40 injured as outsiders attack students

Authorities shut Kabi Nazrul Hall for an indefinite period, form probe body

At least 40 students of Comilla Victoria Government College were injured in an attack by outsiders on Saturday night. In the wake of the situation, the college authorities in an emergency Academic Council meeting yesterday declared Kabi Nazrul Hall closed sine die and asked the students to vacate the dormitory by afternoon. Students and several teachers alleged that some

outsiders of Dhramapur-Daulutpur area, adjacent to the hall, were engaged in stalking female students in front of the library building on October 6. Protesting the incident, students of the hall vandalised several shops and a motorbike in the area on the day.

As a sequel to this, three students of the hall were hacked in front of a shop in the area on Saturday night. As fellow students rushed to the spot to rescue the trio, some people of

Dhramapur--Daulutpur area fired at least 60 bullets and hurled cocktails, leaving at least 40 students injured.

At one stage, the outsiders attacked the hall, cut the electricity line and vandalised rooms and motorbikes.

Police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. The injured were taken to Comilla Medical College Hospital.

M o h a m m a d Shamsuzzaman, inspector of Sadar Model Police

Station, said the situation remained calm yesterday. Additional police have been deployed in the area to avert any further untoward incident, he added.

Md Abdur Rashid, principal of the college, formed a probe body to investigate the incident. The committee has been asked to submit its report within seven days.

The college authorities have also filed a general diary (GD) with Sadar Model Police Station in this connection.

4 Pabna JMB men sent to jail after remand

Four JMB men were sent to jail yesterday on expiry of their five day's remand.

They are Md Ziaur Rahman, 35, Md Shariful Islam Tulip, 22, Md Alim Pramanik, 36, and Amzad Hossain, 30.

Police produced them in the Cognizance Court-2 in the afternoon. The court sent them to jail, said Md Abu Jahid, assistant superintendent of police (ASP), Ishwardi circle.

Earlier, the same court granted five day's remand for the four JMB men detained in connection with the attack on Luke Sarkar, pastor of Faith Bible Church, on October, 5.

"During interrogation in remand they gave some important information about JMB activities. We are verifying the information," the ASP said, declining to reveal the information for the sake of investigation. "If needed, we will appeal to the court, seeking further remand," he added.

Luke Sarkar, 52, was attacked by three motorbike riders at his house in Schoolpara area of Ishwardi on October 5. He managed to escape with a few minor injuries.

Idols vandalised at Satkhira temple

Criminals damaged four idols at Babulia Temple in Sadar upazila yesterday.

Locals said the incident came to light when devotees went to the temple in the morning and found four idols, including one of deity Durga, broken.

Police said they have launched a drive to arrest the culprits involved.

Additional police forces have been deployed in the area.

Stalkers stab schoolgirl in Kishoreganj, one arrested

A schoolgirl was stabbed by stalkers in Kishoreganj Sadar upazila yesterday morning.

The victim, Smriti Akhtar, 15, is a Class X student of Nandala Asmuddin High School in the upazila. Smriti came under attack while she was going to the school to appear in the SSC test examinations at around 9:45am.

Quoting locals and family sources, police said Md Touhid, 21, son of Md Humayun of the village, had

been stalking Smriti, daughter of late Helal Uddin of Ponkolima village in the upazila, for long.

As he was refused by the girl repeatedly, Touhid, a garment worker in Gazipur, and his accomplices waylaid the girl on her way to school. At one stage, Touhid started stabbing the girl with a sharp weapon, leaving her seriously injured, said police.

Hearing Smriti's screams, locals rushed to the spot and took the girl to Kishoreganj General Hospital. Later, the doctors referred her to

Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) as her condition deteriorated, police said.

Dr Md Zakir Hossain, emergency medical officer at MMCH, said the girl sustained five stab injuries on her neck and upper part of the left hand.

Police detained one Mamun, 22, an accomplice of Touhid, for his alleged involvement in the incident. No case was lodged with the police station concerned as of writing of this report at 4:30pm.

Man stabbed to death over land dispute in Chandpur

Clash over capture of water body leaves 50 injured in Habiganj

A man was killed over land dispute in Faridganj upazila of Chandpur district on Saturday.

The deceased is Hannan Sheikh, 55, son of Adam Ali Sheikh of Sahapur village in the upazila.

Quoting victim's family members, police said there had been a longstanding dispute between Hannan and one Abu Taher of the village over the ownership of a piece of land.

The duo locked in an altercation over the issue around 12:00noon. At one stage, Taher's two sons-Imran

and Momin--swooped on Hannan and beat him mercilessly, leaving him critically injured.

Family members took him to Faridganj Upazila Health Complex where the doctors declared Hannan dead.

On information, police recovered the body and sent it to Chandpur Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy, said officer-in-charge Mostafa Kamal of Faridganj Police Station.

Away in Habiganj, at least 50 people were injured in a clash between two rival groups of villagers over capturing a water body at Kashipur village in Bahubol

upazila of Habiganj district at around 6:00pm, reports our Moulvibazar correspondent.

Two policemen--Inspector Azizur Rahman and constable Mosharraf Hosain--also received injuries when police tried to disperse the clashing groups. They were admitted to Bahubol Upazila Health Complex while the rest to Habiganj Sadar Hospital.

Quoting locals, police said the clash ensued when the supporters of Modhu Mia and Fazlu Mia tried to capture the water body in the area. They attacked each other leaving at least 50 people from both sides injured.

Abducted boy found murdered

Police recovered the body of a boy from a paddy field at Bottali village in Gobindaganj Sadar upazila

The law enforcers arrested two abductors named Sathi Mia, 20, and Minhazul Islam, 22 of the village. Mozammel Huq, officer-

in-charge of Gobindaganj Police Station said the two abducted Ainur Shahriar Nasim, 7, son of Jafrul Islam, from a playground at the village on October 16.

Youth's body found in water body

Benapole port police recovered the body of an unidentified youth from a water body at Rajgonaj border area under Benapole Port Police Station yesterday. Mofizur Rahman, sub-inspector (SI), Benapole Port Police Station, said police recovered the decomposed body of the youth, 30, at around noon. The body was sent to Jessore Medical College Hospital for autopsy, he added. The youth might have been killed after being mugged by criminals who later dumped it into the water body. A case was lodged with Benapole Port Police Station in this connection.

Drug addict handed over to police

Police arrested Bappy Hasan, 25, son of Abdul Samad of Munsipara village in the upazila and later produced him in a mobile court. The court, led by Sadequul Islam, assistant commissioner (land) of Khetlal upazila and also the executive magistrate, sentenced him to one month's imprisonment.

Two kids drown

Two minor boys drowned in ponds under Agailjhara upazila of the district on Saturday. The deceased are Mahin Sardar, 2, son of Abdul Alim of Jobsen area, and Angkan Das, 2, son of Manik Das of Bakal village in the upazila. Locals said Mahin fell into a pond adjacent to his house while playing beside it around 3:00pm. Angkan drowned when he slipped into a pond beside his house in the evening. Officer-in-Charge Monirul Islam of Agailjhara Police Station said.

Two forest robbers held

Law enforcers in a drive arrested two forest robbers from Arpangachhiya area in Shyamnagar upazila of the district on Saturday. Identity of the arrestees could not be known. BSF return 25 Bangladeshis

Twenty-five Bangladeshi nationals, arrested by Indian Border Security Force (BSF) on Saturday, returned home through Benapole check post yesterday.

Indian border guards arrested them while they were crossing the border illegally. Lt Col Abdur Rahim, commanding officer of BGB 23 Battalion, said BSF members detained the Bangladeshis from Jhaudanga bordering area on Saturday night for entering Indian without valid documents. BSF personnel handed over the arrestees to their Bangladesh counterparts yesterday morning.

Housewife tortured for dowry in Lalmonirhat, two held

A housewife was tortured by her husband and in-laws for 'dowry' at Khatamari village under Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila on Saturday.

Police rescued the victim and admitted her to Lalmonirhat Sadar Hospital.

The victim is Amena Begum, 26, wife of Abdul Aziz. She lodged a case with Sadar Police Station the same day, accusing her husband Abdul Aziz, 35, father-in-law Amir Hossain, 60, and mother-in-law Aziron Begum, 53.

Police and locals said

Amena Begum married her neighbour Abdul Aziz, 35, seven years ago. Since then, she had been regularly tortured for dowry. Unable to bear the torture, she left her husband's house about seven months back.

Aziz and his parents didn't allow Amena to take her daughter with her, police said, adding that the victim has been living in her parents' house.

"I went to my husband's house to see my daughter on Saturday afternoon, but I was not allowed to meet her," Amena Begum said, adding that she was

tied to a tree in the courtyard of the house and tortured by her husband and in-laws.

Dr Azmal Haque, resident medical officer (RMO) of Sadar Hospital, said the victim had injury marks on her hands, legs, back and head. Victim's husband Abdul Aziz went into hiding soon after the incident.

Contacted, Mahfuzur Rahman, officer-in-charge (OC) of Lalmonirhat Sadar Police Station, said they are trying to arrest Aziz. "We will prepare a charge sheet after investigation," the OC added.
