'Bolt is Messi of athletics'

Luis Enrique has compared Usain Bolt to Barcelona star Lionel Messi, stating that he is the best sprinter of all time.

The 29-year-old beat Justin Gatlin in Beijing to lift gold in the 200m at the world championships for the fourth time in a row.

And the Barca coach believes that the Jamaican is to athletics what Messi is to football.

"You could make a good comparison between Messi and Bolt," he told reporters.

"Bolt is the best sprinter of all time and is a brand and I think Messi is the best player of all time."

The Catalan side have been drawn with Bayer Leverkusen, Roma and BATE Borisov in their Champions League group, and the coach is looking forward to begin-

ning his team's defence of the European crown.

"It's a more exciting competition with tough opponents, how could it be otherwise? We have a tough group, like most teams.

"It is a very attractive, very difficult group, no doubt. It's not

as difficult as Sevilla's group - they drew Juventus, Manchester City and Borussia Monchengladbach, but it is difficult. "We will try to do something that nobody has done in

modern times, winning two Champions League titles." Sergio Busquets and Neymar have missed Barca's start to the season through injury, but Luis Enrique is pleased with how they are recovering.

"Busquets has been able to train since yesterday and is doing very well.

"As for Neymar, I've also seen that he has recovered very well. He is not 100 per cent, but no player is at that level now."

Dortmund rout Odds

Borussia Dortmund smashed the record attendance for a Europa League play-off crowd by 12,000 in their 7-2 rout of Norway's Odds BK as they qualified for the group stages.

A crowd of 64,200 saw Germany winger Marco Reus score a hattrick as Dortmund sealed an 11-5 aggregate victory over Odds on Wednesday at Borussia's Westfalenstadion having come-back from 3-0 down to win last week's first-leg 4-3 in Norway.

It gave the team their seventh straight win under new coach Thomas Tuchel, whose side top the Bundesliga by virtue of goal difference ahead of Bayern Munich.

The attendance broke the previous record for a Europa League play-off of 52,034 set by Dortmund's Ruhr Valley neighbours Schalke against HJK Helsinki in 2011/12.

Bolt mulls Rio retirement

Usain Bolt said he might end his glittering career at next year's Olympics after he completed a world sprint double in Beijing -- and got clattered by an electric scooter into the bargain.

The towering Jamaican said he was only 50-50 about running at the next world championships in 2017 in London, and could retire at the Rio de Janeiro Olympics instead.

"After Rio, as I said, my sponsors want me to go one more year, but my coach said, 'Listen to me, if you're not going to be serious about going to the world championships in London,' then I shouldn't do it," he said.

"So it's all about how I feel after Rio, if I feel I can really put my body through one more season. If I'm going to be focused and I'm going to be determined. That will determine if I compete after Rio. So we'll see how it goes."

Bolt, troubled by pelvic problems this year, was pushed all the way by Justin Gatlin

in Sunday's 100m, but had an easier ride in the 200m as he beat the American by nearly two-tenths of a second.

It was the fourth consecutive world 200m title for the 29-year-old, who has won all but one world and Olympic sprint competitions since he lit up the 2008 Beijing Olympics. However, Bolt's celebrations came to a

sticky end at the Bird's Nest stadium on Thursday when a TV cameraman riding an electric scooter lost control and ploughed into him from behind, sending the Jamaican flying.

"I probably should get my legs insured," smiled the six-times Olympic champion. "I was pretty scary when it happened but accidents happen.

Footage of the incident quickly went viral, with "Segways", referring to the electric scooter, trending on Twitter on Friday.

Some Chinese Internet users commented that the cameraman was the only person who was able to take down Bolt in Beijing.

"The only guy in the world who can defeat Bolt," a user with the handle "Sehun" posted on his Twitter-style weibo account.

Benitez seeks first win

Schippers shatters European record

Dutch sprinter Dafne Schippers smashed a European record which has stood since the 1970s as she won world 200m gold with an electrifying run on Friday.

The 100m silver-medallist ran 21.63sec, the fourth fastest time in history, as she lunged at the line to beat Jamaica's Elaine Thompson, who clocked a personal best of 21.66sec. It was a remarkable win for Schippers, 23, who eclipsed

the European record of 21.71sec set by Marita Koch in 1979 and matched by fellow East German Heike Drechsler in 1986. Only Americans Marion Jones and world record-holder

Schippers. Two-time Olympic champion Veronica Campbell-Brown, who previously won the world title in Daegu in 2011, claimed

Sergey Shubenkov of Russia won gold in the men's 110m hurdles. The two-times European champion clocked a national record of 12.98 seconds, with Jamaican Hansle Parchment taking silver in 13.03.

Socceroos lose star trio
