Doctor leaves Chelsea

Eva Carneiro, the Chelsea team doctor publicly criticised by manager Jose Mourinho, has left the club, according to British media reports on Tuesday.

Carneiro was removed from match-day duties last month after her and physiotherapist Jon Fearn were rebuked by Mourinho for running on to treat Eden Hazard during Chelsea's 2-2 draw with Swansea City on the season's opening weekend, which temporarily left his team with nine players.

Several media outlets, including the BBC, said that Carneiro, 42, had left Chelsea and was expected to launch a claim for constructive dismissal.

Chelsea have not commented on the reports.

It follows reports last week that Mourinho could face a five-match ban after a member of the public complained that the Portuguese had used sexist and abusive language against Carneiro.

Following the Swansea game, Mourinho said: "I was unhappy with my medical staff. They were impulsive and naive."

"Whether you are a kit man, doctor or secretary on the bench you have to understand the game."

Carneiro, born in Gibraltar to a Spanish father and English mother, thanked people on Facebook for their support in the aftermath of the incident, but has not spoken publicly since.

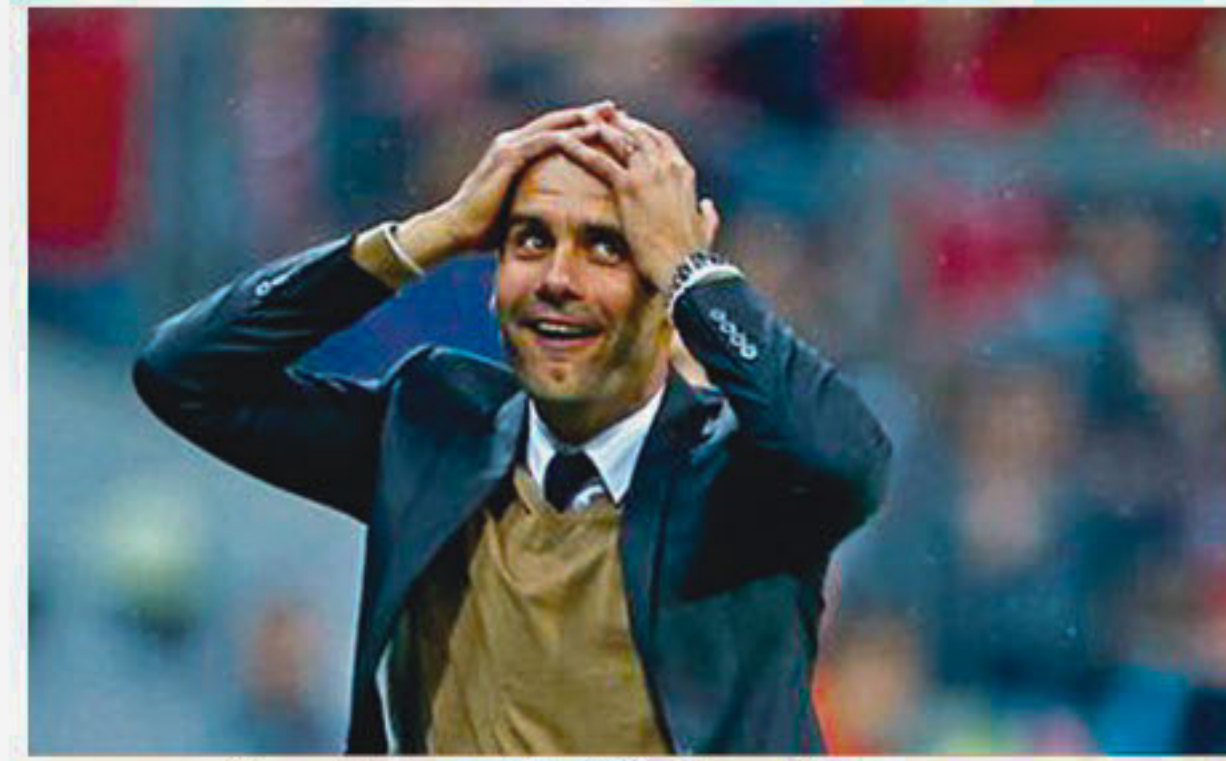

Costa banned for 3 matches

Chelsea's Spain forward Diego Costa was on Tuesday banned for three matches for raising his hands to the face of Arsenal centre-back Laurent Koscielny.

Costa was found guilty of violent conduct during Chelsea's 2-0 Premier League win over their London rivals on Saturday.

The 26-year-old former Atletico Madrid striker had denied the Football Association charge over the incident, which had been missed by referee Mike Dean.

"An FA charge against Diego Costa for violent conduct not seen by the match officials but caught on video has been found proven following an Independent Regulatory Commission hearing," said the FA in a statement.

"The Chelsea forward will, therefore, serve the standard penalty of a three-match suspension with immediate effect."

In a statement, Chelsea said: "We are extremely disappointed with the FA Regulatory Commission's decision to suspend Diego Costa. We will await their written reasons before commenting further."

Man City cruise

Record signing Kevin De Bruyne scored again as Manchester City crushed Sunderland 4-1 to reach the League Cup fourth round on Tuesday, but Swansea City fell to second-tier Hull City.

Manchester City's perfect start to the Premier League season was abruptly ended by a 2-1 loss at home to West Ham United at the weekend, but Manuel Pellegrini's team bounced back in style at the Stadium of Light.

They were 4-0 up inside 36 minutes through a ninth-minute Sergio Agüero penalty, De Bruyne's second goal for the club, an own goal by Sunderland goalkeeper Vito Mannone and a neat finish by Raheem Sterling.

Struggling Sunderland, bottom of the Premier League table after six games without victory, replied courtesy of an 83rd-minute header by close-season signing Ola Toivonen.

Swansea lost to a 41st-minute David Meyler strike at Hull.

Griezmann fires Atletico

Atletico Madrid moved to the top of La Liga as Antoine Griezmann's double handed them a 2-0 win over Getafe on Tuesday.

Griezmann got the hosts off to the perfect start after five minutes and then sealed the three points despite an otherwise unconvincing Atletico display from Jackson Martinez's stoppage time pass.

Victory takes Atletico top on goal difference from champions Barcelona.

Both Barca and Real Madrid are in action on Wednesday when they travel to Celta Vigo and Athletic Bilbao respectively.

"The early goal put us on the road to victory," said Atletico boss Diego Simeone.

"We played well for the first 10 minutes and improved a lot in the last 20 minutes."

"In between we couldn't create the chances to kill the game and allowed them to have good opportunities, particularly one just before and after half-time."

Someone made six changes to the Atletico side that won 2-0 at Eibar on Saturday and the hosts got off to a flying start.

A corner was only cleared as far as Gabi on the edge of the area and his ball back into the danger zone was expertly controlled and finished by Griezmann.

Yannick Ferreira Carrasco was one of those given his chance to impress and the Belgian fired just wide as Atletico continued to push forward.

Yet, it was Getafe who ended the half the stronger as Jan Oblak had to

get down well to divert on-loan Celtic striker Stefan Scepovic's drive to safety.

The visitors had an even better chance to level on the hour mark when Pedro Leon fired wide with just Oblak to beat.

Someone responded by introducing Martinez for the ineffectual Fernando Torres.

And despite again failing to get on the scoresheet, the Colombian unselfishly teed up Griezmann to fire home his fifth goal of the season.

Elsewhere, Valencia's poor start to the campaign continued as Victor Alvarez's first-half goal was enough to give Espanyol a 1-0 win.

Los Che have managed just five points from their opening five games and coach Nuno Espirito Santo was subjected to calls for his resignation by fans during Saturday's 0-0 draw at home to Real Betis.

Balotelli off the mark

Mario Balotelli scored the first goal of his second spell at AC Milan as the Serie A giants held on for a hard-fought 3-2 win at Udinese on Tuesday.

In his first start for the Rossoneri since moving back to the club on loan from Liverpool at the start of this season -- having left Milan a year earlier to sign a permanent deal with the Premier League outfit -- the controversial Italy international forward needed just five minutes to open his account.

The result moved Milan provisionally up to fourth ahead of the rest of the midweek matches.

Further goals from Giacomo Bonaventura and Cristian Zapata had seemingly put the game to bed before the half-time whistle.

But Udinese launched a stirring second-

half fight-back that probably deserved more than just two goals from Emmanuel Badu and Duvan Zapata.

Udinese remain in the relegation zone on three points after a fourth defeat in five matches this season.

All eyes were on Balotelli, though, even before the 25-year-old stepped up to curl a free-kick into the top corner of goalkeeper Orestis Kamezis's net.

Just five minutes later and the hosts faced an uphill battle as Bonaventura converted from the centre of the area after a through ball from Riccardo Montolivo.

The game appeared over as a meaningful contest in first-half injury time as Colombian centre-back Zapata headed home a Bonaventura corner.

Udinese wasted no time after the restart in getting back into the match, though, as Ghana midfielder Badu arrived late in the box to volley into the bottom corner after good work from veteran Italy international forward Antonio Di Natale on 51 minutes.

Pele defends Costa

Troublesome Chelsea striker Diego Costa would have been considered a petty criminal rather than a master villain in the 1950s and 1960s, according to Brazil great Pele.

Costa, who was born in Brazil but opted to represent Spain at international level, has been banned for three games for twice hitting Laurent Koscielny during Chelsea's 2-0 defeat of Arsenal last weekend.

It is not the first time the snarling centre-forward has fallen foul of the football authorities, but Pele, famously kicked out of the 1966 World Cup by Portugal's Joao Morais, said Costa's crimes were nothing compared to the punishments meted out to him during his extraordinary career.

"Listen, this to me was so common," a smiling Pele told AFP. "I suffered all my life with good marking. He's a very good player, everybody knows."

"This was one moment. The striker who bit someone, Luis Suarez, was worse than this."

Pele, a leading contender for the title of greatest footballer of all-time, was speaking at the launch of an exhibition to mark his 75th birthday, which falls on October 23.

Called 'Art, Life, Football', the exhibition at London's Halcyon Gallery features artworks depicting memorable moments from Pele's career, including a 1977 portrait by pop art pioneer Andy Warhol.

Unlike today's stars, there is not a surfeit of footage of Pele in action, but some of his goals were so famous they acquired their own epithets.
