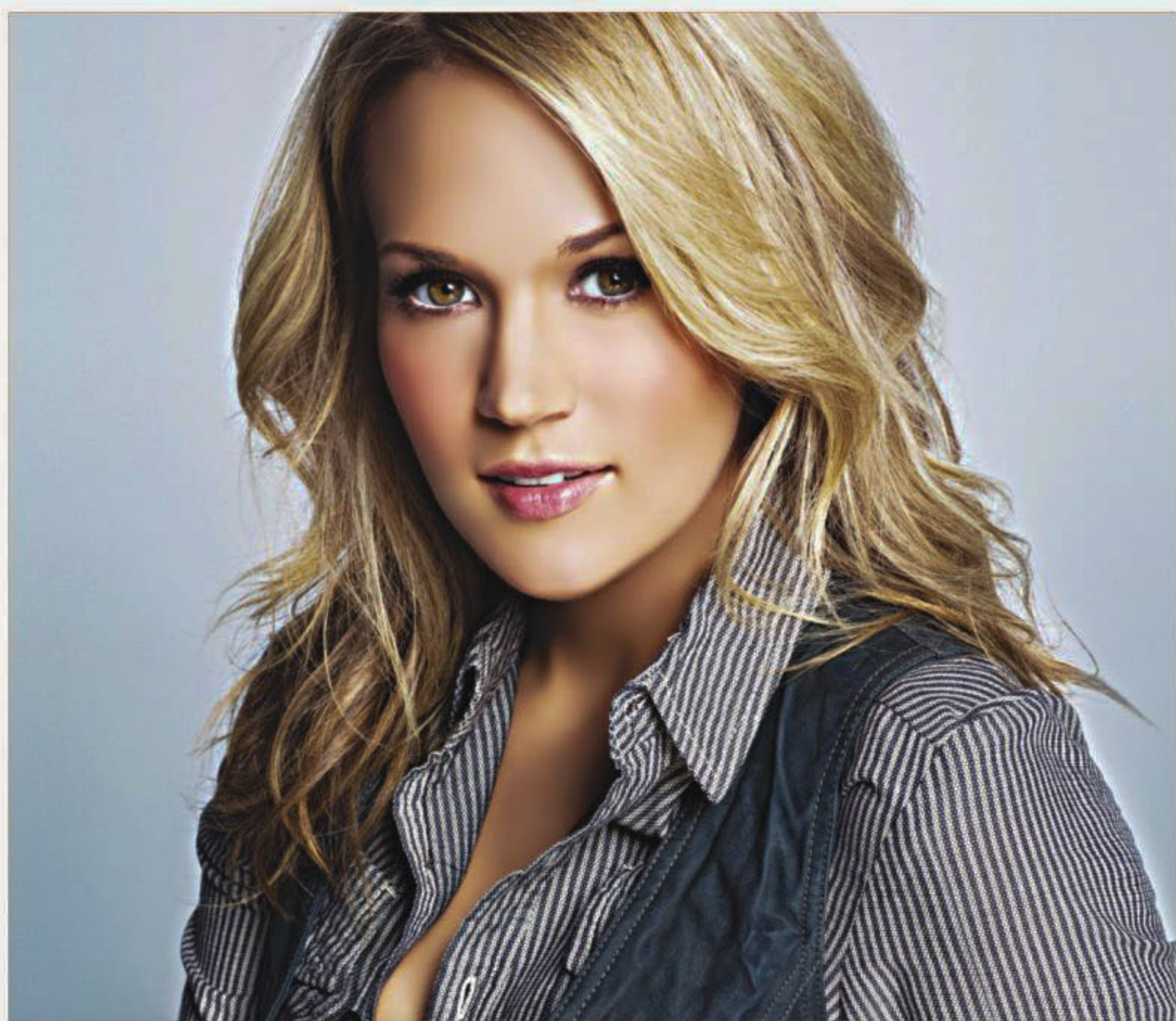


# CARRIE UNDERWOOD RELEASES NEW SINGLE 'HEARTBEAT'

# X-MEN APOCALYPSE 'WRAPS -UP' THE X-MEN MOVIES SAGA

The first X-Men movie trilogy – *X-Men* (2000), *X2* (2003), *X-Men: The Last Stand* (2006) – was a major herald of the oncoming age of super hero universe movie franchising; unfortunately that also meant that it suffered the early growing pains of poor foresight, planning and execution. Since that dark time, the X-Men movie franchise has managed to find its way back into fans' hearts, thanks to a semi-successful quasi-reboot prequel, *X-Men: First Class* (2011), and a sequel film *Days of Future Past* (2014) that used a time travel plot

device to essentially put a blank slate wipe on the X-Men movie continuity. Now director Bryan Singer is working on *X-Men: Apocalypse* for a 2016 release, and in his own words, it will be the end chapter of in the X-Men movie saga we've seen thus far. In addition to introducing new characters like Olivia Munn's *Psylocke*, the series is essentially giving the core X-men characters a chance to develop into something different than what we saw in the first trilogy.
