It was truly a people's war

Prof Rehman Sobhan's remarkable book launched

The departure from the spirit of libera- 🔣 tion struggle means Bangladesh has failed to honour the blood debt to the common people who paid the real price for independence, said noted economist Prof Rehman Sobhan in his new book.

It was the ability of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman to involve

these people that gave the depth and strength to the Liberation War and enabled them to withstand the genocide of the Pakistan army, he wrote in the book -- From Two Economies to Two Nations: My Journey to Bangladesh.

"This mass participation was the distinctive feature of Bangladesh's liberation struggle and set it apart from most such struggles," Prof Sobhan said.

For the same reason, he said, it remained essential to build a society where the common people are given a sufficient material stake in the rewards of independence and a commensurate democratic stake in shaping a modern Bangladesh.

'PM annoyed over needless remarks'

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has expressed annoyance over some of her party and cabinet colleagues making "unnecessary" statements, which, she said, created an unwarranted situation for the government. When some leaders of the ruling Awami League met her

at the Gono Bhaban on Wednesday, she said the party leaders and the ministers must refrain from making controversial remarks, sources said.

AL leaders Mahabubul Alam Hanif, Abdur Razzaque, Faruk Khan and Saber Hossain Chowdhury were among those present at the unofficial meeting.

Hasina, also AL president, gave the instructions at a time when a few party leaders became vocal over incidents of "crossfire", recent price hikes of gas and power, the US refusal to give Bangladesh the generalised system of preferences in its market, and the misdeeds by leaders and activists of pro-AL bodies such as Chhatra League and Jubo League.

Protesters defy warning, jam Kuala Lumpur

Demand wider reforms, PM's ouster

Tens of thousands of Malaysians swarmed central Kuala Lumpur yesterday to call for the prime minister's ouster over corruption allegations and demand broader reforms, defying warnings by police who had declared the rally illegal.

Streets near the capital's heart became expanses of yellow, with demonstrators donning the colours of Malaysia's reform movement in a carnival atmosphere of political speeches, musical performances, deafening vuvuzelas and selfies.

Leading civil-society group Bersih, which organised the gathering, had planned to occupy the city's Independence Square overnight.

But that appeared foiled, with security barriers and hundreds of police barring access to the historic area.

Members of Prime Minister Najib Razak's cabinet have admitted he received nearly \$700 million in mysterious deposits into his personal bank accounts starting in 2013.

The revelation, brought to light by the Wall Street Journal last month, has crystallised the frustrations of many Malaysians fed up with recurring government graft scandals.



ডেঙ্গুজ্বরের সাধারণ লক্ষণ

- জ্বর (শরীরের তাপমাত্রা হঠাৎ বৃদ্ধি পায়)।
- মাথা ব্যথা, চোখের পিছনে ব্যথা, পেটে ব্যথা, মাংসপেশী ও হাড়ে ব্যথা (বিশেষতঃ মেরুদভে ব্যথা), বমি-বমি
- শরীরে হামের মত দানা দেখা দেওয়া

ডেঙ্গুজ্বরের ব্যবস্থাপনা

- অধিকাংশ ক্ষেত্রে ডেম্বুজ্বর ৭ দিনের মধ্যে এমনিতেই সেরে যায়।
- রোগীকে উপসর্গ অনুসারে প্রয়োজনীয় চিকিৎসা দিতে হবে এবং বিশ্রামে রাখতে হবে। প্রচুর পানি ও তরল খাবার
- দ্রুত জ্বর কমানো একান্ত জরুরি। এজন্য মাথা ধোয়া, ভিজা কাপড় দিয়ে গা মোছা এবং প্যারাসিটামল খেতে দেয়া যেতে পারে। এ্যাসপিরিন জাতীয় ঔষধ কোনভাবেই খেতে দেয়া যাবে না।
- মারাতৃক (হেমোরেজিক) ডেঙ্গুজ্বরে আক্রান্ত হলে রোগীকে অবিলম্বে হাসপাতালে/ডাক্তারের কাছে নিতে হবে।

ডেঙ্গুজ্বর প্রতিরোধে করণীয়

- এডিস মশা নিয়ন্ত্রণ ডেঙ্গু প্রতিরোধের প্রধান উপায়।
- বাড়ির ভেতর/বাহির/ছাদ এবং আনাচে-কানাচে পড়ে থাকা অপ্রয়োজনীয় পাত্রসমূহ ডাস্টবিনে ফেলে দিন। বাড়ির আশপাশের ঝোপঝাড় এবং আঙ্গিনা পরিস্কার রাখুন।
- ব্যবহারযোগ্য পাত্রসমূহে (যেমন বালতি, ড্রাম, ফুলের ও গাছের টব, ফ্রিজ এবং এয়ার কভিশনারের নীচের পানি ভর্তি পাত্র ইত্যাদি) পানি কোনভাবেই যেন একনাগাড়ে ৫ (পাঁচ) দিনের বেশি জমে না থাকে, সেদিকে লক্ষ্য রাখুন।

AL spent only a third of its income last year Party to submit report to EC tomorrow

The ruling Awami League had spent around a third of its total income in 2014.

Last year, the ruling party earned around Tk 90 million while it spent around Tk 35 million, sources in the party told The Daily Star. The AL would submit the report to the Election Commission tomorrow,

the last day for submitting the report. In 2013, the ruling party earned Tk 120 million while it spent Tk 60 million. In 2012, the AL earned Tk 100 million and spent Tk 90 million.
