Novak crushes Rafa to win China Open

Novak Djokovic crushed his age-old rival Rafael Nadal 6-2, 6-2 on Sunday to seal his sixth China Open title and extend his amazing unbeaten run at the Beijing tournament.

The world number one underlined his superiority in men's tennis as he thrashed a fading Nadal for his 29th win at an event he also won in 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013 and 2014.

Djokovic won three of the four Grand Slam finals this year and shows no signs of slowing down at the end of the season after losing only 18 games in his romp to the Chinese title.

Djokovic put Nadal under pressure from the start with a thunderous opening rally, which the Spaniard lost, and the world number eight then shanked a forehand high into the air to give up the first break point.

Nadal had break points in the sixth game but Djokovic held firm, and the Serb gained his second break in the seventh game when his Spanish opponent volleyed into the net with the court at his mercy.

Nadal called the trainer early in the second set for treatment to his right foot, and when Djokovic broke to go 2-1 ahead the 14time Grand Slam winner's challenge looked shot.

An instinctive lob over the stranded Nadal put Djokovic on his way to a second break and 4-1 lead, and after passing up two match points at 5-2, he finally sealed it with an ace for his rapturous Chinese fans.

Wales reached the finals of an international tournament for the first time since the 1958 World Cup Saturday when they

qualified for Euro 2016 despite a 2-0 loss to Bosnia. Wales secured their place when

Israel lost 2-1 at home to Cyprus. Belgium also went through from the same Group B thanks to a 4-1 victory over Andorra. Earlier on Saturday, Italy also made

sure of their place in the finals in France next summer with a 3-1 win in Azerbaijan. The Welsh, Belgium and Italy join

already qualified Austria, the Czech Republic, England, France, Iceland, Northern Ireland, Portugal, Spain and Switzerland in the 24-team finals. Bosnia went in front after 71 min-

utes in Zenica when Miralem Pjanic delivered a long free-kick into the area and substitute Milan Djuric sent a looping header over goalkeeper Wayne Hennessey. Vedad Ibisevic added a second in

the dying moments as Bosnia kept their play-off hopes alive. But it didn't matter for a buoyant

Wales as Cyprus stunned Israel 2-1 in Jerusalem thanks to an 80th-minute drive from Jason Demetriou.

"It's the best loss of my life," said Wales' Real Madrid star Gareth Bale.

"To achieve it is a dream come true and now we want to go out and get ready for France. It shows exactly what we're about. We're like brothers on the pitch."

Belgium inflicted Andorra's 49th defeat in Euro qualifying, making light of a rain-soaked, plastic pitch to record a 4-1 victory and a fifth European qualification.

Marc Wilmots's side were a goal to the good after 19 minutes when Roma's Radja Nainggolan scored with a long-range effort which took a slight deflection off Andorra defender Marc

Three minutes before the break, Manchester City's Kevin De Bruyne unleashed a 25-yard free-kick which soared into the top corner of the goal.

Ildefons Lima pulled a goal back for Andorra from the penalty spot in the 51st minute before Eden Hazard restored Belgium's two-goal advantage, also from the spot, five minutes Laurent Depoitre added a fourth for

Lewis Hamilton won Sunday's Russian Grand Prix to take a massive lead in the world championship after arch rival and Mercedes teammate Nico Rosberg retired.

Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel finished second with Sergio Perez in a Force India completing the podium in Sochi.

This ninth win of 2015 moved Hamilton up to 302 points in the drivers standings with Vettel overtaking Rosberg, the former fourtime champion now placed second on 236 points, with Rosberg on 229.

Hamilton can clinch the title in the United States Grand Prix on October 25 if the cards fall in his favour in Texas.

Hamilton wins Conte's 4-2-4 wins hearts

Italy coach Antonio Conte applauded his deployment of a rarely-used tactical system that could provide the basis for his "little war machine" when the Azzurri head to Euro 2016 next summer.

Italy qualified for next summer's showpiece in France thanks to a 3-1 win over Azerbaijan in Baku complete with goals from Eder, Stephan El Shaarawy and Matteo Darmian. The win left Italy top of Group H with a two-point cushion on Norway ahead of the sides' final qualifier in Rome. Conte pledged his side would "honour" their final group

B and, two years later, repeated the feat with Siena, paving the way for him to join his former club, Juventus, as coach in 2011.

Although Conte went on to favour a 3-5-2 during three, scudetto-winning seasons at the Turin giants, his current position is offering more flexibility.

"In Baku, it wasn't just the early goal I liked. We gradually began using a 4-2-4, a system that I used to win the league (Serie B) with Bari and Siena, " said the 46-year-old.

"I wanted to use it at Juventus, but we didn't have the right kind of players for it, and here I've found them. Conte's tactical system found another advocate in El

Shaarawy, who said: "Eder, (Graziano) Pelle and myself linked up really well. I think that was obvious to see." "It's great to score my first Italy goal," said Darmian, who

scored the third goal for the side and his first international goal. "You could see by the way I hugged my teammates how emotional it was."
