ROOPPUR NUKE PLANT

Cheaper power despite high project cost

Says Russian project chief

Bangladesh and Russia are set to finalise a deal within a couple of months to construct the Rooppur nuclear power plant using two VVER-1200 nuclear reactors that have a 60-year lifespan, making the project cost effective.

The VVER-1200 (Water-Water Energetic Reactor or WWER with 1,200MW capacity) is the "third generation plus" reactor. Russia's Novovoronezh Nuclear Power Plant II is set to become the first plant to go into operations with VVER-1200 this year. Bangladesh looks at the Novovoronezh plant as the model for Rooppur, says Maksim V Elchishchev—who is in charge of Bangladesh project from Russia.


Rooppur to be a suitable site for a nuclear power project," said Maksim, vice-president of NIAEP (a sister concern of Russian stateowned nuclear power company Rosatom).

With 300 people, the NIAEP has been conducting the feasibility study and preparing project design from mid-2013. It completed and submitted the study in June and it will submit the project design to the government this month.

"We did not find any factor against building the nuclear power plant at Rooppur," he said, while talking to the press in the capital yesterday. Russian Ambassador Alexander Nikolaev was present on the occasion.

Drawing attention to earthquake risks, he said, "We are working further on ground stabilisation and compaction. Some geological issues need to be addressed in the light of "In our feasibility study, we have found the study. This is required for any project site."

DEATH OF NEWBORNS DUE TO NEGLIGENCE

Hospital sealed in city

A private hospital in the capital was sealed yesterday by government authorities following allegations that three newborns died there due to doctors' negligence on Friday night.

The four-storey Asian Cardiac General Hospital in Block-B of Lalmatia, run without any government approval, was found devoid of any staff in the afternoon.

Locals said the hospital staffs fled in the early morning yesterday before families of the newborns could confront them. They said there was unrest the night before after news of the children's death spread.

The hospital's neonatal intensive Friday afternoon. care unit ran with only one doctor named Shishir Ranjan Das who claimed to be an associate professor at Dhaka Medical College Hospital, said a guardian whose newborn baby was

19 killed in 'US air strikes' on Afghan hospital

Dozens wounded, many missing; UN slams attack on MSF facility as 'inexcusable, even criminal'

An air strike, probably carried out by US-led coalition forces, killed 19 staff and patients, including three children yesterday, in a hospital run by Medecins Sans Frontieres (MSF) in the northern city of Kunduz, the aid group said.

The US military said it conducted an air

strike "in the vicinity" of the hospital as it targeted Taliban insurgents who were directly firing on US military personnel and an investigation into the incident had begun.

UN Human Rights chief Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein led a chorus of condemnation, without saying who carried out the strike, noting that an assault on a hospital could SEE PAGE 10 COL 2

The void of his passing will be greatly felt by his family, friends, associates and his numerous well wishers.


His First Namaze Janaaza will be held at Azad Mosque Gulshan on Sunday the 4th of October Bad Zuhr.
