Feud over money led to bloodshed

One more victim of Badda shooting dies; control of cattle market, garment waste trade could be key reasons

Internal feud over the lease of a cattle market at Aftabnagar and jhut (scrap fabrics) business in the area might be behind Thursday night's killings in Badda, locals and family members have said. Police yesterday said they were looking into these



MADARIPUR SCHOOLGIRLS

7 youths sued for murder

Rape yet to be confirmed

A murder case was filed with Madaripur Sadar Police Station against seven youths for their alleged involvement in the "murder" of two schoolgirls in the district.

Sumaiya Akhtar and Happy Akhtar, both class eight students at Mostafapur Bahumukhi High School, were allegedly poisoned to death after rape by the seven, victims' families alleged.

Sumaiya's father Billal Shikder, who filed the case, mentioned in the case statement that the youths killed them and poured poison into their mouths to make it look like suicide, police said.

The accused are Rana Shikder, Mehedi Hasan, Rakib, Rafiqul Shikder, Shipon Shikder, Uzzal and Sajon.

Meanwhile, the bodies were handed over to their families after conducting autopsies at Madaripur Sadar Hospital by a medical board.

Hospital sources said they primarily found that poison was the cause of their deaths. Doctors also found some injury marks on different parts of Sumaiya's body. But they SEE PAGE 11 COL 3

Two 'Bangladeshis' among arrestees



Six people, including two "Bangladeshis", were arrested in southern Indian city of Hyderabad yesterday for their alleged links with terror groups Harkat-ul-Jihad-al-Islami (Huji) and Indian Mujahideen (IM).

T Prabhakar Rao, joint commissioner of police (detective department) of Hyderabad, told reporters that the arrestees include Pakistani national Mohammad Nasir who had helped an IM operative, an accused in the 2013 Dilsukhnagar twin blasts in Hyderabad, flee India.

The other arrestees are "Bangladeshi" Faizal Mohammad
