### Minu sent to jail on surrender

Former Rajshahi city corporation mayor and city unit president of BNP Mizanur Rahman Minu was yesterday sent to jail after he surrendered before two courts in seven cases filed against him during the BNP-led 20-party's anti-government movement this year.

Minu surrendered before one of the courts around 11:30am and sought bail.

Rajshahi Metropolitan Magistrate Court Judge Joyonti Rani Das rejected Minu's bail petition in one of the cases and fixed July 27 for hearing two other cases, said inspector Abul Hashem of the court.

Metropolitan Magistrate Mokseda Asgar also rejected Minu's bail petitions in three other cases. The court, however, granted him bail in another case as per an order of the High Court.

# to launch today

Advance sale of Eid train tickets ends at Kamalapur, Ctg stations; rush likely to begin today

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation (BIWTC) will introduce today a new passenger vessel MV Madhumoti on Dhaka-Barisal-Khulna route.

With the latest one, the state-run BIWTC now has a fleet of seven passenger carriers plying from Dhaka to southern districts.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will inaugurate the twostorey vessel through a video conference at 10:00am, said a press release of the shipping ministry.

The 75.50 metre long vessel is able to carry 750 passengers. A Bangladeshi private shipbuilding company has constructed the vessel for Tk 27 crore, while its two engines were imported from Japan.

With Madhumoti, BIWTC's official capacity has increased to carry around 5,000 passengers through its seven ships. But the vessels carry at least three times as many passengers.

On the other hand, private companies operate around 150 launches, carrying around 3 lakh people daily.

Both private launch owners and BIWTC will start operating special trips today on the basis of passengers' rush. TRAIN, BUS

The advance sale of Bangladesh Railway's tickets concluded at Kamalapur and Chittagong stations yesterday amid dissatisfaction of many people who did not get tickets.

On the last day, tickets were sold for July 17. Return tickets will start selling on July 16.

Railway officials anticipated that people would start

leaving the capital in droves today to celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr with their near and dear ones. Meanwhile, bus stations of the capital including Gabtoli and Kalyanpur started to become crowded with home-

# New BIWTC vessel Entire nation outraged

"We will upload it on Facebook. The world will see it." This was what the murderers said while torturing Rajon to death. The world did see it and it cringed in

shame and rose up in an angry protest. Thousands of posts flooded different social online platforms protesting the brutal murder of the 13-year-old

boy in Sylhet. Organisers had also urged all to join mass protests held yesterday in front of Jatiya Press Club and at Shahbagh in the capital demanding justice for Sheikh Md Samiul Alam alias Rajon.

Blogger and online activist Dr Pinaki Bhattacharya, at the protest organised at Shahbagh under the banner of Biswa Bangalee Morjada Andolon, said, "The video will be seen across the globe and people will know that we are barbarians."

"By ensuring justice, the state

for our children and that we value the lives of the poor," he said. Imran H Sarker said, "It is always the

poor who are oppressed and brutalised. If the child had been from a well-off family, he would not have been killed like this. Biswajit, women who are raped and people from indigenous community -all are oppressed because they are poor."

Khushi Kabir, coordinator of Nijera Kori, also spoke.

In front of the press club, Bangladesh Jubo Union, Chhatra Union and Udichi formed a human chain demanding exemplary punishment for the killers.

Abdullah Al Kafee, leader of Communist Party of Bangladesh, said the killers had the confidence that they can get away with the crime.

On Twitter, the hashtag #JusticeforRajon emerged as a protest against the crime.

People have also taken to Facebook to death by four men on Wednesday.

Cricketer Mushfiqur Rahim wrote

"There can never be a worse crime than abusing an innocent child to death. Say no to child abuse!"

Meanwhile, Prof Mizanur Rahman condemned the incident in a statement issued by the National Human Rights Commission. He said NHRC took cognisance of

the incident in suomoto and ordered Sylhet Metropolitan Police to investigate the incident and submit a report to the commission. Besides, Manusher Jonno

Foundation, Bangladesh National Women Lawyers' Assosication (BNWLA), Bangladesh Shishu Odhikar Forum, and Bangladesh Jubo Maitree issued statements condemning the incident and demanding punishment of the perpetrators.

# BNP hits back at Inu's comments on Khaleda's trial

Hitting back at Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu's comments, BNP yesterday threatened that those who said a special tribunal would be set up to try party chief Khaleda Zia would face trial in the future.

"All the allegations against BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia are baseless. But those who are now talking about setting up a tribunal and trying to put her on trial will stand trial in the future," BNP spokesperson Asaduzzaman Ripon told a press conference at its headquarters at Nayapaltan.

"The country's people will brook no conspiracy like a trial against her," he said.

Inu recently said a special tribunal will be formed after Eid-ul-Fitr for speedy disposal of the cases against Khaleda for instigating arson attacks during the BNPled alliance's three-month agitation since January. "If Khaleda Zia can prove her innocence, she will remain in politics; if she cannot, she must quit politics," he further said.

Ripon demanded that the government make people's Eid trips smooth and safe. He cautioned that launch and bus owners operated their vehicles and vessels on the occasion after giving them a makeover, causing accidents. He urged immediate action against this practice.

Meanwhile, Prof Emajuddin Ahmed yesterday told a discussion at Jatiya Press Club that the government should hold a mid-term election to restore democracy.

# Mob beat 3 robbers to death in Barisal

Three alleged robbers were beaten to death by a mob at Hizla upazila in Barisal early yesterday.

The dead are Miraz Molla and Harun Bepari of Khunna-Govindapur village and Hanif Sardar of Bausia village in the same upazila.

Hizla Police Station Officer-in-Charge Golam Sarwar said locals caught the three around 2:30am while 10 to 12 robbers were preparing to commit a robbery at Baherchar village in the upazila. The villagers then gave them a thrashing, leaving the three dead on the spot. Police recovered the bodies and five sharp weapons from

near a betel leaf garden in the morning. OC Sarwar said he suspected that all of them were mem-

bers of "Yusuf Sardar Bahini". Yusuf Sarder, a suspected ring leader, was beaten to death by locals on May 16 this year, said Khalilur Rahman, chairman of Barojalia Union Parishad. Two cases -- one for robbery and another for mob beating -- were filed with the police.


