Delay in producing PW disappoints court

A Dhaka court expressed its disappointment at the public prosecutor's failure to produce any witness yesterday over the killing of blogger Ahmed Rajib Haider.

Judge Sayeed Ahmed of the Speedy Trial Tribunal-3 of Dhaka told PP Md Mahbubur Rahman that bloggers were being killed one after another, and that he should be more serious about producing witnesses to quicken the murder trial. The judge's remarks followed submission of an

adjournment petition. Assuring the court, the prosecutor said three to · four witnesses would appear during the next

BLOGGER PWDs demand separate unit at hospitals

Larger SC bench to hear contempt rule against Janakantha editor today STAFF CORRESPONDENT

A six-member bench of the Supreme Court's Appellate Division will hold a hearing today on the contempt of court rule against Janakantha editor and publisher, and its executive editor over an article published on Salauddin Quader Chowdhury's family and a judge.

The hearing of the suomoto rule is on top of the court's proceeding list today, the SC website showed yesterday.

It issued the rule on July 29 against Janakantha Editor and Publisher Atiqullah Khan Masud and its Executive Editor Swadesh Roy for publishing an article on July 16 under the headline, "Saka Paribarer Totporota! Palabar Path Kome Gechhe" (Lobbying of Salauddin's family! Ways to escape have become reduced), written by

Police not actively looking for killers

Alleges Gonojagoron Mancha

Law enforcers are not working actively to capture the killers of freethinkers including blogger Niladri Chattopadhyay Niloy, spokesperson of a faction of the Gonojagoron Mancha Imran H Sarker alleged yesterday.

Because of the negligence of police, four online activists were killed in the last five months by militants, he told a condolence

meeting for Niloy at the capital's Shahbagh "People want to know how the murder-

ers escaped safely after killing Niloy at the fourth floor of his residential building. Questions were raised whether the government patronises or inspires the killers. Everyone except the powerful are anxious about their life," he added.

SHOT BEFORE BIRTH

Magura BCL leader remanded for 7 days

2 main accused still at large

A Magura court yesterday remanded Bangladesh Chhatra League leader Sen Suman for seven days over the shooting of a pregnant woman and an elderly man late last month.

Police wanted to interrogate him for 10 days but the senior judicial magistrate approved seven days, said Imaul Haque, officer-in-charge of the Detective Branch of police in Magura.

Suman, vice president of Magura district BCL, was accused along with 15 other pro-Awami League activists for shooting eight month pregnant Nazma Khatun and elderly Momin Bhuiyan and hacking another man in Doyarpar area of Magura town on July 23.

They got shot during a factional clash of the ruling party's youth wing Awami Jubo League.
