Rajshahi Dev Authority formulates 20-year master plan

BSS, Rajshahi

Rajshahi Development Authority (RDA) has formulated a 20-year master plan aiming to ensure planned development in the city and its adjacent areas in that time.

Around 364 square kilometres of two adjacent municipalities and 12 union parishads are included in the mega plan, said Prof Bazlur Rahman, chairman of RDA.

He said the main goal of RDA is city planning and also to ensure planned growth and development of the metropolis.

Just after its establishment in 1978, RDA started preparing its first master plan for 20 years. The plan was implemented in 1984 in an area of 127 square kilometres.

After invalidation of the first master plan, RDA prepared a new master plan named Rajshahi Metropolitan Development Plan (RMDP).

During preparation of the plan for the first time in Bangladesh, RDA used modern planning techniques and tools like GPS, Total Station, RTK and GIS software.

A detailed socioeconomic, transport and physical feature survey along with contour and RL record were done. All of the collected data and information were preserved as a data bank in digital format

"We are very optimistic about doing better work under the present master plan," said Prof Rahman.

In an effort to make the plan a total success, RDA held a coordination meet ing with other relevant organisations and public representatives yesterday.

Victim woman's family 'threatened'

The family of Josna Akter, who was beaten by a village elder in Gazipur last week, is passing days in fear because of threats from the accused.

She was assaulted for refusing to attend an arbitration meeting over land disputes with her younger brother, Hossain Khan, 43, at Chhoto Latifpur village in Kaliakoir upazila. Jalal Uddin Matabbar, who was supposed to arbitrate in

the dispute, dragged the woman by hair out of her house and clobbered her with a stick on October 5. The next day, the family sued three people -- Jalal

Matabbar, Hossain Khan and neighbour Amena Khatun. Police arrested Hossain Khan on Wednesday, while the

prime accused, Jalal, is absconding. Amena Khatun is on bail. After his arrest, Hossain Khan threatened the victim's elder son Nayan Mia, saying he would see how far it goes, when the two met at Kaliakoir Police Station, said Nayan. Nayan now escorts his younger brother, Hridoy Ahmed,

13, an eighth-grader, to and from school. No GD was filed.

Assault by Gazipur Village Elder | Govt to rehabilitate 57,000 more homless families

The government has targeted to rehabilitate 57,000 more landless and homeless families at the cost of Tk 515 crore by 2016, especially the people falling victim to natural disasters including cyclone, river erosion and flood.

"The Ashrayan project under the Prime Minister's Office is working to alleviate poverty of the landless and homeless families of the country by focusing on human resource development," M Zahirul Haque, project director of Ashrayan-2 Project to the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), told the news agency yesterday.

He said the project was working directly on civil and human rights of the target population and intervening in order to improve their living conditions, education, health

and earning opportunities.

The Ashrayan campaign already rehabilitated 1,32,000 landless and homeless families and provided training to many family members so that they can generate income, Haque said.

The project is to improve the standard of living ensuring basic education, healthcare and skill development on income generating activities of the landless, homeless, distressed and rootless people.

Earlier, the government has also extended the tenure of Ashrayan-2 Project till June 30, 2017, and increasing spending under it to Tk 2,204 crore, with a view to alleviating poverty by providing residential facilities and creating employment for the landless and marginalised people, the project details said.
