## Soccer League shifts focus to BPL

Soccer League International UK, a football management company based in Britain, has shifted its focus from the proposed Bangladesh Super League (BSL) to work with the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) after a meeting with Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) president Kazi Salahuddin yesterday.

The company had initially come up with a proposal of holding a franchise football league in Bangladesh with a budget of 50 million pounds, where they had claimed that international corporations like the Hero Group and the Reliance Group are interested to invest.

However, after the meeting at the Gulshan house of the BFF president, the company has expressed its willingness to facilitate the top-tier professional football league in a bid to gather knowledge of local football infrastructure, sponsorship and marketing aspects of the game here before pursuing the franchise league.

"As they want to be part of development of Bangladesh football, they have been asked to work with the existing Bangladesh Premier League," said BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag, adding that the company facilitate in roping sponsors, improving venues and marketing aspects of the BPL as well as trying to bring financial solvency to the participating clubs.

"The BPL has been part of our original proposal as we want to hold the BSL two years later. Now we will get an opportunity to work on the BPL and its clubs, which was also a priority for us. So the proposal from the BFF president was not unexpected," said Mohammad Abdul Kabir, chairman of the company.

The BFF general secretary informed that the two parties would sign a Memorandum of Understanding soon and that the Soccer League International, UK would come up with a comprehensive proposal within a couple of months.

## 'Losing Pedro unthinkable'

Barcelona midfielder Andres Iniesta doesn't want to consider the possibility that Spanish international teammate Pedro Rodriguez could be entering his final days as a Barca player.

Pedro has been heavily linked with a move to Manchester United before the transfer window closes at the end of the month after seeing his first-team opportunities squeezed by the arrivals of Neymar and Luis Suarez in the past two summers.

Yet, the 28-year-old looks set to start as Barca attempt to add the UEFA Super Cup to their trophy haul of Champions League, La Liga and Copa del Rey from last season against Sevilla on Tuesday after Neymar was ruled out for two weeks after contracting the mumps.

"As of today we are not thinking that we could lose him," Iniesta said ahead of the match in the Georgian capital Tbilisi.

"He continues to be our teammate and he is here to win the first title (of the season). Hopefully, as a teammate and a player he can continue with us because he is a world class player."

According to reports, Aranguiz joins Leverkusen in a five-year deal worth an estimated 11.5 million euros (\$12.7 million, £8.1 million).

## Klopp rules out job at Marseille

Highly-rated German coach Jurgen Klopp has ruled out taking over from Marcelo Bielsa at Marseille, his agent told Tuesday's edition of Bild.

"Marseille have shown great interest in him but, for Jurgen, the time has not yet come to return," said Marc Kosicke.

Klopp quit Borussia Dortmund at the end of last season following seven highly successful campaigns in which he won two Bundesliga titles, the German Cup once and guided Dortmund to the 2012/13 Champions League final.

## Impressive City stroll

Having seen rivals Chelsea and Arsenal both slip up over the weekend, Manuel Pellegrini's team took full advantage as they provided an early glimpse of their Premier League title credentials with a dominant display at the Hawthorns.

Toure and David Silva combined to hand City the initiative just nine minutes in, with the Spain international flicking home his teammate's shot with the aid of a deflection, although the Ivory Coast midfielder was credited with the goal.

## Bielsa back in Argentina

Argentine coach Marcelo Bielsa on Monday returned to his home country two days after his surprise resignation from French Ligue 1 side Marseille.

Bielsa, 60, who has been linked to the Mexico national team manager's role in recent weeks, arrived at Buenos Aires' Ezeiza airport and travelled immediately by road to his hometown of Rosario, 300km from the capital.

Bielsa, who had only been in charge at the Stade Velodrome since May 2014, announced he was quitting the French club immediately after their lacklustre 1-0 season-opening defeat to Caen on Saturday.

Bielsa insisted he was not leaving Marseille to sign another contract but blamed disagreements with club management.

## Hertha post win after gun attack

Hertha Berlin cleared the German Cup first round hurdle on Monday 24 hours after a shot was fired at their team bus as a clash between lower league Osnabruck and RB Leipzig was suspended when the referee was struck on the head by a lighter.

A police inquiry is underway into Sunday's incident when a motorbike rider fired at the empty Hertha bus as it was being driven to pick up the team at Bielefeld train station.

A photo posted by the club on Twitter showed the impact of the bullet which smashed a hole in the windscreens at the level of the driver's head who escaped uninjured.

Hertha beat Bielefeld 2-0 with goals from Salomon Kalou and Vladimir Darida.

Referee Martin Petersen was wounded when he was struck on the head by a lighter during a tie between third division Osnabruck and second division RB Leipzig.

The game was called off in the 71st minute.
