Two men killed in ultralight plane crash near Tokyo

AFP, Tokyo

Two men believed to have been a pilot and his passenger were killed after an ultralight plane crashed into a golf course northeast of Tokyo, police said yesterday.

The two-seater plane went missing Saturday after it took off from an airfield in Ibaraki prefecture.

The wreckage of the plane was found at a nearby golf course early yesterday with the two victims, aged 59 and 57, in the cockpit, a local police spokesman said.

They were unconscious and were later confirmed dead, the spokesman said, adding that the two were believed to have been travelling in the plane. Police and aviation authorities were investigating the cause of the crash.

Last month, a small plane crashed into a Tokyo suburb shortly after takeoff, killing two passengers and a woman on the ground. Local media reported that engine trouble and excess weight were among the possible cause of the crash.

Iraq PM clears way for military trials over Ramadi loss

AFP, Baghdad

Iraqi Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi approved an investigative commission's recommendation that commanders face military justice and probable trial for withdrawing from Ramadi without orders, his office said yesterday. Ramadi fell to the Islamic State

(ISIS) jihadist group in mid-May after government forces had held out against militants in the city west of the capital for more than a year, in the worst setback for Baghdad in months. Abadi approved "decisions of the

investigative commission on the withdrawal of the Anbar Operations Command and units attached to it from the city of Ramadi," his office said in a statement.

Those include "referring a number of the leaders to the military judiciary for leaving their positions without orders and contrary to instructions (and) despite the issuance of a number of orders not to withdraw," it said.

Abadi previously said that forces in Ramadi "had to resist, and if they had resisted, we would not have lost

Ramadi.' And a senior British military officer, Brigadier Christopher Ghika, said the city "was lost because the Iraqi commander in Ramadi elected to withdraw."

will go home after that." Contacted again around midnight, Sazzadur Rahman, DC (west) of Detective Branch of police, said they arrested Probir.

He added that the journalist was being taken to Faridpur Sadar Police Station where the case was filed.

Suprio said a Sher-e-Bangla Nagar police team led by Sub-inspector Abdul Jalil went to the office of online news portal (www.u71news.com) around 6:30pm.

The SI asked Probir, editor of the news portal, to go with them to the police station to discuss the GD.

The cops first put him on a police van, but it stopped at Khamarbari, a few hundred yards from Sagar-Saikat Market from where the journalist was picked up.

They then changed the car and drove away, Suprio said, adding he started following the car on a motorbike and saw police take his father to the DB office at Minto Road.

Probir, also editor of Bangla 71 newspaper, wrote a series of reports titled "Sei Razakar" in Bangla daily Janakantha against some alleged war criminals, including a controversial businessman from Faridpur and now condemned war criminal Abul Kalam Azad, also known as Bacchu Razakar, in 2001, according to the draft GD. It also mentioned that he was

attacked in April 2001 following his write-ups. In the attack, he lost a leg and also strength and mobility of one hand Probir, who also worked for daily

Samakal and Dainik Kalerkantha, posted the draft GD after police allegedly refused to take it. Recently, he wrote on his Facebook

page that a minister from the area was grabbing land. One post mentioned that he went to file the GD on July 22, as he and his

family were under threats, but police did not register it. Frustrated, he uploaded the draft GD on Facebook three days later where

he said, "I place the general diary before people's court."

their rules of procedures, giving a hint that one of them will remain functional, tribunal sources said.

Of the two provisions added, one says, "When any tribunal remains unformed, the case(s) under trial or at the pre-trial stage pending before it shall be deemed to have been pending before another functioning tribunal, and subject to the provision of the International Crimes (Tribunals) Act, 1973, it shall proceed from the stage at which it was so before the former."

Four out of six judges of the tribunals will return to the High Court and one new HC judge will join the rest two judges to form a tribunal, the sources said. The changes might take place in the first week of September.

The investigation agency has so far received 627 allegations against 3,420 people, said its coordinator Abdul Hannan Khan. Trial of 24 accused in 21 cases is over.

Two other accused are under trial. Investigations into five cases, including the case against the Jamaat-e-Islami as party, have been completed and 25

other cases are being investigated now. The government would decide whether to reduce the number of tribunals, Hannan said, adding that many cases were pending and so if one

tribunal dealt with those, the trial

procedure would be delayed.

"It will also give a wrong signal to the society that the issue of war crimes trial has moved out of the policymakers' focus," prosecutor Tureen Afroz said.

Zead Al Malum, another prosecutor, said that considering the number of pending complaints and the victims' expectations for justice, the government should rather engage more tribunals.

Chief Prosecutor Ghulam Arieff Tipoo declined to comment on the issue.

The trial must continue until the last war criminal is brought to justice, said Shahriar Kabir, executive president of Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee, an organisation campaigning for war crimes trial for at least two decades.

If the government changes, the trial will stop and so, it must be completed within the tenure of this government, he added.

The law minister yesterday told The Daily Star that the number of tribunals would be determined considering the number of cases. "I got a suggestion that the number

of tribunals be reduced. Nobody told me to increase the number," he said without elaborating as to who made such suggestions.
