Tajul Islam, chief of the parliamentary watchdog, said.

He was talking to reporters after a committee meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.

However, a press release of the parliament secretariat said the committee at the meeting had recommended that the government reconsider its decision of increasing the power and gas tariff.

Asked about the release, Tajul said he had no idea about what was in there.

Retail customers will have to spend on average 2.93 percent more on electricity and Tk 200 more on gas stoves from tomorrow.

Bangladesh Energy Regulatory Commission (BERC) announced the new tariff structure on Thursday.

Under the new rates, households using a single-burner stove will have to pay Tk 600 a month, which is now Tk 400. For double-burner stove users, the tariff has been raised to Tk 650 from Tk 450 a month.

Industries that use gas to produce electricity through generators will see gas tariff double -- Tk 8.36 from Tk 4.18 per cubic metre.

BUS OWNERS FOR FARE HIKE

Private bus operators yesterday sent a proposal to the Ministry of Road Transport and Bridges for increasing bus fare in Dhaka and Chittagong cities following the government decision of hiking gas and power tariff.

"As most of the buses in the two cities run on CNG, we have proposed to increase the fare," Khandaker Enyet Ullah, secretary general of Bangladesh Sarak Paribahan Malik Samity, told The Daily Star.

"We have not mentioned [in the proposal] anything about the new rate or the amount we want to be increased. We have just said that the fare should be adjusted in accordance with the upcoming gas price hike," he said.

He said they did not talk about anything on the fare of inter-district buses which run on diesel.

Enyet, also the general secretary of Dhaka Sarak Paribahan Malik Samity, said all owners of buses in the capital were asked not to charge passengers any additional fare until the government revised the fares.

According to the government-fixed fare chart, a minibus passenger has to pay Tk 1.5 while a bus passenger Tk 1.6 for travelling a kilometre. Long-route bus passengers pay Tk 1.45 for the same distance.

From tomorrow, the price of per cubic meter of CNG would be Tk 35 from Tk 30.

## 61 Jamaat men held

international day jointly with the Asian Federation against Involuntary Disappearances (AFAD), the Asian Legal Resource Centre (ALRC), the International Federation for Human Rights (FIDH) and rights organisation Odhikar.

Prof CR Abrar, president of Odhikar, told The Daily Star over the phone that they had booked the Jatiya Press Club auditorium on July 11, paid the money and got a receipt.

"But at 5:20pm on Saturday, we received a phone call from Selim Mia, an employee of the Jatiya Press Club. He said that as per the instructions of the club's general secretary, the booking for the programme was cancelled and that they will not allow Odhikar to host the programme at their premises," he said.

Abrar claimed that when they contacted the club's general secretary, they were told that the club had its own programme at the venue during the same time and on the same date.

However, when The Daily Star contacted the Press Club authorities, they declined to mention what programme they had and at what time.

A correspondent and a photographer of The Daily Star, who were present at the Press Club from 9:00am to 3:00pm, did not see any programmes taking place at the auditorium. Instead, there were police sitting on the flights of stairs leading up to the large, empty, dark hall with plastic chairs stacked on one side.

The policemen said they had been deployed there since morning.

Talking to The Daily Star, Nur Khan Liton, a rights activist, said, "The occurrence of enforced disappearance has become quite frequent since 2007. At first, the victims were mostly notorious criminals but recently the victims are mostly activists of opposing political parties. Some businessmen and even a few activists of the ruling party also became victims."

According to Ain O Salih Kendra (ASK), between 2007 and 2014, 343 people were allegedly abducted by law enforcement agencies. Of them, 57 dead bodies were recovered, 36 were released, 11 handed over to police afterwards, 4 found in DB office, 7 presented before media as arrestees of RAB and one was shown arrested.

This year, ASK data show, 36 people became victims of enforced disappearance by law enforcement agencies from January to July, as claimed by their families. Of the victims, dead bodies of 6 were recovered later, 2 came back and 3 were shown arrested.

ASK statistics are based on reports of national dailies and the ASK investigation unit.

In 2010, the UN General Assembly adopted the International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance, and decided to observe 30 August as the International Day of the Victims of Enforced Disappearances, beginning in 2011.

"The day has been observed in Bangladesh since 2012. It was initially organised by Odhikar. Last year, human rights activists under the banner of Moulik Odhikar Surakkha Committee (basic rights protection committee) observed the day at the Jatiya Press Club auditorium," said Liton.

Meanwhile, in a joint statement posted on FIDH website on August 29, AFAD, ALRC and FIDH urged the Bangladesh government to take responsibility for ensuring accountability, truth and justice for all incidents of enforced disappearances in the country.

## Illegally imported drug seized in city

A shipment of illegally imported medicines worth around Tk 50 lakh was seized from a cargo service office in the capital last night.

On information, a mobile court led by Executive Magistrate Towheed Elahi raided the office of A-to-Z Cargo Service at Fakirapool around 8:00pm and found 40 cartons of the medicines there.

The medicines, mostly produced in the UK, were imported dodging taxes, said Assistant Superintendent Ehsanur Rahman Bhuiyan of the Armed Police Battalion which along with the Directorate General of Drug Administration assisted the mobile court.

The medicines were couriered to Dhaka from Chittagong and meant to be distributed among different drug-stores in the capital, the police official added.

The manager of the cargo service office was jailed for two months and fined Tk 2 lakh.

## SC rejects Mosharraf's review plea

The Supreme Court yesterday dismissed a petition of BNP leader Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain seeking review of its guidelines for the High Court Division in granting anticipatory bail to him in a case.

A four-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha passed the order terming the plea "dismissed as being time barred".

The petition was rejected as Mosharraf delayed in filing it, said Khurshid Alam Khan, lawyer of the Anti-Corruption Commission which filed the money laundering case against the BNP leader.

The HC on February 10 last year granted him anticipatory bail in the case.

Fourteen days later, the Appellate Division cancelled the bail order and issued some guidelines in granting anticipatory bail.

Review petitions against any SC order have to be submitted within 30 days of the order, according to the rules. Mosharraf, however, did it only last month, around 16 months after the bail was cancelled.

In its 2014 judgment, the Appellate Division also expressed disappointment at the HC bench for "failure to follow its guidelines" in giving anticipatory bail to Mosharraf.

The HC should have scrutinised the facts mentioned in the First Information Report with "expected diligence", and shouldn't have granted anticipatory bail "where the allegations are of heinous nature", it said.

"If satisfied in all respects, the HC will dispose of the anticipatory bail applications instantly without issuing any rule, and will not grant such type of bail to an accused for more than four weeks.

"Anticipatory bails shall not survive post-charge sheet stage," the judgment said.

The HC judges would have to mention the reasons for granting the bail and "give reasons for their satisfaction on this unravelling point," it went on.

"Political threshold of the [bail] petitioner or claimed rivalry, by itself, without further ado, shall not be a ground for entertaining an application," the Appellate Division added.

old system is for them to remove this prime minister," said Mahathir, a deeply respected 90-year-old who was once Najib's patron and is now his fiercest critic.

"And to remove him, the people must show people's power. The people as a whole do not want this kind of corrupt leader," he told media before heading to the rally, whose numbers police estimated at 25,000 yesterday afternoon.

The protest has brought into the streets a political crisis triggered by reports of a mysterious transfer worth more than \$600 million into an account under Najib's name.

Najib, who denies wrongdoing, has weathered the storm and analysts say the protest is unlikely to inspire broad public support for him to quit because it lacks a strong leader.

These protests, unlike the 2012 rally, also lack the support of a party identified with the Malay majority: most protesters were from the minority ethnic Chinese and Indian communities.

However, Mahathir - the country's longest-serving leader - was a leader of the ruling United Malays National Organisation (UMNO), which represents Malays.

UMNO Vice-President Hishammuddin Hussein said that by turning up unexpectedly at the anti-government rally on Saturday, Mahathir had "crossed over the line".

Another UMNO leader said a million government supporters would stage a "red shirts" rally on Oct 10 that would trump the protests of the past two days.

"This shows the solidarity of Malaysians, that Najib still has the majority support," Jamal Yunos told Reuters.

carries blood from the heart to the lungs, and is usually caused by a blood clot formed in a vein in the leg. Up to 60,000 people die as a result of pulmonary embolism each year in Britain.

The study, presented at the European Society of Cardiology conference in London, is the first research into the links between prolonged television watching and fatal pulmonary embolism. A boom in online television services in recent years has allowed people to download and watch entire series of shows in one sitting.

But people who sit in front of the television for five hours or more a day have more than twice the risk of suffering a deadly blood clot as those

during the party-enforced country-wide blockade on November 30, 2013.

Depak Kumar Das, a sub-inspector of the Detective Branch of police and also investigation officer of the case, submitted the charge sheet before the Court of Chief Metropolitan Magistrates in Dhaka yesterday.

The accused include BNP standing committee members Goyeshwar Chandra Roy and Mirza Abbas and Joint Secretary General Aman Ullah Aman.

The court fixed September 6 for hearing whether it would accept the charge sheet.

On November 30, pro-blockade activists hurled a petrol bomb at a bus in Malibagh area around 7:30pm during a blockade enforced by the BNP-led 18-party alliance. Losing control, the bus crushed Habibur Rahman, to death and injured a rickshaw-puller. Two passengers suffered burn injuries in the attack.

Khaleda said if her party came to power again, they would conduct proper investigations to know the fate of the victims of enforced disappearances.

A pall of gloom descended on the room when a video documenting paper clippings and television footages on the victims of enforced disappearances was played.

"I will urge the government to tell me whether my son was killed and, if so, where he was buried so that I can visit his grave at least," said an emotion-choked Shamsuddin,

father of Nizamuddin Munna, joint general secretary of pro-BNP Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal's Airport Thana unit.

He said plain-clothes policemen picked up his son from their residence in the city on December 6, 2013, saying they had received complaints against him. They didn't elaborate on this further, he claimed.

"I went to police, to the Rab, everywhere to know my son's whereabouts but none of them could say what really happened to him," said the 60-year-old.

Tahsina Rushdir -- wife of BNP

Organising Secretary M Ilias Ali who went missing on April 17, 2012 -- said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina had assured her of finding out her husband. "Three years have passed since then but we have yet to know the fate of my husband."

BNP insiders said Khaleda Zia's programme was organised suddenly after the Jatiya Press Club authorities cancelled a pre-scheduled event of rights body Odhikar in the afternoon. Family members of the victims of enforced disappearances were then asked to attend the BNP chief's programme.

tortured to death in the DB custody on the same day.

Rubel's father Abdur Rob Miah filed a murder case the following day with Ramna Police Station accusing 14, including the then assistant commissioner Akram and Roksana Begum alias Mukuli Begum, a neighbour of Rubel.

The Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court, Dhaka, in June 2002 sentenced 13 accused, including Akram, to life-term rigorous imprisonment and Mukuli Begum to one year in prison in the case.

Following appeals challenging the lower court verdict, the HC in May 2011 acquitted Akram and nine others, including Mukuli Begum, of the murder, saying that the allegations brought against them had not been proved beyond reasonable doubt.

Until the HC order, Akram languished in jail for about 13 years in the case.

The HC, however, upheld the life imprisonment of the then police officer Hayatul Islam Thakur, said Additional Attorney General Momtaz Uddin Fakir.

The Appellate Division yesterday also allowed the government to move a regular appeal challenging the HC verdict.

A four-member bench of the apex court headed by Chief Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha came up with the order after the hearing on a leave-to-appeal petition filed by the government against the HC order on Akram.

The SC accepted the government petition on the ground that the HC might not properly assess the evidence produced against Akram, said Additional AG Momtaz.

Akram, who is now retired, will have to surrender to the lower court in seven days on receiving the SC order, he said. The lower court may grant him bail after his surrender in the case.

Momtaz could not say details as to what would be the legal procedure against the other accused in the case.

The other accused are the then inspector Aminul Islam Khan, sub-inspectors Amir Ahmed Tareq and Nurul Alam, assistant sub-inspector Abdul Karim, havildar Nuruzzaman and constables Ratul Parvez, Quamrul Hasan, Mir Faruk Hossain, Mong She Oen, Abul Kalam Azad and Mohammad Zakir Hossain.

SI Nurul Alam and constables Azad and Zakir Hossain have been absconding.
