MEASURE THE SOFA

CHOOSE A STRONG FRAME

Longevity of a sofa (or any furniture for that matter) depends largely on the frame. It has to be made of a strong material. If you are looking at wooden frames, ask the salesperson whether it's made of properly seasoned hardwood. Teak, Mahogany, and Chapalish have good reputation as lasting wood.
