2 remanded over Mirpur murder

Police arrested two persons in the capital yesterday over the murder of college student Reshma in her Mirpur house the day before.

The victim's stepbrother Robin and their security guard Milon were remanded for three days by a Dhaka court, said Mirpur Police Station Sub-inspector Touhidul Arefeen, also the investigation officer.

Robin was held as he had an altercation with Reshma and her mother several days before the killing while Milon because of his absence from his duty during the incident, the IO said.

Reshma, an HSC student at BCIC College in Mirpur, was found dead with her throat slit in her residence on Thursday.

The killers also looted 5 tola of gold from the house, said police. Police suspect that the murderers are known to Reshma and she might have been killed over family feud.

Dr Yunus made honorary citizen of Bologna, Italy

Nobel laureate Prof Dr Muhammad Yunus has been given honorary citizenship of the city of Bologna in Italy.

Mayor of Bologna Virginio Merola conferred this citizenship at a grand ceremony in the City Hall on July 8, said a press release of Yunus Centre yesterday.

Prof Yunus yesterday concluded a five-day visit to Italy after attending several high level events within the framework of the Milan Expo 2015.

He was a keynote speaker at the Social Enterprise World Forum that took place in Milan from July 1 to 3.

Over 1,000 delegates from all over the globe attended the forum organised by the ACRA-CCS foundation of Italy and Social Enterprise UK.

On July 7, Yunus delivered a keynote speech at a program titled "The other Half of the Planet-Women's Weeks" at the Expo Milano 2015. Yunus was also a keynote speaker at a forum organised by Letizia Moratti, former Mayor of Milan, on the subject of Women in Business.

Waterlogging damages Zahir Raihan Road

Frequent waterlogging has left a portion of Zahir Raihan Road stretching from Chankharpul Intersection to Bakshibazar Intersection in Dhaka in a terrible state.

Moreover, insensible residents throw their household garbage on the road, adding to its woes.

Most private cars, rickshaws, and vans avoid the 500m stretch of road that is riddled with potholes, leading to severe traffic congestion on the main road.

"Wheels of rickshaws and vans often get stuck on the road. Whenever I bring goods, I ask my staff to be aware of large potholes," said Md Mohan, manager of Al-Madina Vulcanizing situated beside the road.

"Just recently, I was bringing some goods on a rickshaw when one of the wheels got stuck in the mud," he said.

The 1.8km Zahir Raihan Road, stretching from Chankharpul Intersection to Nilkhet Intersection, used to be two lanes. However, after construction of Mayor Hanif Flyover, the road from Chankharpul to Bakshibazar was made into three lanes.



Although the condition of the northern and the middle lanes are good, the southern lane has always been neglected for some reason, locals claimed.

"No initiative has been taken to repair it," said Hafez Ali, a resident of the area.

Abdul Hye, caretaker of an under-construction building, said after the road was turned into three lanes, the old drainage system stopped functioning properly.

He said the water used to flow north from south, but now the middle and the northern lanes are higher than the southern lane.

"The southern lane becomes easily waterlogged," he said, adding that water washes away concrete leaving the road in a very poor condition.

Fariduddin Ahmed Ratan, councillor of ward-20, said they would take necessary measures very soon to repair the road and solve the waterlogging problem.

He was also the convener and member of several Company Law Reform Committees in Bangladesh, and was elected as a member of the Court of Arbitration at the International Chamber of Commerce in Paris, France.

Dr Zahir authored the renowned analytical legal publication, "Company and Securities Laws".

Int'l help for flood forecast sought

Bangladesh yesterday sought international assistance in sharing the latest data and technology for reliable forecast and early warning of floods and flash floods.

"We are eagerly willing to use the experiences of other countries," Disaster Management and Relief Minister Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury told the 2nd ministerial conference of Regional Integrated Multi-hazard Early Warning System (RIMES) here. Ministers and senior officials from 22 countries including hosts India joined the event.

BSF picks up two Bangladeshis

Muggers killed a battery-run auto-rickshaw driver and took away his vehicle in Jamalpur town on Thursday night.

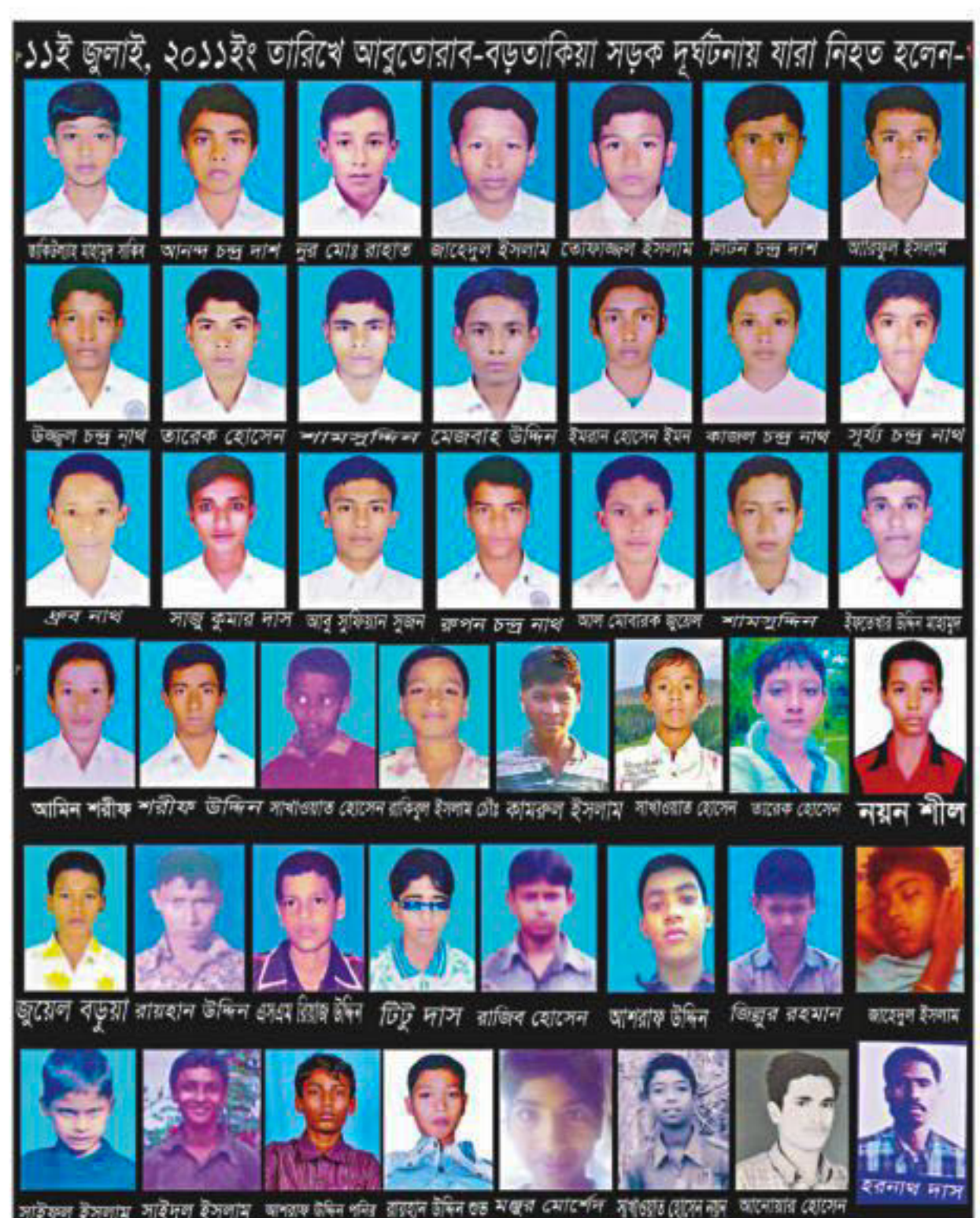

Amjad's death condoled



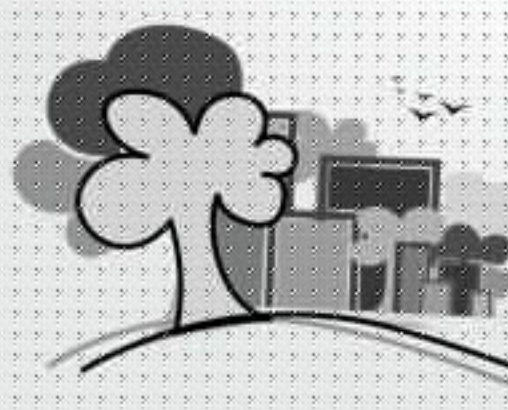
