



Be careful while making comments on judiciary
Says SC at hearing on Fakhrul's bail

The Supreme Court yesterday asked all to be careful with their remarks about the judiciary and to uphold the court's dignity and image, and not make any unnecessary or derogatory comments.

The court would not hesitate to take necessary measures against anybody, if he or she makes contemptuous comments about it, the apex court said while hearing government petitions against the High Court orders that granted bail to BNP acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir.

Someone commented that the judiciary was under the grip and control of the government, which is not correct, since all the courts of the country were fully independent following the separation of the judiciary from the

Choice quite predictable

Survey on enclave-dwellers' nationality preference starts today

All residents of 51 Bangladeshi enclaves inside India would opt for Indian nationality, according to an unofficial survey.

None of the 14,215 inhabitants of those enclaves wants to come to the mainland as "Bangladeshi", says the survey conducted by India-Bangladesh Enclaves Exchange Coordination Committee, a non-government organization.

However, 1,057 people of 223 families in 99 of the 111 Indian enclaves inside Bangladesh territory are willing to go to Indian mainland, found the committee that has been working on the enclaves since 1993.

The findings come as both Bangladesh and India launch today an official survey of their 162 enclaves as per the Land Boundary Agreement between the two neighbouring countries.

A total of 37,369 people live in the 111 Indian enclaves inside Bangladesh while 14,215 people live in the 51 Bangladeshi enclaves inside Indian territory.

Greek voters 'reject bailout offer'

"No" clearly ahead with half the votes counted

With more than half the ballots in, results from a referendum in Greece suggest voters have decisively rejected the terms of an international bailout.

Figures published by the interior ministry showed 61 percent of those whose ballots had been counted voting "No", against 39 percent voting "Yes".

Greece's governing Syriza party campaigned for a "No", saying the bailout terms were humiliating.

The "Yes" campaign warned this could see Greece ejected from the eurozone.

Some European officials had also said that a "No" would be seen as an outright rejection of talks with creditors.

But Greek government officials have insisted that a "No" vote would strengthen their hand and that they could rapidly strike a deal for fresh funding in resumed negotiations.

Greek banks will reopen by Tuesday, they say.

Nahid says sorry for hassle

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday apologised for the hassle being faced by the students during admission into class XI at different colleges.

Terming the complications in admission process "pain of development", he held technological glitches and their limitations responsible.

The time limit for admission to colleges has been extended by 21 days without late fees, the minister said.

"This year's admission process was new and it involved a huge task. The students faced some problems and I am sorry for that. Please see the matter with a forgiving heart," Nahid said at a press briefing at the secretariat.
