A chance for revenge

Barcelona won't have to wait long to try to correct the errors that saw them lose the Spanish Super Cup to Athletic Bilbao as they return to San Mames on Sunday in their La Liga opener.

The European champions were thrashed 4-0 in Bilbao just a week ago as an undermanned Catalan defence failed to cope with the presence of Aritz Aduriz, who struck a hat-trick and then also netted in the return as the Basques won the final 5-1 on aggregate.

Barca coach Luis Enrique has even more defensive problems as his side look for revenge on league duty.

Gerard Pique has been banned for four matches after being sent off in Monday's 1-1 draw in the return leg of the Super Cup for verbally abusing the match officials. Jordi Alba remains a doubt with a hamstring injury,

while Neymar hasn't returned to training since he was diag-

The coach must also decide who to play in goal. Claudio Bravo made his first appearance of the campaign in the home game against Athletic after Marc-Andre ter Stegen had been selected for the first two matches of the season in which Barca conceded eight times.

MU, Adidas praise record kit launch

The launch of Manchester United's new Adidas home kit was the biggest in both the club's and the German sportswear manufacturer's history, the two companies announced on Friday.

The new strip, released on August 1, marked the start of a 10-year partnership worth £750 million (\$1.18 billion, 1 billion euros) to the Premier League giants, making it the biggest deal in sports licencing history.

In a joint statement, the companies said that United had witnessed a month's worth of forecasted sales within five days at their Old Trafford club shop and online store.

"Partnering with Adidas, we had high expectations; quality innovative kit, superb marketing, worldbeating distribution, a deep understanding of our history and our fans," said United managing director Richard Arnold.

"Adidas have not broken those expectations, they have smashed them."


Manchester City right-back Pablo Zabaleta will be sidelined for "around one month" with a knee injury, manager Manuel Pellegrini revealed on Friday.


