

# Bullet-hit body found on roof

The bullet-hit body of a youth was found on the roof of a one-storey building in the capital's Kadamtali yesterday afternoon.

The body of Sohel, 22, of Matlab upazila in Chandpur, bore bullet wounds in the head and a cut in the throat, said Kadamtali police.

The recovery of the body came after locals informed police that he was taken onto the roof by three persons.

The body was sent to Sir Salimullah Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

The reason behind the killing could not be ascertained immediately.

# Most Dhaka city cattle markets near busy roads

Almost all the locations leased out by the Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) for setting up temporary cattle markets are either playgrounds or open spaces near busy roads, though the Local Government Division (LGD) has ordered not to use such places.

On the other hand, the Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) has leased out the open space between Uttara 11 and 13, which

caused traffic chaos on Janapath Road in the previous years.

DNCC had initially decided to lease the space between Sector 15 and 16, but it later stuck to the previous place because Sector 15 and 16 fall outside its territory.

DSCC has leased out 10 locations for Tk 44 million and DNCC rented out five spots for Tk 59 million.

In an August 31 order, the LGD asked the city corporations not to lease out the field of any education institution, playground, and open

space beside rail tracks, roads and highways because it causes public sufferings and accidents.

The LGD letter also warned of legal action against those who would not comply.

According to the Playground, Open Space, Park and Natural Reservoir Conservation Act, such places cannot be used otherwise - it cannot be rented and leased out or cannot be handed over for any other purpose.

Taking public sufferings into

## Digitisation of judiciary nearing completion

Will reduce time of case disposal

Digital services have been introduced at the Supreme Court as well as many lower ones across the country as a part of bringing the entire judiciary under digitisation process to make it time-befitting, reduce harassment of justice seekers and dispose of the cases in a logical timeframe.

SC Registrar General Syed Aminul Islam said, "All measures have been taken to bring the entire judiciary under digitisation."

As a part of the process, 150 judges have been given smart tabs while mobile apps have been introduced at Dhaka courts to facilitate justice seekers to see the regular cause list over their cellphones. A complete website with server has already been set up at the SC. Digital services have also been introduced in Chittagong court.

Over 200 lower courts alongside the apex court have already been brought under the digital process. A database of the officers of the judiciary is now being prepared.

Tabs and laptops have been distributed among many lower court judges. Internet services to every court will be ensured.
