Dickinson
'Singing Better
Than Ever'

Iron Maiden fans can expect the group's new album "The Book of Souls" to feature killer vocals from Bruce Dickinson. In a new interview with UK magazine "Kerrang!" about the band's new disc and Dickinson's cancer diagnosis, bassist Steve Harris revealed that Dickinson sounds "better than ever."

Iron Maiden recorded their new album in late 2014 and in February of this year the group announced Dickinson had a cancerous tumor on the back of his tongue. Even though the timings of these events were close together, Harris stated that no one



knew of or even suspected Dickinson's diagnosis while recording.

The group delayed the release of "The Book of Souls" to let Dickinson recuperate. Since then the singer has been given the "all clear" by doctors and Iron Maiden has set a Sept. 4 release for the album.

With the release of their new album, the bassist revealed that fans can expect a new tour from the group as well.

Veteran tabla maestro Pandit Pabitra Mohan Dey has trained many tabla talents who have made a name for themselves both within and outside the country. A tabla teacher at Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) Sangeet Bidhalaya, he was honoured recently by Mymensingh Shilpakala Academy authority with a crest and citation for his lifelong outstanding contribution to the field of rhythmic music.

Pabitra was also honoured by Udichi Mymensingh and BAU unit; and Jatiya Rabindra Sangeet Sammilan Parishad, Dhaka.

"I was born in a music-loving family and my father was an eminent flute player while uncle Modan Mohan was a corned player", said Pabitra.

"I had the opportunity to attend classical programmes by famous classical Ustads like Nazabat Ali Khan, Bipin Chandra Das, Samir Kumar Das, Bijoy Bhattacharya, Amanat Ali Khan, Fateh Ali Khan, Alauddin Khan, Rashid Khan, Pandit Gyan Prakash Ghosh and Chinmoy Lahiri," said Pabitra, adding that he is honoured to gain recognition..

Talented and versatile actress Rosy Siddique is a popular face both on the small screen and stage. There's little doubt that hard work and talent have brought her where she is today. In a chat with The Daily Star, she talked about the month of Ramadan.

"Ramadan is the month of self-control. Traditionally, people used to share food or distribute it among the poor. Sadly, now Ramadan no longer follows old customs; it has become more of a business. People flaunt their wealth by splurging on clothes, jewelry and iftar at expensive restaurants."

"There are also people who go on vacations at this time. I never felt the need for a vacation during the month of Ramadan. Now, I don't

even have the time to go out because I have to take care of my daughter, who will now appear for her A-Levels. It's just not vacations that I don't take during Ramadan, I hate going anywhere --- there is a huge rush of traffic, especially around the evening time. It's a hassle to get out of home. I have to cook for iftar, I have to take my daughter to the coaching centre. The worst is the traffic on the road that causes annoying delays."

"Since I do most of the cooking I don't like wasting my time in traffic. Usually, for iftar, I make kichuri, Chhola-biriyani, pulao or plain rice. I don't go for the conventional iftar, as we make this our dinner time because we have to eat again at Sehri. One has to be conscious about their health, too as there are only short gaps between iftar, dinner and sehri."

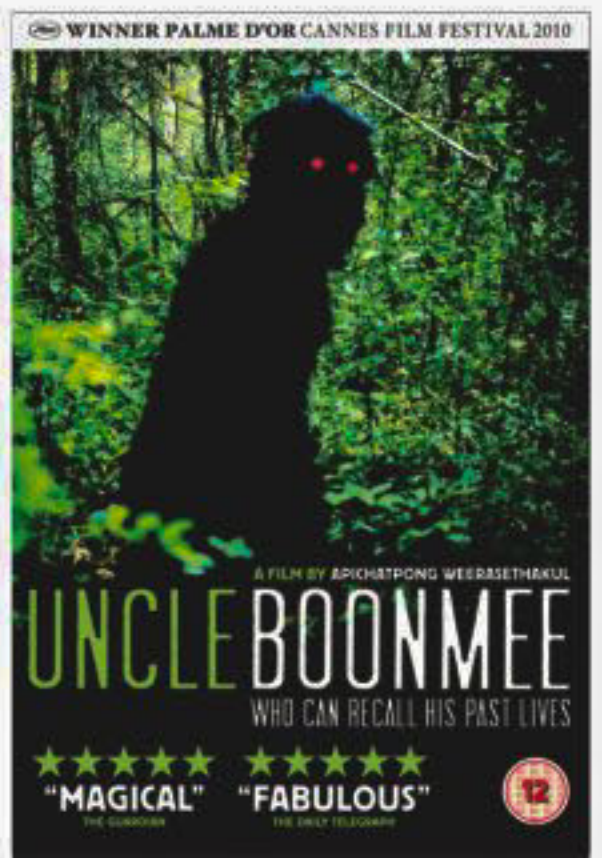
