African Americans gather for 20th anniversary

Thousands of African Americans gathered in Washington on Saturday to mark the 20th anniversary of the "Million Man March," renewing their demands for justice reform and greater civil rights.

The demonstration on the National Mall -- the grassy, mile-long promenade between the US Capitol building and the Washington Monument -follows a series of high-profile incidents of police violence against black Americans over the past year.

The anniversary event gathered people from across the United States hoping to push elected officials to do more to combat social and economic inequalities, as well as violence that disproportionately affects communities of color.

Louis Farrakhan, head of the National of Islam black Muslim group, organized both the original 1995 march and this year's "Justice or Else" gathering.

Unlike the march 20 years ago, Saturday's protest included a call for justice that encompassed a broad range of overlooked ethnic groups, whereas most participants in the first march were black males.

Protesters included entire families and people of various races who heard Farrakhan praise what he described as a new groundswell of African American activism.

- 'Not a moment, a movement' -"This is not a moment, this is a movement," Farrakhan said during his lengthy, televised address.

came in line with the government's assurance of providing highest security for all diplomats and foreign nationals. Inspector General of Police AKM

Shahidul Hoque has meanwhile said Bangladesh is a safe country for foreign-"We think Bangladesh is still a safe

place for foreigners and everyone else. There are no causes of concern as all security measures have been taken by the police, other law-enforcement agencies and the government," the IGP said.

He made the comments yesterday after an inaugural session of a driving training programme for gipsy community organised jointly by Dhaka Metropolitan Police and international

The police chief said law enforcers would find out if there is any conspiracy and who are behind it after dissolving at least one of the two foreigners' murders.

Several countries including Japan, Italy, United Kingdom and United States have issued alerts for their citizens residing in Bangladesh after the incidents.

Sri Lanka arrests Rajapakse loyalist

Sri Lanka's police yesterday arrested a regional politician linked to former president Mahinda Rajapakse over the 2005 assassination of a Tamil lawmaker highly critical of his administration.

Sivanesathurai Chandrakanthan, a former chief minister of the Eastern province, was arrested by the police Criminal Investigations Department in connection with the murder of legislator Joseph Pararajasingham, police said.

Pararajasingham, 71 was gunned down inside the St. Mary's church in Batticaloa, 303 kilometres (190 miles) east of Colombo, before a packed Christmas congregation 10 years ago. Both the then government of

Rajapakse and the separatist Tamil Tiger rebels had blamed each other for the audacious assassination, but the case was reopened only following a change of government this year.

initial signs suggested Islamic State was behind the Ankara attack, and that it bore striking similarity to a July suicide bombing in the town of Suruc near the Syrian border, also blamed on the radical Islamists. "All signs indicate that the attack

may have been carried out by ISIL (Islamic State). We are completely focused on ISIL," one of the sources told Reuters. Turkey is vulnerable to infiltration

by Islamic State, which holds swathes of Syrian land abutting Turkey where some two million refugees live. But the group, not normally reticent about its attacks, made no claim to the Suruc bombing and has made no claim so far to the Ankara attack.

in Syria, where it has launched air strikes which it says are aimed at routing jihadists. Relatives of the victims, who in July marked the first anniversary of the crash

with an emotional gathering attended by over 2,000 people, said they believed the final report will at least answer some questions. They will also for the first time be confronted with the harrowing sight of
