
BOLT WEARS ARSENAL SHIRT

dog on Thursday suspended the two most powerful men in football, Sepp

Blatter and Michel Platini, for 90 days in a sensational new blow to the sport's scandal-tainted governing body. Secretary-general Jerome Valcke

was also suspended for 90 days while South Korean tycoon Chung Mong-Joon, a candidate for the FIFA presidency along with Platini, was banned outright for six years. While FIFA said the suspen-

sions were "provisional", the action almost certainly signals the end of the reign of FIFA president Blatter and deals a major blow to UEFA leader Platini's hopes of taking over.

Issa Hayatou head of the Confederation of African Football, a Blatter ally, was put in charge of the multi-billion dollar body.

FIFA said Blatter, who has been its president since 1998, had been "relieved of all his duties" during the 90 days.

Blatter is under investigation by Swiss prosecutors for criminal mismanagement.

The four football powerbrokers "are banned from all football activities on a national and international level. The bans come into force immediately", a statement

"disappointed" the ethics watchdog had failed to follow its own rules by not letting him give evidence.

Australia have succumbed to an inspired Jordan side 2-0 in Amman, losing their first World Cup qualifier on the road to the 2018 World Cup.

Hasan Abdel-Fattah's 47th minute penalty stunned the Socceroos before Hamza Al-Dardour sealed a famous victory for Jordan with six minutes remaining.

The result repeated Australia's defeat in the Jordanian capital during their previous qualifying campaign - and gives Jordan the top spot in Group B that also features Bangladesh, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan. Tajikistan played out a 2-2 draw with Kyrgyzstan yesterday.

While the result is undoubtedly a setback to their qualifying hopes, Australia retain control of their destiny. The Socceroos have four matches remaining - including three at home and the other in Bangladesh the first group stage and four victories would secure passage.

Meanwhile, Iraq captain Younis Mahmoud rescued a point for Iraq with a last-ditch penalty as the former Asian champions drew 1-1 with Vietnam in Hanoi.

Abu Nahyeh hooked the ball in from close range in the second minute of stoppage time to keep them in third place in Group A behind leaders Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates.

North Korea's perfect start in Group H came to an end when they were surprisingly held 0-0 at home by the Philippines.

In other early matches on Thursday, Singapore downed Afghanistan 1-0 in Group E with a 72nd minute header by Khairul Amri, while goals by Hassan Maatouk and Abbas Atwi gave Lebanon a 2-0 win over Myanmar in a Group G game in Bangkok.

Maldives picked up their first points in Group C after withstanding a late fightback to win 4-3 at Bhutan. Ahmed Nashid's opening goal and an Ali Ashfaq hat-

trick gave the visitors a four-goal advantage before Bhutan reduced the deficit in the final five minutes.

England captain Wayne Rooney will miss his side's last two Euro 2016 qualifiers against Estonia and Lithuania due to an

The striker, who last month became England's all-time leading goal-scorer, has missed three days of training after injuring himself during Manchester United's 3-0 defeat at Arsenal in the Premier League last Sunday. In his absence, Chelsea centre-back Gary

Jurgen Klopp agreed Thursday to become Liverpool's new manager and was expected at the club later in the day, British media said.
