### NILADRI MURDER Probe report about refusal to record GD

Probe body doesn't take key witness's statement

faces questions

The police probe body, formed to investigate the allegation of refusal to record a general diary of slain blogger Niladri Chattopadhyay Niloy, did not take statements of one key witness, raising questions about the investigation process. The three-member committee submitted its probe report

to the commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police on Tuesday. After the killing of Niladri, his wife Asha Moni alleged that Khilgaon police had refused to record the GD on his security a couple of months back. The blogger also mentioned on his Facebook post about the refusal.

On May 14, Niladri and his friend Dev Joyti Rudro went to the police station for filing the GD, according to Asha Moni and Rudro.

"We heard that police already had submitted the report but no police officer contacted me on that issue," Rudro told The Daily Star last night.

Tracking their cellphones, the probe report said Niladri and Rudro were somewhere near the police station on that day but it could not confirm whether they went there to file the GD or for other purposes, a police official of DMP told The Daily Star.

An unidentified man was found dead in Kalikoir's Kalampur area on the day.

On Monday night, one Roton Majhi, 55, and another Raju Dewan, were hacked to death in separate incidents in Gazipur.

# Hasina wants to stop flow of 'harmful' information

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked the information ministry to be watchful to stop the flow of information that harms people.

"This is an important duty of the information ministry to take useful information to people and to be particularly watchful to stop the flow of harmful information to them," she told the foundation stone laying ceremony for Tathya Bhaban (Information Building) on the premises of the Department of Film and Publications in the capital.

This is the information age where

information creates opportunities for people, she said, adding, "But fabricated information creates confusion among people and causes them harm." Hasina stressed the importance of

how information is circulated and presented, and how the audience is receiving it. "So I hope useful information will be presented to people." The prime minister said special

attention was needed so that distorted information could not harm people, especially children and the youth, or damage their character building process.

With Information Secretary

Martuza Ahmed in the chair, the programme was also addressed by Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu, PM's adviser Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury and Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Information Ministry AKM Rahmatullah MP.

Welcoming criticism of the government, the prime minister said, "There'll be criticism; let there be constructive criticism. But criticism shouldn't confuse people distorting the fact. Critics should also mention the development and good works of the government."

## Secular state must give space for free expression

UN resident coordinator Robert Watkins tells workshop on terror financing; says Bangladesh doesn't have problem of terrorism yet

A secular state must give opportunity for free thinking and free expressions, UN Resident Coordinator (UNRC) in Dhaka Robert D Watkins said yesterday, citing the recent murder of four liberal bloggers in the country.

He also said Bangladesh was blessed not to have the problem of terrorism yet but warned that criminality and terrorism often went hand in hand.

He made the remarks while addressing the inaugural session of a workshop on "Designation and Asset Freezing under United Nations Security Council Resolutions (UNSCRs) 1,267 and 1,373".

The resolutions deal with sanctions related to terrorism.

About the debates on how free people should express their views, the UN official said it might vary from person to person,

## CCC mayor seeks cooperation of government agencies

Lists 124 specific assistances

Proper coordination between the works of the Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) and all government agencies providing services to its residents is a must for turning Chittagong into a liveable, green, healthy, and clean city, the mayor said yesterday.

AJM Nasir Uddin said CCC could not solve all problems single-handedly and with the lack of coordination, the dream of making it a global standard city would never come true.

He was addressing a views exchange meeting with top officials of 28 organisations including the Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) where CCC sought 124 specific assistances from 23 of the organisations.

The organisations include the Chittagong Development Authority (CDA), Bangladesh Railway, Chittagong Port Authority (CPA), Chittagong Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (CWASA), Chittagong District Administration, Divisional Commissioner's office, the Department of Environment (DoE), Health Department, Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA), Power Development Board



(PDB), Water Development Board, Public Works Department (PWD), Department of Public Health Engineering (DPHE), Local Government Engineering Department (LGED), and Fire Service and Civil Defence. CCC organised the meeting at its newly

built conference room. Mayor Nasir said CCC hoped for these specific assistances for overall development of the city.

Out of the 124 assistances, the highest 20 were sought from CDA, 12 from CMP and 11 from Bangladesh Railway. The CCC mayor said CDA should take its opinion while

to develop city roads, bridges or culverts and of any development project. CWASA was requested to remove its water supply pipelines now lying beneath the culverts and to place those in higher places to keep the drainage system and water
