# 7 policemen withdrawn

Families of the dead demand justice

The authorities yesterday withdrew seven cops in connection with the deaths of three people in Friday's police firing during a protest against the torture of a mother and herson.

Although police on Friday dismissed that the three died in their shooting, autopsy reports yesterday confirmed that all the three succumbed to bullet injuries.

"All of them died from bullet wounds," said Ashraful Islam, a resident medical officer of Tangail Medical College Hospital where the autopsies were done. Of those withdrawn, three are sub-inspectors and four

constables, said Deputy Inspector General (Dhaka Range) of Police SM Mahfuzul Haque Nuruzzaman. Asked why only junior-level officers were closed, he said,

"We have withdrawn them to defuse the tension prevailing in the area." Mahfuzul added the Election Commission already
