Mohun Bagan AC have pulled out of the Sheikh Kamal International Club Cup, scheduled to be held in Chittagong next month, citing unavailability of some of their key players.

The Kolkata giants were supposed feature as one of the four foreign teams alongside four local teams, as claimed by the tournament organisers. But the Bangladesh Football Federation's general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag yesterday confirmed that the Kolkata club will not be taking part.

"Mohun Bagan initially agreed to take part, but today (Tuesday) the club sent a letter to us saying that they won't take part as some key players of the club have joined national team's camp for World Cup qualifiers while some other players are nursing injuries," said Shohag, adding that the BFF would request the All Indian Football Federation to send a another team.

Cantona vows to house and feed refugees

Former Manchester United star Eric Cantona evoked the memory of his own grandparents fleeing war when promising on French radio Tuesday to house and feed refugees for a period of "at least" two years.

"I'm organising that with authorities in Marseille," Cantona told France Inter radio, explaining he intended to provide a small house, garden and food for a period of at least two years.

"If you house someone who does not have the right to work, then they need to eat too," said the enigmatic former France captain.


Cantona explained that his own family history had inspired his decision.

"My maternal grandparents were Spanish Republicans who fled Franco (in the Spanish civil war) by crossing the Pyrenees on foot," he said. "That being our story, it certainly played a role."

The man credited with sparking Manchester United's period of dominance in English football has carved out a successful second career as an actor since hanging up his boots.

Ferguson reveals Rooney row

Former Manchester United manager Alex Ferguson has revealed that he refused to allow Wayne Rooney to be paid more than him during a

Rooney vowed to leave United after accusing the club of a lack of ambition, only to perform a sudden U-turn and sign a new five-year deal reportedly worth £180,000 (\$279,000, 249,000 euros) a week.

But Ferguson reveals in his new book, 'Leading', which is released on Tuesday, that he engineered a deal of his own ensuring that no player could earn more than him, telling United's owners the Glazer family and then-chief executive David Gill he "did not think it fair that Rooney should earn twice what I made".

"It was simple. We just agreed that no player should be paid more than me," Ferguson said.

Rooney fell out with Ferguson prior to the Scot's retirement in 2013, but was appointed United captain by current manager Louis van Gaal last year. Ferguson says that Everton pulled out all

the stops to prevent Rooney joining United in 2004, including an emotional phone-call from the player's mother.

"After we gave them our final offer, (Everton manager Bill) Kenwright got Rooney's mother on the phone and she told me, 'You are not going to steal my boy'," writes Ferguson, who is now a United director.


Other revelations in the book include the disclosure that Ferguson considered a move for wayward Italy striker Mario

Balotelli in 2010, only to be dissuaded by his contacts in Italy.

"In 2010, I briefly flirted with the idea of signing Mario Balotelli, the talented but controversial Italian striker," Ferguson says.

"I did my homework on him, speaking to a few Italian contacts, but the feedback I got confirmed it was too big a risk."

Balotelli subsequently joined Manchester City from Inter Milan, returning to Italy for a second spell at AC Milan this

year following a disappointing season with Liverpool.

Ferguson hits out at Tottenham Hotspur chairman Daniel Levy's handling of Dimitar Berbatov's move to United in 2008, describing the experience as "more painful than my hip replacement".

He also has choice words for Mino Raiola, the agent of French midfielder Paul Pogba, who left United for Juventus in 2012 and has since become one of the world's most coveted players.

Gabriel red revoked

Arsenal have won an appeal against Brazilian defender Gabriel's sendingoff in Saturday's Premier League defeat to Chelsea, the Football Association confirmed on Tuesday. Gabriel was dismissed

following an off-the-ball clash with Chelsea striker Diego Costa late in the first half of the Gunners' 2-0 defeat at Stamford Bridge and was facing a three-match ban for violent conduct.

"Arsenal's claim of wrongful dismissal in relation to Gabriel has been upheld following an Independent Regulatory Commission hearing," read a statement from the FA.

"The player's threematch suspension has, therefore, been withdrawn with immediate effect."

However, Gabriel still faces a separate charge of improper conduct for his reaction after being shown the red card by referee

He and Arsenal have until 1700 GMT on Thursday to respond to the charge.

Costa has also been charged with violent conduct after apparently swinging his arm at Laurent Koscielny during Saturday's game and faces a three-match ban.

A violent conduct charge results in an automatic three-match suspension, unless it is overturned.

Inter looking to strengthen lead

Leaders Inter Milan host Verona on Wednesday looking to build on their positive start in Serie A as champions Juventus aim to continue their climb back up the table.

With four consecutive wins and only one goal conceded, Roberto Mancini's men are already being talked of as scudetto challengers to four-time consecutive champions Juventus.

But Mancini -- who won seven trophies including three consecutive league titles in his previous spell in charge (2004-2008) -- was quick to dampen any premature enthusiasm.

"Our league position doesn't count at the moment. What does count is being among the top sides over the course of the season," Mancini said after Sunday's 1-0 win at Chievo.

With a two-point lead over Torino, Roma four off the pace and Juventus eight points adrift in 13th, Mancini has some room to manoeuvre.

But with Inter missing out on the Champions League for the past two seasons, the Italian is in no mood for complacency.

"We always have the weight of expectation, because we're Inter Milan. We need to be protagonists this season," added Mancini, who made significant additions to his squad, notably in midfield and defence, in the off-season.

"Our defence is better, because the more you work, the more you improve. Our new players are helping us a lot."

Inter should welcome Brazilian defender Joao Miranda, signed from Atletico Madrid, back for the visit of Verona after a recent injury, although fellow defenders Juan Jesus

and Jeison Murillo are both expected to miss Wednesday's San Siro outing.

Verona are winless and are likely to be without injured pair Luca Toni and Rafa Marquez.

Torino have plenty to be proud of having only dropped points in a 2-2 draw at Verona a fortnight ago.

Giampiero Ventura's side boasts wins over Frosinone, Fiorentina and Sampdoria but their trip to a Chievo side still smarting from defeat to Inter looks anything but straightforward.

Prior to their defeat at the weekend, Chievo sat second in the table with an impressive tally

Spotlight on FIFA again

Scandal-engulfed FIFA will be in the spotlight again this week during the first executive committee meeting since the suspension of secretary general Jerome Valcke.

FIFA's executive committee will be updated on the US and Swiss corruption investigations which involve some of its own members, football's governing body said.

President Sepp Blatter will also "very likely" take part in the press conference following the two-day meeting, a FIFA spokesman told AFP. The session which will open on Thursday at 14:00 local

time (12:00GMT) and close on Friday afternoon, will be overseen by deputy secretary general Markus Kattner, who has stepped in to replace Valcke. Valcke was put on indefinite leave last week over accusations that he agreed to let World Cup tickets be sold at a

allegations. His eviction has only served to heighten the suspicion which is swirling around Blatter's final months in office with the election of his successor set for February 26.

FIFA said in a statement that the executive committee agenda would include "an update on the Swiss and US investigations" as part of the corruption probe.

The 25 committee members, including vice-president Michel Platini, the UEFA president and favourite to succeed Blatter, will also receive a first update of the work of Swiss lawyer Francois Carrard, appointed by FIFA to carry out reforms in the wake of the corruption scandal that erupted last May, when seven football officials were arrested at a Zurich hotel on the eve of a FIFA Congress.
