JU teachers strike indefinitely today

Their demand for removal of BCL leader from post of administrative officer not met

Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association goes on an indefinite strike from today as their demand for cancellation of a Bangladesh Chhatra League leader's appointment as an administrative officer of the university was not met by yesterday.

The decision came at a meeting on the campus yesterday. On Saturday, Juta issued a 24-hour ultimatum to meet the demand.

Prof Khabir Uddin, president of Juta, said the decision on the admission test, scheduled to be held between October 25 and November 2, would be taken in an emergency meeting today.

Vice Chancellor Prof Farzana Islam recruited Faysal Hossain Dipu, JU unit organising secretary of BCL, as an administrative officer on an ad-hoc basis on July 13.

Juta alleged that Faysal was among the BCL men who attacked teachers staging a sit-in on the campus on October 9, 2013 demanding the then VC Prof Anwar Hossain's removal.

Faysal, who obtained his master's degree from the statistics department that year, declined to comment. Prof Farzana could not be reached over her cellphone despite repeated attempts.

Row over Highway Ban on 3-Wheelers

Inu calls for talks for solution

A national dialogue involving all parties concerned is needed to find out a permanent solution to the conflict over whether three-wheelers should run on highways, said Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu yesterday.

Addressing the national convention of Bangladesh Autorickshaw Auto-tempo Malik-Chalok-Beboshayee Sangram Parishad at the capital's Jaitya Press Club, Inu said a policy should be formulated in line with a modern communication system for motorised and non-motorised three-wheelers.

The road transport and bridges ministry banned threewheelers like auto-rickshaws and other slow-moving and unfit vehicles on highways from August 1, except for the period of 6:00am to 8:00am when they can fuel up.

The ban was imposed to curb road accidents and control highway traffic and according to a report of Accident Research Institute (ARI) of Buet, road accidents have seen a decline since after the ban. About the ban, Inu said if the SEE PAGE 5 COL 5 STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday rejected a bail petition filed by war crimes accused Md Abdul Kuddus facing three charges for his alleged involvement in crimes against humanity during the 1971 Liberation War.

Kuddus, 84, filed the petition seeking his bail citing old age and poor health condi-

The three-member tribunal led by Justice Anwarul Haque said the prison authorities are providing Kuddus treatment at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University.

His treatment will be continued, the tribunal said, adding that they did not find any reason to grant him bail right now.
