
attractive to the audiences. They even had meeting with the artist, director, cameraman and the producer regarding that.

all-new episodes will feature appearances by guest stars, including Joel McHale ("Community"), Robbie Amell ("The Flash"), Lauren Ambrose ("Dig," "Six Feet Under"), Annabeth Gish ("The Bridge"), Annet Mahendru ("The Americans"), Rhys Darby ("Flight of the Conchords"), Kumail Nanjiani ("Silicon Valley") and William B. Davis, who reprises his role as "Cigarette Smoking Man." Three of the episodes are written and directed by Chris Carter, with the remaining new episodes written and directed by original series veterans Glen Morgan, Darin Morgan and James Wong.

Talk of The X-Files returning to television has gone on as long as the series has been off the airwaves, and after so many years, the possibility seemed as remote as one of Mulder's alien abduction theories. Thankfully though, it seems fans' wishes have been answered.
