday demonstrated at their factory in Dhaka Export Processing Zone in Savar of Dhaka protesting "unpaid overtime". At least five persons also sustained minor injuries in a clash between the workers of FCI Ltd and its management staff, DEPZ sources said. The workers alleged that the authorities forced them to work for additional two-and-a-half hours with no payment, violating the factory rules. The plant was shut for the day by the authorities who could not be contacted for comment.

Two female garment workers, who were burnt in a fire that broke out at their house in Chittagong city's EPZ area on Thursday, have died at Chittagong Medical College Hospital. Kohinoor Akhter, 19, of Bandarban, died on Monday, and Nargis Akhter, 20, of Cox's Bazar, died yesterday. On Thursday, the family members went to bed without switching off their gas stove properly and later during seheri they lit a candle, initiating the fire. Nargis' brother Nayan, 17, died on the spot and another member Salma is undergoing treatment at the hospital.

Man found dead in capital
