### Move to check accidents

Quader opens 4 road dividers on Bangabandhu Bridge approach road STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader yesterday inaugurated four road dividers on the western part of the approach road of Bangabandhu Bridge in Sirajganj.

This part of the approach road is one of the most accident prone areas in the country.

The four-lane road dividers, built after the model on Dhaka-Aricha highway, would significantly reduce accidents in this area, the minister told The Daily Star.

He said construction work of the dividers began in accordance with his directives after Eid-ul-Fitr and ended a couple of days ago to facilitate movement of passenger vehicles before and after Eid-ul-Azha. A total of eight crore taka has been spent over the construction job, he

The minister also inaugurated a bypass road near Kaliakor Bridge, an area often burdened with tailback, to facilitate smooth vehicular movements.

Earlier on Thursday, the road transport minister inaugurated another 500-meter long bypass road at Chandra Intersection to ease tailbacks in the area. People of at least 26 northern and southwestern districts use this highway.

A draft proposal on formation of the think tank and its area of activities was placed before a meeting between senior leaders and the BNP chief at her Gulshan office on Sunday.

"We have decided in principle to form a think tank which will work for BNP making suggestions on various local and international issues," BNP standing committee member Lt Gen (retd) Mahbubur Rahman told The Daily Star.

He also said the chairperson would take a final decision on the formation of the think tank, its ways of work and other related issues. Led by Prof Emajuddin Ahmed,

former vice-chancellor of Dhaka University, a group of pro-BNP intellectuals and professionals have been working unofficially as the party's think tank since long. Emajuddin and others in their

latest advice convinced Khaleda to take part in the city corporation elections in Dhaka South, Dhaka North and Chittagong as an exit route from their three-month-long anti-government movement that started on January 6.

Khaleda on April 4 unofficially called off the BNP-led 20-party alliance's 92-day nonstop blockade and a series of hartals and decided to participate in the city polls held on April 28.

Senior leaders at Sunday's meeting told Khaleda that most of the political parties at home and abroad have their own think tanks, but BNP has no such body or a research cell.

In the draft proposal, it was mentioned that the think tank would consult with the party's secretary general, pick different contemporary political, social and international issues and come up with suggestions on those.

"The think tank will analyse those issues from different perspectives. Apart from national politics, it will also keep watch on regional and global politics relating to Bangladesh. It will determine BNP's possible stance on those issues in light of public interests," said a leader asking not to be named.

Apart from giving suggestions, it would also assist the party to take time befitting and realistic initiatives through research works, added the

The think tank however will not be entitled to take any decision. They will just convey their advice to

the BNP chief. There would be sub-sections in the think tank for different sectors

including education, economics, sports, ICT, agriculture, communications and diplomacy.

They will help BNP regarding the party's strategy on these sectors and what the party would do to develop these sectors if it goes to power.

Insiders say BNP will also bring amendment to its charter to materialise the idea and give it a strong

The party will also use different social media including Facebook and Twitter to attract the young generation. So far the party has no official Facebook page or Twitter

account. A dedicated group will be formed to work intensively on the

social media, added insiders.

## Balkans shut Europe's

FROM PAGE 16 figures showed the European Union had received almost a quarter of a million asylum requests in the three months to June.

A record 473,887 refugees and migrants have crossed the Mediterranean to Europe so far this year, the International Organization for Migration said, most of them from countries at war such as Syria who are seeking a better, safer life.

With Europe's cherished borderless travel zone in tatters, the continent has been wrangling over how to handle the influx, with eastern states ruling out an EU quota plan for sharing out the bur-

After EU frontline state Hungary sealed off its southern border with Serbia earlier this week, thousands of migrants and refugees have now headed westwards, seeking to open up a new route westwards through Croatia and Slovenia into Austria.

But after two days in which they registered more than 13,000 Croatia yesterday said it had reached saturation point, closing seven of the eight crossings along its eastern border with Serbia.

"Our capacities to take in more are saturated," Interior Minister Ranko Ostojic told N1 television station. As the crowds began making their

way westwards, Slovenia announced it was suspending all Croatian rail links until late yesterday. As the chaos spread, the UN's refugee

agency (UNHCR) and the International Committee of the Red Cross issued separate pleas for the 28-member bloc to agree on a common policy for handling the situation and minimising the human misery. "The countries affected must work

together closely instead of closing their borders like they are doing at the moment," ICRC President Peter Maurer told German weekly Der Spiegel.

And UNHCR spokesman Adrian Edwards warned that time was running out, saying recent events in Hungary and elsewhere "demonstrated the chaos and confusion being caused by the absence of a coherent and united

response to Europe's refugee situation.'

Two key EU meetings due to take place next week are "crucially important" for reaching some form of agreement, he said.

"These occasions may be the last opportunity for a positive, united and coherent European response to this crisis. Time is running out." German Foreign Minister Frank-

Walter Steinmeier yesterday said that EU members reluctant to accept migrant quotas may have to be outvoted and overruled in the 28-member bloc. "It just cannot be that Germany, Austria, Sweden and Italy carry the

burden alone," he said. "That's not how European solidarity works. As Germany has opened its gates, Hungary has done the opposite, sparking a wave of anger as it sealed off its

southern border with Serbia and

announcing plans for a similar fence

along its frontier with Romania. And on Friday, its hawkish premier Viktor Orban said hundreds of troops had begun work on a 41-kilometre (25.5-mile) section of the 330kilometre border along its frontier with

Croatia to keep migrants out. "There will be no sandhill or molehill to hide behind, we will defend our borders," he told Hungarian public radio.

However, hundreds of migrants

crossed into Hungary from Croatia

yesterday, handed over by bus under the watch of Hungarian security forces sworn to keep them out. Police and soldiers rushed to take

position as a convoy of more than 10 Croatian buses offloaded hundreds of migrants who had crossed in the past two days into EU-member state Croatia from Serbia after Hungary blocked their path into the European Union with a metal fence on its border with Serbia.

Soldiers maneuvered two Humvees mounted with machine guns to block their route. But minutes later, the migrants were directed to board Hungarian buses bound for an unknown destination. A police statement said they would be registered, without giving details.

health personnel, availability of essential drugs, early diagnosis and treatment of the NCDs and level of immunisation were also included as factors.

These factors were divided into 51 indicators to measure Bangladesh's performance in preventing and controlling the NCDs. The country earned "highly ade-

quate" only in one indicator -- the hepatitis B vaccination programme. It was put in the "adequate" category in 12 indicators, "inadequate" in 19 and "no activity" in as many indica-

In South Asia, Bangladesh and India scored moderately well in the areas of planning and leadership, while Pakistan scored very low.

Bangladesh scored less than India in reducing the risk factors. However, all three countries fared poorly in research and surveillance.

Talking to The Daily Star, Dr Aliya Naheed, interim head of the chronic non-communicable disease unit at the International Centre For Diarrhoeal Disease Research, Bangladesh (icddr,b), said: "Bangladesh has done quite well in terms of combating communicable diseases, but now it is the non-communicable diseases that are emerging as great health challenges."

Prevention and early diagnosis and treatment are key to combating the NCDs, but Bangladesh is poorly equipped in this regard, she said.

Little physical activity and unhealthy diet are becoming very common among the urbanites, noted the physician. "Our laws and policies must address the emerging threats."

"In Bangladesh, over 60 percent of healthcare expenses come out of individuals' own pockets. If strategic policies are not implemented, things would get even worse in future.

"The number of trained personnel at the secondary and tertiary healthcare services is also not sufficient for systematic risk assessment diagnosis, and treatment of NCD," Dr Aliya added.

"We have no alternative but to operate the vehicles for a living. If police stop us, we pay them money,' claimed a battery-run easy-bike driver who makes regular trips to Medical intersection from Modern intersection on Rangpur-Dinajpur highway. Abdul Quader Jilani, officer-in-

charge of Kotwali Police Station in Rangpur, also refuted the allegation. Seeking anonymity, an SP told The

Daily Star that politicians often lobby for releasing the vehicles after their seizure. "They [politicians] even come down heavily on us if we do not

comply with their requests," he said. The government imposed the ban on three-wheeler auto-rickshaws, autotempos and all non-motorised vehicles on 22 national highways on August 1.

On September 15, Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader at a press conference said the ban would be enforced strictly.

Contacted, Obaidul Quader said there was a High Court directive to take the unauthorised and slowmoving vehicles off the highways, and it was the responsibility of all concerned to implement it.

Law enforcers have been asked not to comply with the politicians' requests to release seized vehicles, he said.

"We all will have to work together to implement the ban on these vehicles on the highways to save lives," he added.A

They tied the guards with rope and cut the vault in the same manner. Later, the robbers fled with the money, said the police official.

Mahmud, sub-inspector of the police station, said the closed-circuit cameras inside the bank were broken. They seized a piece of rope and two gas cylinders at the scene, believed to have been used in the robbery.

A double-barrel gun was at the bank but the criminals did not take it. Among the Ansar members,


