Bilbao thrash Barca



European champions Barcelona were stunned by an Aritz Aduriz hattrick and brilliant opener from Mikel San Jose as Athletic Bilbao

took a 4-0 lead into the second-leg of the Spanish Super Cup. Barca had picked up their fourth trophy

of the year in Tbilisi on Tuesday with a 5-4 win over Sevilla in extra time in the UEFA Super Cup. But those exertions clearly took their toll

as an under-strength side was dominated from the off by the Basques. San Jose fired in a volley from just inside

the Barca half to break the deadlock before Aduriz struck three times in 15 second-half minutes to give Ernesto Valverde's side a huge advantage heading into Monday's second-leg.

Barca's defensive deficiencies had been laid bare in blowing a 4-1 lead against Sevilla that forced them into an energy-sapping extra 30 minutes in the Georgian capital.

However, with Gerard Pique among four first-team regulars rested the Catalans were even more of a shambles at the back and this time couldn't be rescued by an off-colour Luis Suarez and Lionel Messi. It is the first time in 14 years that the

Catalans have conceded four times in two consecutive games. San Jose began an unforgettable night for

the hosts in fitting fashion as he pounced on Marc-Andre Ter Stegen's headed clearance to fire the ball beyond the German 'keeper from just beyond the halfway line. The visitors twice came close to an equaliser at the start of the second period as

Pedro fired off the underside of the bar before Iraizoz made another brilliant save to deny Messi from Suarez's clever cut-back. However, the game turned back in Athletic's favour when Sabin Merino beat Dani Alves for pace and his cross was

powerfully headed home by Aduriz. More poor defending from Luis Enrique's men was punished nine minutes later as the ball ricocheted around the area before Aduriz smashed home on the turn.

Soldado joins Villarreal

Spanish striker Roberto Soldado has joined Villarreal from Tottenham Hotspur on a three-year deal, both clubs confirmed on Friday.

"Villarreal CF and Tottenham Hotspur have reached an agreement for the transfer of Spanish striker Roberto Soldado, who will wear the yellow shirt for the next three seasons," Villarreal said in a statement on their website.

Soldado joined Spurs two years ago from Valencia for a then club record £26 million (\$40.6 million) as Spurs invested heavily to compensate for the sale of Gareth Bale to Real Madrid.

Platini warned Blatter of prison

FIFA president Sepp Blatter has alleged UEFA counterpart Michel Platini warned him he faced prison if he did not withdraw from the world football governing body's presidential race.

Speaking exclusively to Dutch newspaper de Volkskrant, Blatter claimed the warning, in which Platini allegedly said Blatter would go to jail if he did not withdraw from May's FIFA presidential race, was made to the Swiss official's brother.

"During lunch, Platini had sat down at my brother's table and said: Tell Sepp to withdraw from the election or he will go to prison'," said Blatter.

Bayern rout Hamburg

Bayern Munich launched their bid to win an historic fourth successive Bundesliga title on Friday with a 5-0 rout of Hamburg as new signing Douglas Costa shone on his league debut.

Bayern's established campaigners Robert Lewandowski, Medhi Benatia and Thomas Mueller, who netted twice, grabbed Bayern's first four goals with Brazil winger Costa adding the fifth to seal a show-stopping performance.

Costa, who Bayern coach Pep Guardiola has said can be the best winger in the world, showed why the champions paid Shakhtar Donetsk 30 million euros (\$33.3m) for him in July.

The 24-year-old chested down a long pass before firing in a cross which led to Bayern's third goal, then hit the back of the next with a crisp left-footed shot on 87 minutes.

Bayern, who won last season's title by 10

points, are bidding to become the first team to win four Bundesliga crowns in succession in the third and final year of Guardiola's contract.

Hamburg, who only avoided relegation last season by winning a play-off for the second year running, had their share of early chances as ex-Tottenham Hotspur midfielder Lewis Holtby fired a fourth minute shot straight at Bayern goalkeeper Manuel Neuer.

But after Lewandowski headed over a Philipp Lahm cross on 22 minutes, Bayern got the breakthrough five minutes later.

Spain veteran Xabi Alonso curled in a free-kick and with five Bayern players free, Benatia headed home the first goal of the new season on 27 minutes.

Bayern doubled the lead after the break when Lewandowski fired home from close range.

Alonso delivered a long ball, which took a deflection and hung in the air and was cleared by Hamburg defender Matthias Ostrzolek into Lewandowski's path for the Poland striker to slot home on 53 minutes.

Januzaj tames Villa

Adnan Januzaj marked his Manchester United return with a goal as Louis van Gaal's side beat Aston Villa 1-0 on Friday to claim a second consecutive Premier

League victory. Making his first start since February, Januzaj converted a glorious pass from Juan Mata on the half-hour as United extended an unbeaten record in league games at Villa Park that now stands at 20 years.

Following a 1-0 win over Tottenham Hotspur last weekend, this victory, in a game brought forward due to a far-right march in the area on Saturday, means United, now top of the table, have started a season with back-to-back wins for the first time since 2011.

It took United until November 22 to record their first away win last season and with Van Gaal having pinpointed his side's away form as an area in need of improvement, he will hope that this win augurs well for the campaign ahead.

Villa gave home debuts to no fewer than six players, while new signing Adama Traore watched from the stands after completing his move from Barcelona, but despite strong starts to each half, last season's beaten FA Cup finalists struggled to create clear chances.

Rudy Gestede's match-winning cameo against Bournemouth last weekend had strengthened his claim to a starting place, but it was with pace, rather than height, that Villa sought to unsettle United centrebacks Chris Smalling and Daley Blind, zipping passes between and behind them for Jordan Ayew and Gabriel Agbonlahor to chase.

With Januzaj starting behind Wayne Rooney at number 10, Memphis Depay moved to the left flank for United, and both took time to settle, Depay bundled over by Jordan Veretout and Januzaj flattened by Idrissa Gueye.

Villa could not set foot in the United box, though, and the visitors began to fire warning shots, with Brad Guzan forced to race from his goal and thwart Depay after the ball broke into the Dutchman's path.

Djokovic in semis, Nadal out

Novak Djokovic had to fight off an upset bid from qualifier Ernests Gulbis, defeating the Latvian 5-7, 7-6 (9/7), 6-1 on Friday to reach the semifinals of the Montreal Masters. But Rafael Nadal, like

Djokovic a former champion at the event, was unable to escape an on-form Kei Nishikori as the fourth seed sent out the Spaniard 6-2, 6-4 thanks in part to six double-faults from Nadal. The red-hot Nishikori is

riding a wave of momentum from his hardcourt title last week in Washington and will next face second seed Andy Murray who beat French 10th-seeded holder Jo-Wilfried Tsonga 6-4, 6-4.
