

12 get life for killing Bagerhat BCL man

A court here yesterday sentenced 12 people to life imprisonment for killing a Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activist in Sadar upazila of the district in 2006.

The lifers are Nuru Shiekh, Abdus Sattar Sheikh, Razzak Sheikh, Lablu Sheikh, Nazrul Sheikh, Shawkat Sheikh, Abdul Kader Sheikh, Kamrul Sheikh, Ziaul Sheikh, Sheikh Tipu Sultan, Hossain Sheikh and Sheikh Faruk. Judge Khan Mizanur

Rahman of the District and Sessions Judge's Court fined the convicts Tk 10 thousand each. In default, they are to suffer one year more in jail.

The victim, Arif Hasan Raju of Jatrapur village under the upazila was an activist of BCL Jatrabari union unit.

According to the prosecution, On September 4, 2006, the convicts picked up Raju, son of Nur Islam Sheikh, from in front of Lutfur Sheikh's house where an extended meeting of BCL union unit over formation of

the committee of ward No 3 was going on. Raju was one of the candidates for the post of president of the ward unit.

They took Raju to a place in the union, hit him with sticks and a hammer and then strangled him.

The following day, Raju's father Nur Islam filed a murder case with Bagerhat Model Police Station, accusing 12 named and three to four unnamed people.

Sub-Inspector (SI) Habibur Rahman of the police station pressed charges against 15 people

on January 21, 2007.

After examining the witnesses and documents, Judge Khan Mizanur Rahman pronounced the verdict. He acquitted three accused--Talimuzzaman, Russel and Mizanur Rahman--as charges brought against them could not be proved.

Nur Islam Sheikh yesterday claimed that his son Raju was killed as a sequel to a land dispute in the union. Political feud was not the key issue behind the killing, he added.

Ferry service on Bhola-Laxmipur route comes to a halt

Meghna devours road connecting Elisha terminal

Ferry service on Bhola-Laxmipur route came to a halt yesterday as the Meghna River devoured the Elisha road connecting the ferry ghat.

Abu Alam, in-charge of Bhola-Laxmipur ferry service, said the mighty Meghna devoured about 300 metres of the road in last 24 hours due to rough weather.

Due to this, they closed the service and it will resume after the road is renovated, he said.

All types of the vehicular movement

on the road came to a halt as it was totally damaged due to the erosion caused by the strong waves of the river, said Alam.

Though the river erosion has been taking its toll on the road since Sunday morning, the officials of the Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB) could not take any step to stop it because of inclement weather.

Abdul Hekim, executive engineer of Bhola BWDB, said they could not take any measures for renovation of the road for the weather condition.

In Munshiganj, launch and speedboat services on Shimulia-Kawrakandi route remain suspended for the second day due to bad weather, reports UNB.

Shimulia river port's traffic inspector Tofazzal Hossain said the authorities on Sunday noon decided to stop the plying of launches, speedboats, trawlers and small boats through the route to avoid accident as the weather turned rough and there was strong current in the river.

He said services will resume once the situation becomes normal.

2 schoolboys electrocuted in Bogra

Two schoolboys died from electrocution at Shankarpur village in Shibganj upazila of the district on Sunday.

The deceased, Rimon Mia, 11, son of Rafiqul Islam of the village, and his cousin Abdul Momin, 11, son of Modasser Hossain of Chawk Kutub village in the upazila, were Class IV students at local MH Pre-Cadet School.

Quoting victims' family members, police said the two came in contact with a snapped electric wire when they climbed the roof of an adjacent house to collect a cricket ball around 6:30pm.

Locals took the duo to Bogra Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College and Hospital (SZMCH), where the doctors declared them dead, Kamruzzaman, inspector (investigation) of Shibganj Police Station, said.

Woman held on charge of killing husband

Police on Sunday night arrested a housewife from Chawk Chatiyani village in the district town on charge of murdering her husband with the help of hired killers a week ago.

In primary interrogation, arrestee Muni Khatun, 25, wife of slain Mithu Hossain, 30, also daughter of Abdul Munnaf of Santhia upazila, confessed to her involvement in the killing.

Earlier, on July 21, police found the body of Mithu Hossain, 30, son of Abul Kashem, beside a road near Kathgora Beel (water body) in adjacent Chatmohar upazila.

Deceased's wife Muni filed a case with Sadar Police Station the same night, accusing some unidentified men.

Police came to know Muni's involvement in the killing from two people, including a woman, who were arrested soon after filing of the case.

During quizzing, Muni told police that she hired two friends of her husband for Tk 50 thousand to kill him as she failed to stop her husband's extra-marital affair and drug addiction, said Abdul Kuddus, officer-in-charge (investigation) of Sadar Police Station.

Quoting Muni, police said she hired Mithu's two friends-Sujon Hossain and Hossain Ali-for 50 thousand.

According to the plan, the duo called Mithu out of his house on July 20, strangled him and dumped the body beside the Kathgora Beel.

Ten Manikganj BCL men hurt in intra-party clash

Ten activists of Manikganj district unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) were injured as intra-party opponents beat them up in Manikganj bus stand area yesterday.

Of the injured, district unit BCL's joint secretary Nahida Islam Onu, organising secretaries Sheikh Mohammad Yasin and Shafikul Islam Babu, student affairs secretary Lamia Sultana Putul, library affairs secretary Sajib Hossain, and activist Monirul Islam were admitted to Manikganj Sadar Hospital.

New committee of the district BCL was formed through selection at a council on November 30 last year, with Sadikul Islam Soha as president and Enamul Haque Rubel secretary.

Rubel and his followers gathered in front of Awami League's Ward No 2 office at bus stand around 10:30am to bring out a procession to welcome the BCL committee, said Rubel.

Around 11:00am, their opponents led by former

president Abu Bakar Siddik Khan Tusher announced a counter programme there and took position in front of Police Box beside Dhaka-Aricha Highway. Jubo League and Sramik League men led by district Sramik League president Babul Sarker joined with them.

They attacked a procession led by BCL district unit's organising secretary Sheikh Mohammad Yasin Ali coming from Satura upazila towards the BCL rally at Manikganj bus stand.

A group led by Enamul Haque Rubel came forward to save their fellows but they too came under attack.

Ten BCL men, all loyal to the new BCL committee, were injured in the attacks.

Police later brought the situation under control, said Aminur Rahman, officer in charge of Manikganj Police Station.

A group also attacked the house of district BCL president Sadikul Islam Soha at Bewtha and fired blank shots there around 2:30pm, said Soha.

Contacted, district Sramik League president Babul

Sarker and former district BCL president Abu Bakar Siddik Khan Tusher said Sadikul Islam and Enamul Haque have no moral rights to bring out procession in favour of BCL as leaders of Awami League and its front organisations in the district have demanded their removal from the posts for their alleged involvement in crimes including extortion, and anti-organisational activities.

District AL leaders including lawmaker from Manikganj-3 constituency and State Minister of Health Jahid Maleque Swapan, Manikganj district unit AL President Golam

Mohiuddin and its General Secretary Abdus Salam, and Manikganj municipality Mayor Md Ramzan Ali with their joint signatures have sent a letter to party chief and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and the party's central Organisational

Secretary Ahmed Hossain, also in charge to look after Manikganj AL, citing different allegations against the president and the secretary of the new committee of the district BCL.
