Oppressors of children won't be spared

Warns PM marking Sheikh Russell's 51st birthday

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday warned that no one would be spared if found guilty of child repression as it is a crime against humanity.

She was speaking at a programme organised at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the capital marking the 51st birthday of her murdered younger brother Sheikh Russell.

Sheikh Russell Jatiya Shishu Kishore Parishad organised the programme.

On this day in 1964, Sheikh Russell, the youngest son of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, was born at

Bangabandhu Bhaban in Dhanmondi.

On the fateful night of August 15, 1975, Sheikh Russell, a class IV student of University Laboratory School at that time, was assassinated along with most of the family members of Bangabandhu. Sheikh Hasina yester-

day urged all to remain vigilant so that incidents like child oppression and killing can be brought to an end in the country. She urged all, including children, to give their all-out efforts to stop child repression.

Referring to torture of children engaged in household works, she wondered how people could do such things. She also asked the people to think about their own children before torturing others'. "Being born into a poor family is not a sin... all children have their basic rights to enjoy."

SUST ADMISSION TESTS

VC seeks opponent teachers' help

Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust) Vice-Chancellor (VC) Prof Aminul Haque Bhuiyan yesterday urged teachers who resigned demanding his removal to assist him in holding the admission process for undergraduate courses after the Durga Puja and Ashura holidays. Though "Mohan Muktijuddher Chetonay Udbuddho

Shikkhak Brindo" on October 10 announced suspending their movement over the demand, its convener, Prof Syed Shamsul Alam, reaffirmed to The Daily Star yesterday that they would not take part in the process. The 10-day holiday begins today and the exams will begin on November 14.

The teachers' forum raised the demand and accused the VC of being involved in corruption, nepotism, and misbehaving with colleagues from April 13. That day a heated altercation between the VC and 19 teachers took place when the latter met him to discuss ways for allocating space in an academic building. After their April 19 ultimatum seeking the removal passed with no change, 35 teachers, including Dr Muhammed Zafar Iqbal, stepped down from 37 administrative posts. The VC refutes the allegations. Prof Aminul made the urge at a dialogue at Sust Press Club.

48 Jamaat-Shibir men held in Ctg, Rangpur

Police arrested 48 leaders and activists of Jamaat-Shibir in Chittagong and Rangpur yesterday and on Saturday.

In Rangpur, 46 leaders and activists of Jamaat-Shibir were arrested in separate drives yesterday and on Saturday in connection with subversive activities in the district.

Meanwhile in Chittagong city, Mamunur Rahman, 28, -- former president of Bakalia Thana unit of Shibir -- and his younger brother Anisur Rahman, 24, were arrested in Rahattarpool area in connection with cases filed over similar charges.

Court refuses to put Barrister Shakila on new remand

A Chittagong court yesterday rejected a four-day remand petition for Barrister Shakila Farzana who was arrested allegedly for involvement in financing a militant outfit, Shaheed Hamja Brigade.

Chittagong Judicial Magistrate Shiplu Kumar Dey passed the order. The court also sent Shakila to jail after rejecting her bail prayer, said court sources.

On October 12, Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-7) sought remand for Shakila.

Public Prosecutor (PP) Abul Hashem said they will move a petition before the Chittagong District Sessions Judge court challenging the court order.

Earlier, on August 26, Barrister Shakila gave confessional statement before a Chittagong court in the case, said court sources.

Meanwhile, the jail authorities informed the court that they formed a medical board to carry out check-up on Shakila as she was ill earlier. The court directed the board to submit its report within three days. Shakila was detained on August 18 in the capital's Dhanmondi.

He confessed to the crime before a Chittagong court on Saturday night and another JMB man Bulbul Ahmed Sarkar alias Fuad confessed to it last night.

3 hurt in fire at shoe factory
