Pabna mob beats three to death

An angry mob beat three people to death on suspicion of kidnapping children in Pabna's Santhia upazila yesterday.

The dead were Alal, 50, of Dinajpur; Aslam Hossain, 42, of Natore; and Bakkar Hossain, 44. Police said they were relatives.

Witnesses said the trio were dragged out of a bus and beaten to death in broad daylight in front of a local market.

"Some eight to 10 people pulled the three out of a Sirajganj-bound bus around 11:45am, suspecting them to be kidnappers. They beat them up in front of a shop in Chotur Bazar area," transport worker Faruk Hossain, who witnessed the incident, told The Daily Star.

He said he recognised neither the victims nor the attackers. Police said they were

investigating the incident and would also try to find if it was a planned murder.

Grameen Bank on Fortune's "Change the World List"

Grameen Bank was ranked 12th on Fortune's inaugural "Change the World List" in recognition of its contribution to creating economic opportunities for those in poverty and bringing unbanked people under financial services.

This adds to the list of feats achieved by Grameen Bank Founder Muhammad Yunus who set up the microfinance institution in 1983 out of belief that small, collateral-free loans could enable Bangladesh's unbanked poor to start businesses and lift themselves out of poverty.

Grameen Bank proved the Nobel laureate right, demonstrating that microcredit could be selfsustaining and even profitable, said the US-based magazine on its website as it released the list on Friday.

Since the inception more than three decades ago, the microcredit organisation has lent \$17.4 billion to 8.7 million borrowers, most of them impoverished women. Its model has been copied around the world, including in the US.

Record GD if anyone wants to file it

DMP boss asks OCs

The Dhaka Metropolitan Police commissioner yesterday directed the officers-incharge of all police stations in the capital to cooperate if anyone, especially a blogger, approaches them to file a general diary over security or death threats, according DMP sources.

Though recording a GD is part of the usual duties of the police stations, DMP boss Asaduzzaman Mia gave the directives

as allegations of two police stations' refusal to record GDs cropped up recently.

Officers at the two stations, however, refuted the allegations.

Khilgaon Police Station allegedly refused to accept a GD from blogger Niladri Chattopadhyay Niloy, who sought security from law enforcers. He was later hacked to death at his Goran house on August 7.

Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Police Station reportedly declined to record a GD of senior SEE PAGE 10 COL 5
