"We were positive in batting, bowling and fielding in the Chittagong Test. We played positive cricket but were unlucky as rain came to spoil our progress. If we can continue to play with that confidence and execute the plans, the same thing can also happen here in Dhaka," said a confident Imrul.

He said that the team had changed a lot. "The atmosphere within the team has totally changed. Whoever comes in to the team, he knows that he will have to perform which is a very positive sign. The newcomers are hungry to do well and that's evident in their performance," he observed.

Overall Bangladesh's batting approach and application were fantastic in the first Test and Imrul credited that to the batsmen's own realisation. He also recalled the support of their head coach Chandika Hathurusingha, who gave everybody the freedom to express themselves in the middle.

'That was a lucky wicket' Azhar fastest Asian to 1000

Going past, a bunch of great players, Azhar Ali became the fastest Asian to get to 1000 ODI runs, en route to his 49 against Sri Lanka in the 3rd ODI.

Zaheer Abbas was the first Asian to reach to that landmark in 26 innings which was soon bettered by Navjot Singh Sidhu who got that landmark, taking an innings less (25) to be more precise.

Since the time Sidhu got to his 1000 runs, there are four other Asians who had achieved the feat and also went on to surpass it.

Yasir Hameed got it in the year 2004 followed by Virat Kohli who reached the feat in 2010 and Shikhar Dhawan in 2013.

All of them got it in 24 innings and Azhar Ali have gone past all of them by achieving the landmark in 23 innings.

Abbas wants cricket back in Pakistan

Legendary batsman and president of the International Cricket Council (ICC), Zaheer Abbas, has vowed to keep cricket 'alive' in Pakistan by using his position to convince member countries to tour the country.

In May this year, Zimbabwe became the first Test team to tour Pakistan since terrorist attacks on the Sri Lankan team bus in Lahore in March 2009, suspending all international cricket in the country.

But Abbas, one of Pakistan's most prolific batsmen, was hopeful of Sri Lanka would return to the country after Zimbabwe's historic visit.

"The time will come when our neighbours will come. I am hoping especially that Sri Lanka would come," Abbas told ESPNcricinfo on the sidelines of Pakistan's ODI series against Sri Lanka where he was invited as a

Lankan board. "We've been very close to each other in every department. If a gesture comes from them I will be very happy.

South Africa will undertake their longest cricket tour of India later this year to contest all three formats over a nine-week period, the Indian board announced on Monday.

The tour, which comprises three Twenty20 matches, five one-day internationals and four Tests, will run between September 29 and December 7.

It will be the first time South Africa will play a Twenty20 international on Indian soil in preparation for the World Twenty20 which will be held across India in March-April next

South Africa have also never contested a four-Test series in India before, adding a new challenge for Hashim Amla's top-ranked Proteas side.

The tour starts with the three T20 games from October 2 to 8, followed by the five one-dayers from Oct 11 to 25. The four Tests will be played in Mohali (November 5-9),

Bangalore (Nov 14-18), Nagpur (Nov 25-29) and New Delhi December (3-7). The second match in Bangalore is expected to be South
