Hosts Bangladesh were pitted in Group A alongside defending champions India and Sri Lanka when the draw ceremony for the third edition of the SAFF Under-16 Football Championship was held at the Bangladesh Football Federation yesterday.

The draw pitted defending runners-up Nepal against Afghanistan and Maldives in Group B. The championship will be hosted in Sylhet from August 9 to 18.

Pakistan have opted to withdraw from the competition at the eleventh hour, allegedly due to troubles in their football federation, while Bhutan did not show interest in taking part in the competition. The participating teams will receive 5,000 dollars each while Bangladesh, as hosts of the event, will receive 50,000 dollars from the South Asian Football Federation, informed speakers at the draw

Bangladesh, guided by Rene Koster, beat Sri Lanka in the opening match before losing against India and qualified for the semifinals as group runners-up. The boys in red and green were then handed a 5-1 thrashing by hosts Nepal in the semifinal before they salvaged some pride with a 1-0 victory over Afghanistan in the third-place deciding match.

'You can't leave Madrid now'

Real Madrid president Florentino Perez told Sergio Ramos he couldn't let him leave the club and sign for Manchester United because if he did, he would be the next one through the door.

Sources close to Ramos suggest that in heated talks held at the Ritz-Cartlon hotel in Guangzhou, China, last weekend the president admitted he would be forced to resign by angry supporters if he sold the club captain.

Real Madrid president Florentino Perez told defender Sergio Ramos he could not let him leave Perez feared he would be shown the exit at the Bernabeu

Perez told Ramos he would not let him leave unless his 180 million euro buy-out clause was met.

Real have offered the player a deal until 2020 worth around 9 million euro a season although contrary to reports in Marca the player is yet to agree to the terms offered.

The Spain defender is still holding out for 10 million euro net and talks will be on-going between now and the start of the new season. Ramos' camp are unhappy at the way Marca, they believe on behalf of the club, have insisted the deal is done as this puts extra pressure on the player to reach an agreement.

Real Madrid are confident that the player will sign before the start of the new season but Ramos still has the option of running down his contract which will end in 2017.

Arsenal seek to defeat Mourinho's Chelsea

Arsenal's readiness to mount a sustained title challenge in 2015-16 will be tested at Wembley on Sunday when they face Premier

League champions Chelsea in the Community Shield.

Arsene Wenger's team finished last season at a gallop, winning 20 of their final 26 games in all competitions and retaining the FA Cup by swamping Aston Villa 4-0 in a one-sided final.

They have carried that momentum into pre-season, winning all four of their matches, and having finally addressed their longstanding goalkeeper problem by signing Petr Cech from Chelsea, optimism is abundant.

"We want to win the league, of course we do," midfielder Jack Wilshere told the Arsenal website ahead of the English football season's traditional opening fixture.

"We feel we've been together a few years now, we've brought in worldclass players who have had time to settle, we've added a world-class 'keeper with all of his experience -- he's been there and he's done it; he's won everything -- so we really feel we're in a strong position."

But Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho appears to consider them

genuine contenders, if the comments he has launched in the direction of the Emirates Stadium in recent weeks are anything to go by.

Citing the arrivals of Mesut Ozil and Alexis Sanchez, Mourinho claimed that anyone who totted up Arsenal's transfer expenditure over the past few years would be in for a "surprise" and

tional midfielder Igor Denisov, who had been transfer listed after a row with the coach, has not helped M'Vila's case.

The coach in question, Stanislav Cherchesov, was recently sacked, being replaced by Andrei Kobelev.

Meanwhile, Dynamo's French translator recently claimed that the club's security chief, Pavel Konovalov, had been extorting money from the team's foreign players. The translator added that M'Vila kept an axe in his house

He has been capped 22 times by France but has not

played for his country since Euro 2012.

In late 2012 he was handed an 18-month ban from representing his country by the French Football Federation after taking part in an unauthorised night out while on under-21 duty.

Jose pokes at rival Wenger

Jose Mourinho has taken another swipe at old rival Arsene Wenger by claiming the Arsenal manager has only himself to blame for failing to find a solution to his dismal record against the Chelsea boss.

Wenger has failed to record a single victory over Mourinho in their 13 meetings and ahead of their latest showdown in the Community Shield at Wembley on Sunday, the Blues chief mischievously suggested the Frenchman needed to work harder to come up with an answer.

Asked what he would be thinking if the roles were reversed and he hadn't beaten Wenger for so long, Mourinho said: "I think I would ask myself why. I would to try to answer but not because of a mental block but because I would want to try to find solutions to help my team to do it. Former Inter Milan, Real Madrid and Porto manager

Mourinho says he has never been on the wrong end of such a wretched run against a manager, referencing only successive defeats against the same boss but different teams and in different seasons. Wenger and Mourinho have exchanged barbs through

the media for years and their antagonistic relationship turned physical last year when the Arsenal boss pushed his Chelsea counterpart during a touchline row. Yet, after leading Chelsea to the Premier League title last season, Mourinho insisted extending his fine run against
