Another Pak terrorist caught alive in J&K

Indian army and police have managed to capture another Pakistani terrorist alive in Jammu and Kashmir.

The terrorist was captured alive in Jammu and Kashmir's Rafiabad after an encounter. Four terrorists were killed in the encounter.

Security forces are questioning the captured terrorist. Arrested terrorist has been identified as 22-year-old Sajjad Ahmed, who hails from Muzaffargarh in south west Pakistan. This is the second instance of a Pakistani terrorist being

captured alive in a month. Earlier, LeT terrorist Mohammed Naved Yakub was cap-

tured alive during a terror strike in Udhampur.

Naved Yakub, a resident of Pakistan, made a confessional statement before a magistrate on Wednesday in Jammu.

In another development, Pakistan has informed the UN about the last-minute cancellation of the NSA-level talks with India to take the international community into confidence over the Kashmir issue and the situation at the LoC, a media report said yesterday.

Immediately after cancellation of the meeting between the National Security Advisors of the two countries, Pakistan's permanent representative at the UN Maleeha Lodhi was instructed to contact the UN leadership to discuss the rejection of dialogue by India, Dawn reported.

The talks were called off because of differences over the agenda proposed by Islamabad and a planned meeting with the Hurriyat leadership with Aziz.

Pakistan court orders arrest of ex-PM Gilani

A Pakistani court yesterday ordered the arrest of former prime minister Yousaf Raza Gilani, and former minister Makhdoom Amin Fahim, on charges of corruption for approving subsidies to fake companies. Both are senior leaders of Pakistan People's Party.

The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has charged the leaders for approving and disbursing fraudulent trade subsidies worth millions of Pakistani Rupees to several fake companies through fictitious claims and backdated cheques under a scheme of

Gujarat remains tense after caste violence

Rahul says Modi's politics of anger responsible for the clashes

Tension prevails in India's Gujarat state where two days of caste-related violence has left eight people dead. Fresh clashes were reported overnight and the army has been deployed to maintain peace.

A curfew has been imposed, after members of the influential Patel community,

demanding quotas in government jobs, clashed with the police and local people. PM Narendra Modi has urged the people of his home state to maintain peace. The main city of

Ahmedabad was calm yesterday and shops and busi-

nesses were beginning to reopen in some areas, the AFP news agency reported.

Rahul Gandhi yesterday targeted Modi over the violence in Gujarat during quota agitation by Patels, saying it was a repercussion of the "politics of anger" pursued by Modi.

"Our Prime Minister (Narendra) Modi is doing politics of anger and such politics has

repercussions for the country which you are seeing in Gujarat," the Congress vicepresident, who is on a three-day visit to Jammu

and Kashmir, told reporters after addressing a

farmers' rally at a village in Pampore town.

Rahul said the "politics of anger has only benefited Modi".

The BBC Hindi's Ankur Jain in Ahmedabad says overnight clashes between the police and protesters were reported from Surat, Vapi and Rajkot. A policeman who was injured in the clashes in Surat died in

detained the protesters' firebrand leader Hardik Patel, who had hours earlier led a massive rally in Ahmedabad.

Eight people, including a policeman and a father and son, have been killed in the violence and at least a dozen policemen injured. About 40 police stations and 70 buses have been set ablaze.

Malaysia to block antigovt sites

Malaysia says it will block websites spreading information about a major antigovernment protest this weekend.

Authorities said sites which "promote, disseminate information and encourage people to participate" in the demonstration will be blocked.

Protest organisers are calling for Prime Minister Najib Razak to step down over allegations of corruption. Najib is accused of siphoning \$700m (£452m) from a sovereign wealth fund, a claim he has denied.

The Bersih 4.0 protest is due to be held across three cities in Malaysia over the weekend, including Kuala Lumpur. Thousands are expected to rally in the capital alone.

'Ice doctors' to repair Mount Everest route

A team of specialised Nepalese Sherpa mountaineers have begun work to repair the climbing route on Mount Everest four months after it was destroyed by a devastating earthquake.

In April, 18 mountaineers and support staff were killed when the earthquake triggered an avalanche which swept through Everest base camp. The team, known as the Icefall Doctors, has begun surveying the mountain.

They plan to fix ropes through the Khumbu Icefall in the next few days. The Icefall is a notoriously treacherous stretch of mov ing and cracking ice, which climbers must negotiate after they leave base camp on their way to Camp 1 on the mountain. Without the ropes fixed by the Icefall doctors, this would

not be possible. The Icefall doctors say they hope the restored route will attract mountaineers back to Everest for the autumn season. "We plan to begin rope fixing work in the treacherous icefall section after conducting a ground survey," leading icefall doctor

Ang Kami Sherpa told the Himalayan Times earlier this week. A Japanese climbing team has already arrived in Nepal ahead of their planned attempt on the summit next month On Tuesday, climber Nobukazu Kuriki, 33, left Kathmandu for the Everest region, to begin acclimatising before his planned attempt on the summit next month.

Kuriki, who has lost all his fingertips and one thumb to frostbite, is so far the only person scheduled to climb Everest during the challenging autumn climbing season.

China arrests 12 over Tianjin blasts AFP, Beijing

Chinese police have arrested 12 people over giant explosions that killed at least 145 people and devastated a swathe of a Chinese port city, state media said yesterday as prosecutors probe 11 officials for neglecting their duties. 28 people still remain missing. Thousands of tonnes of hazardous chemicals were stored at the site, officials have said, including about 700 tonnes of highly poisonous sodium cyanide.

45 jailed in Xinjiang over terror charges

Chinese courts in the restive, western region of Xinjiang have jailed 45 people on terrorism-related charges, including 18 convicted of organising illegal border crossings, state-run media reported yesterday. Among them were at least eight people most likely minority Uighur Muslims who were sentenced to prison terms on charges of trying to leave China unlawfully, the official Xinhua News Agency said.

Rebels should think carefully on peace deal

Says Myanmar's Suu Kyi

Myanmar's popular opposition leader Aung San Suu Kyi is urging armed ethnic minority groups to think carefully before signing a nationwide cease-fire agreement, a top party colleague said, a position that pits her against President Thein Sein, who has made reaching a deal before November elections his top priority.

Talks between more than a dozen rebel groups and the government have been held on and off again for more than 18 months.

Win Htein, an executive of the opposition National League for Democracy, said party leader Suu Kyi expressed her opinion at a Saturday meeting with Maj Htoo Htoo Lay of the Karen National Union, which has announced it is ready to sign. The KNU is one of the bigger ethnic minority groups that have been fighting the central government for decades to win greater autonomy.

"Suu Kyi said ethnic groups will have to consider not signing the nationwide cease-fire agreement before the Nov 8 general election," he said. "It has to be meaningful."

Suu Kyi has so far stayed largely silent on the issue. But with elections around the corner and her party widely expected to win a majority of the seats, she has begun speaking out more on some issues. A deal before the election could boost the prospects of Thein Sein's ruling party, the NLD's main opponent.



Hong Kong student leaders charged **BBC ONLINE**

Three prominent Hong Kong student leaders have been charged over their roles in the pro-democracy "Umbrella Movement" of 2014. Joshua Wong, Nathan Law and Alex Chow are accused of

climbing a fence to break into a government compound at the start of the demonstrations. Wong, 18, has said he did not do anything illegal. The

protests, against proposed changes to Hong Kong electoral system, began in late September. At the height of the movement, tens of thousands of

people were occupying major streets demanding fully free elections for the territory's next leader, after Beijing said it would vet potential candidates.

The three students were among a large group of people who stormed the fenced-off Civic Square inside a government compound on 26 September, as an act of protest.
