**'CARRY ON' SYSTEM**  
Medical students continue demo for restoration

Medical students yesterday continued demonstrating demanding that the authorities concerned restore the "carry on" system that allows them to continue having classes with their batch after they fail any professional exam.

Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council in 2012 scrapped the system, meaning if a student fails a subject in a professional exam, they are not allowed to continue with classes until they sit for the improvement test and pass it six months later.

Thousands of students of private and public medical colleges, under the banner of "Sammilita Medical Shikharthi Brinda Bangladesh", arranged a sit-in on the Central Shaheed Minar premises in the capital yesterday demanding restoration of the system.

They said they would lose six months if the carry on system is not restored.

They also expressed worry as the rules are unclear about a student who fails -- will he or she enrol for classes with a junior batch or will there be a special batch for such students.

Medical students have been demonstrating and boycotting classes since August 3 pressing for their demand.

**Fazilatunnesa helped Bangabandhu take political decisions**  
PM says on mother's birthday

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said Bangamata Fazilatunnesa Mujib sacrificed everything to encourage Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman for the country's independence.



The premier was speaking at a function organised by the women and child affairs ministry in the capital marking the 85th birth anniversary of Begum Fazilatunnesa Mujib, the wife of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, who was killed along with most of her family members, including Bangabandhu, on August 15, 1975.

Hasina said although her mother was not directly involved with politics, she helped Bangabandhu take important political decisions staying behind the scene.

Bangabandhu's aim was to bring the economic emancipation of the people while Bangamata helped achieve that goal, Hasina said.

Despite being the wife of a prime minister, Hasina said, her mother led a very simple life and stood beside the suppressed women after the country's Liberation War and arranged their marriages.

Hasina said when Bangabandhu was captive in jail in the Agartala conspiracy case, there was a huge pressure on him from different corners to come out from jail on parole, and her mother was told that she would become widow and her children would be orphans if she did not comply with the conditions of Pakistan.

"But she didn't bow down to any threat; rather she encouraged Bangabandhu and he rejected the parole offer and finally the Pakistan government was forced to free Bangabandhu without any preconditions." Due to her inspiration, the prime minister mentioned, Bangabandhu wrote his unfinished memoir.

**STUDENT CABINETS AT SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS**  
**Students first cast ballots**

Adarsha High School in Mirpur wore a festive look yesterday with its building decorated with colourful handwritten posters seeking votes.

The campus was abuzz with activities since the morning as the students stood for election for the first time in their lives yesterday.

They themselves performed the tasks of polling agents, presiding officers, voters and candidates. They carried out all the duties and voters elected representatives to form the first ever students' cabinets, literally

in a free and fair election.

The school is not the only institution which saw such an election. In 1,043 secondary schools, madrasas and technical institutions of 487 upazilas and eight cities, the elections were arranged on a pilot basis in efforts to inculcate democratic norms in children and develop their leadership qualities.

The voting began at 8:00am and continued till 1:00pm where some 8,344 students were elected representatives to the eight-member cabinets.

After the election, one of the members of the cabinet will be elected as

the prime minister by voice vote. He or she will distribute portfolios among the cabinet members, emulating a parliamentary democracy.

The students' cabinets will work for the improvement of school environments. The tenure of the cabinets will be six months.

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid visited Adarsha High School to see the elections. Terming the voting peaceful, he said, "There is a need to inculcate the values of democracy and respect opinions of each other in the students' minds as they would be the future leaders."

Asked whether the government has any plan to hold elections to the universities, he said the universities are run by their own acts and they cannot put pressure on them.

Soumen, a class VIII student of Adarsha High School and a candidate, said he would like to work along with the teachers for the development of his school. "I would cooperate even if I lost."

Khorshed Alam, headmaster of the school, said the school bore the expenses for ballot boxes and nomination papers. Around 1,200 students took part in the polls at his school.

She emphasised creation of adequate jobs for the country's youths and massive awareness building against human trafficking.

HRDF Cox's Bazar District Convener advocate Arup Barua, rights activists Mizanur Rahman Bahadur, Abdus Shukur, Didarul Alam, ASK Director Nur Khan Liton, Mohammad Harun Or Rashid of Bhalobashi Bangladesh, Sultan Uddin Ahmad of the Bangladesh Institute of Labour Studies were present, among others.

Participants of the road march stopped at Marichya Adarsha High School, Koat Bazar Station in Ukhia, Ukhia Degree College and Maddyham Nilta Nayabazar High School and addressed several thousand students and families of survivors.
