Women make fancy designs on clothes for Eid market

Several thousand women in about 15 remote villages of the district are busy making artistic fancy works on saris, scarves, blouses, chemises and other clothes supplied by garment houses of the capital and other cities to make them attractive and pricey in the ongoing Eid market.

Visiting different villages like Neyamatpur, Dhelapeer, Golahat of Saidpur upazila, Tenganmari, Dundibari under Jaladhaka, Panchapukur, Kania khata of Sadar upazila, this correspondent saw women and children of different families sitting at house yards making artistic designs on clothes.

They were doing works like embroidery, spangle and ornamental stitching using chumki, puti, jori, colour stones, lace etc.

Makers of these attractive designs, mostly widows and poor women, master the work through observation

and practice.

"Village women do design on saris and other dresses by setting colourful glittering stones with sewing work. Traders in the capital and other big cities make good profits by selling the attractive dresses," said Abdul Hye, owner of Fancy Karchupi House in Nilphamari.

Gul Naz, a fancy designer of Dhelaipur village said she does the work after finishing domestic chores and her nine-year-old daughter helps her in the work.

The women artisans get Tk 500-Tk 700 as wage for making designs on a sari, Tk 200-300 for a scarf and Tk 100-Tk 150 for a blouse, according to designs.

The seasonal income that stands up to Tk 4000 per head enables them to buy new dresses for family members and arrange good food on the Eid day, said several artisans.

Garments traders in the capital usually sell designed saris for Tk 5,000

to Tk 30,000 per piece, making good profit, sources said.

Several local garment traders including owners of Ruma Fashion, Saudia Handicraft, Champa Karchupi House, and Pappu Fashion usually coordinate between Dhaka-based traders and village artisans in this work.

Every day new orders are coming from different places and more women are getting involved in this seasonal trade.

The handiwork provides employment to thousands of poor women but its progress is hampered due to availability of Indian dresses with machine made design, said Anwar Hossain, district unit president of 'Karu shilpi samobai samity'.

The government should take steps to stop massive smuggling of Indian saris to promote local products, he said.

Fake herbal medicine factory found, four arrested

A task force comprising police and civil administration unearthed a fake herbal medicine factory at Nischintapur in Thakurgaon municipality area on Wednesday and arrested four people in this connection.

The arrestees are Golam Mostafa, 60, his two sons Farhad Hossain, 35, and Sheikh Farid, 30, and Samrat, 22, a worker of the factory.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of task force, led by Executive Magistrate Lubna Farzana, raided the house of Mostafa in the area around 5:00pm and unearthed the fake herbal factory.

They also seized huge amounts of substandard herbal vitamin syrups and capsules from the spot.

The team also found the factory producing herbal medicines in the name of Semco Pharma, Thakurgaon, Hikma Pharma, Narayanjanj and Rapitec Pharma for long.

Police filed a case with Thakurgaon Police Station under Special Powers Act, accusing four people, said Officer-in-Charge AKM Mehedi Hasan.

In Bogra, a mobile court in Sonatola upazila of the district yesterday fined seven factories Tk 11000 each for producing vermcelli in an unhygienic environment.

Upazila Nirbahi Officer Habibur Rahman led the court, reports our correspondent.

Finding success in the sweetness of mangoes

Sikander Ali, 65, of Paschim Baniary village of Matibhanga union under Nazirpur upazila in the district has become successful in growing tasty mangoes at his orchard.

Though other farmers of the village did not take the risk of cultivating mango, damaging their paddy fields, Sikander took the risk alone.

"Four years back, I saw an excellent mango orchard at a village in Jessore and I was inspired to cultivate mango from then," Sikander said.

He prepared his 40 decimals of paddy field and planted 100 mango trees of different varieties collected from a nursery. Now they are full of mangoes.

"I got some mangoes from those trees one year after planting them, and production is gradually increasing every year," said Sikander.

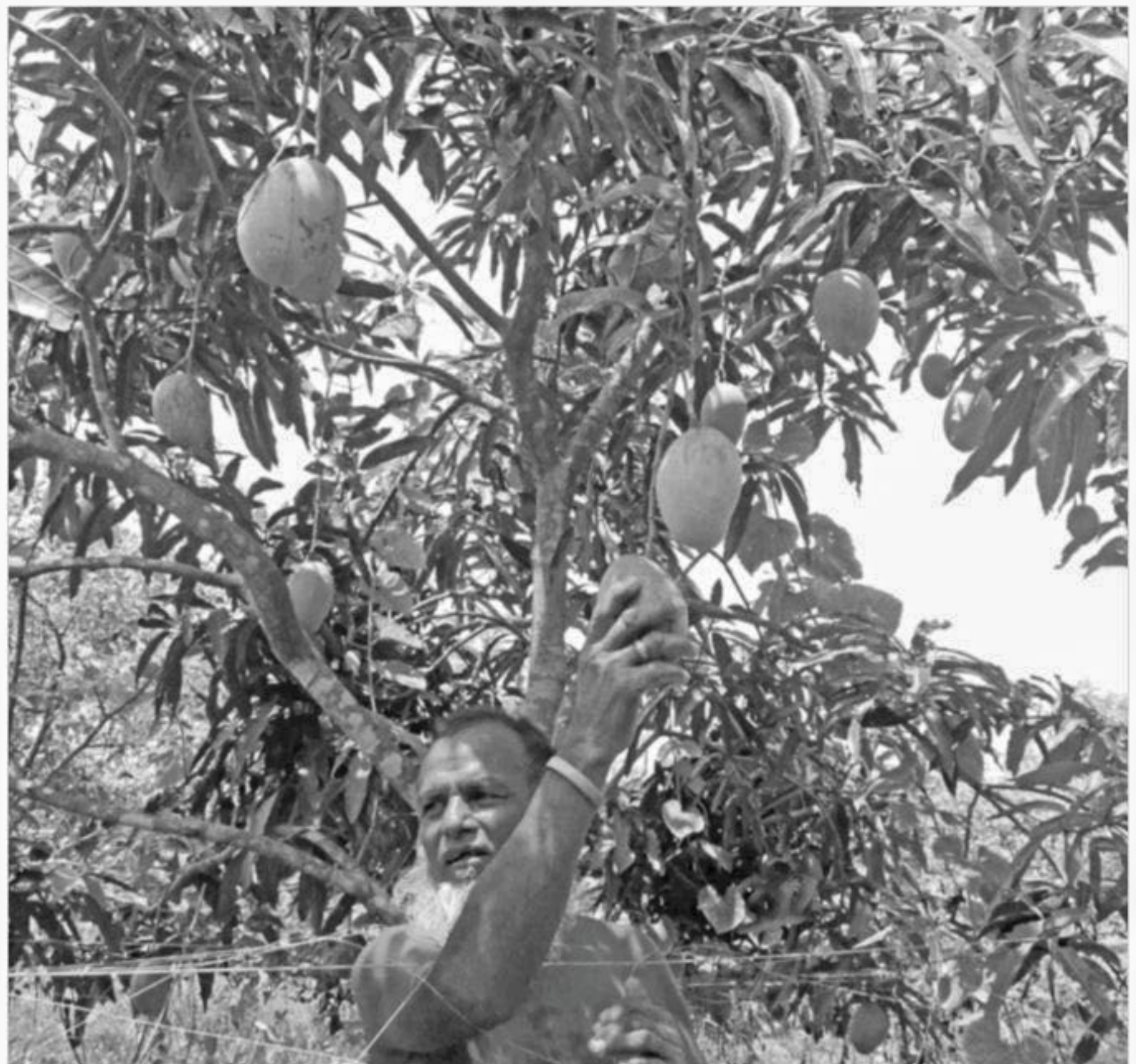

PETROL BOMB ATTACK ON BUS IN RANGPUR

Court frames charges against 132 Jamaat-Shibir men

A Rangpur court on Wednesday framed charge against 132 leaders and activists of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir in a case for petrol bomb attack on a passenger bus in January this year.

The case was filed with

Mithapukur Police Station on January 14 last year, accusing the Jamaat-Shibir men of hurling a petrol bomb on a passenger bus that left six people killed in Jaygirhat area under Mithapukur upazila on the day.

Judicial Magistrate Md Shafiul Alam sent the case to Rangpur District and Sessions Judge's Court for

trial, which is expected to begin on July 22, court sources said.

On June 10, Sub-Inspector Md Nazrul Islam of Mithapukur Police Station, also the investigation officer of the case, submitted the charge sheet to the court.

Md Enamul Haque, Mithapukur upazila unit ameer of Jamaat, Md Abul

Baset Marzan, a leader of the upazila unit of Jamaat and vice chairman of the upazila parishad, Md Hafizur Rahman, a former Shibir leader are among the accused.

SI Nazrul said Md Hafizur Rahman gave confessional statement before the court under Section 164. Of the accused, 49, including Md Hafizur Rahman, are now in jail while the remaining 83 are still at large.

Four people were killed and at least 20 others injured in the bomb attack on the passenger bus in Jaygirhat area during the countrywide non-stop blockade enforced by the BNP-led 20-party alliance.

Jamaat-Shibir men waylaid the Dhaka-bound bus of Khalil Special from Ullipur upazila in Kurigram district around 2:00am and hurled a petrol bomb at the vehicle, leaving four passengers dead on the spot and injuring 24 others.

Later, two passengers succumbed to their burn injuries at hospital.

Tornado damages 40 houses in Bagerhat

At least 40 houses were damaged as a tornado lashed two villages in Rampal upazila of the district yesterday.

Locals said the tornado hit the villages at around 9:30am and lasted for several minutes.

At least 10 people of the villages sustained injuries as trees and corrugated iron (CI) sheets fell on them, said Rafiqul Islam Babu, chairman of Perukhali Union Parishad.

Deputy Commissioner Jahangir Alam said the upazila officials were sent to the tornado-hit villages to make a list of the affected people.

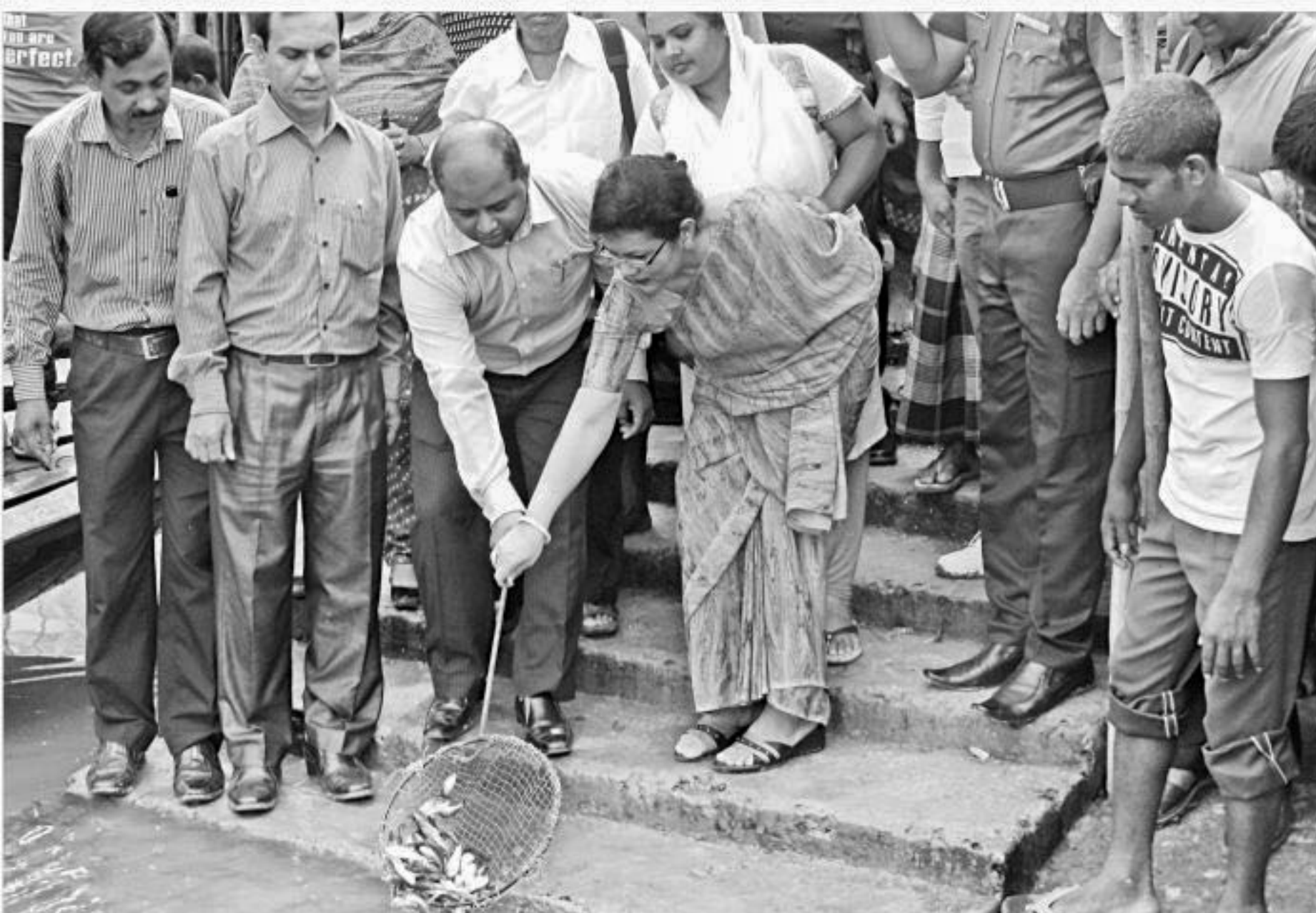
