Abducted indigenous girl traceless for 12 days

An indigenous schoolgirl, abducted from Durgapur village in Sakhipur upazila of the district on the night of July 9, still remains traceless. The victim, a class IX student of Chhotomousha High School in the upazila, was picked up by a gang when she came out of her maternal uncle's house at around 6:00pm. Victim's father filed a case with Sakhipur Police Station

the following day accusing Lavlu Miah, 30, his sister Mazeda Begum, 34, Lavlu's accomplices Ripon Miah, 25, and Illias Hossain, 35. They all are from the same village. Police could not rescue the girl and arrest any of the gang members as of filing of this report at 5:00pm yesterday. Indigenous people formed a human chain at Sakhipur upazila headquarters yesterday, demanding immediate steps to rescue

the girl. Around 400 people under the banner of 'Tribal Welfare Association' joined the human chain programme at Sakhipur upazila headquarters at noon. Addressing a rally at the venue, the speakers demanded that law enforcers take immediate steps to rescue the girls. They also gave a 72-hour ultimatum to local police administrations to rescue the girl and arrest the abductors.

Local indigenous leaders Robindra Barman and Hemanto Barman, Sakhipur municipality Mayor Abu Hanif Azad, upazila commander of freedom fighters M A Gani, upazila BNP General Secretary Shajahan Sajud and local elite BK Chowdhury addressed the rally. Contacted, Muhammad Ilias, officer-in-charge of Sakhipur Police Station, said drive is on to rescue the girl and arrest the accused in the case.

Extortionists swoop on cops, one injured

Jhalakathi BCL men clash over formation of district committee

At least three people, including a journalist, were injured in a clash between two factions of Bangladesh Chhatra League over formation of new committee of the party's district unit on Monday. A case was filed against 30 people in this connection, said Md Abdus Salam, officer-in-charge of Sadar Police Station. The clash took place soon after the central BCL approved the new committee. It angered the supporters of the leaders of the previous district committee, said BCL insiders. Shafiqul Islam, president of the new committee, alleged that a group led by outgoing district unit BCL

president Sayeed Hadisur Rahman Milon attacked him and his men. Refuting the allegation, Milon said the new committee was formed in an undemocratic way. The central leaders took huge money from the new leaderships of the district and announced the committee where devoted and sacrificed Chhatra League leaders were deprived, alleged Milon. Central BCL President HM Badiuzzaman Sohag and General Secretary Siddiqui Nazmul Alam announced the names of the office bearers of 16 committees including US and Russia, from Dhaka just four days ahead of a new central council scheduled to be held on 25-26 July to elect new leadership, said party sources.

PATUAKHALI, BARGUNA Youth hacked to death, man's wrist cut off

A youth was hacked to death in Botolbungia Bazar area under Sadar upazila of the district on Friday. The victim is Masud Matbar, 30, son of freedom fighter Ayub Ali Matbar of Ibaria village. The victim's brother Jasim Uddin said a gang allegedly led by one Badol attacked Masud with sharp weapons at around 3:00pm, leaving him critically injured. Masud later died on way to Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College Hospital, said Jasim. There was a longstanding conflict between Badol and Masud over establishing

supremacy in the area, said SM Tariqul Islam, officer-in-charge of Sadar Police Station. Meanwhile, wrist of a man was cut off allegedly by his younger brother at Gusdighata village in Barguna Sadar upazila the same day. The victim is Shahidul Islam, 60, a retired BGB man, and a resident of the village. Police and locals said a few days ago, Hiru borrowed some money from his elder brother Shahidul. At 11:30am, Shahidul asked Hiru to repay his money. The two then engaged in an altercation over the issue. At on stage, Hiru severed wrist of his brother's right hand.

24 sued for killing three siblings in Noakhali

Twenty-four people have been sued on charge of killing three siblings in Sonaimuri upazila of the district on Sunday. Morshed Alam, younger brother of the victims, filed the case with Sonaimuri Police Station on Monday night. Officer-in-Charge (OC) Md Kazi Haniful Islam Bhuiyan yesterday confirmed the filing of the case, but he did not disclose the names of the accused. None of the accused was arrested as of 6:00pm yesterday. Contacted, OC Haniful Islam said law enforcers have already launched a drive to arrest the accused in the case. The three siblings--Kamal 36, Harun, 32, and Babul, 27--were hacked to death over a land dispute at Kazianagar village in the upazila on Sunday. Police quoted locals as saying that the incident took place around 2:00pm when the three and one Golam Mawla along with his group were watching a football

match at a local playground. Suddenly, a brawl over a disputed piece of land broke out there, said Nurul Amin Swapan, chairman of Nateswar Union Parishad, quoting witnesses. At one stage, Mawla along with his men stabbed the three brothers repeatedly with sharp weapons. Kamal died on the spot while Harun and Babul were critically wounded, said Swapan. UZZAL MURDER CASE Brother among 18 accused

Sibling has been sued on charge of Killing Imran Kabir Uzzal in the district town on Monday.
