

Unexpectedly, the actor was hospitalised on Monday after a cardiac arrest necessitated a coronary stent procedure. Portraying Muhib in Meher Afroz Shaon's film adaptation of Humayun Ahmed's novel "Krishnopokkho", he had

thoroughly enjoying working in the film. Beginning October 8, he had shot for eight days for the film, including a nightlong filming of a song with Mahiya Mahi on October 18. On the morning of October 19, he left for Bagerhat to attend a programme, and returned by helicopter that very evening.

Straight after landing he went to the Hoi Choi shooting house in Uttara, to shoot for a sequence with Mahiya Mahi's character whom he is supposed to marry

Gazi Nafis Ahmed wins 3rd prize at Pride Photo Awards

Bangladeshi photographer Gazi Nafis Ahmed bagged the third prize at international Pride Photo Award-2015, held recently at the historic Old Church in Amsterdam, says a press release.

There were 3,800 entries from 60 countries. Pride Photo Award is considered to be the most prestigious contest for Photography about gender diversity.

Nafis won his award in the "Stories of Love and Pride" category for his series "Inner Face" which addresses the sensitive and precarious issues of human rights of the LGBT community. The series conveys the challenges involved in the expressions of the community in a traditional and conservative culture like Bangladesh.

Gazi Nafis Ahmed studied Art & Design at the Sir John Cass Department of Art, Media & Design of London Guildhall University in London, and Photography at the Danish School of Media and Journalism in Denmark.

The Pride Awards exhibition, opening on the same day as Award ceremony at the Old Church in Amsterdam, will end on 25 October 2015.


The programme was presided over by Rakhal Chandra Dey, district president Puja Udjapon Parishad.

The 1956 film "Around the World in 80 Days" based on the Jules Verne classic of the same title, was the first Hollywood film to be shot in Bangladesh. A sequence of the epic action adventure comedy film, directed by Michael Anderson, was shot in Moulvibazar's Lawachora National Park. The film went on to win five Oscars, including Best Picture.

Bollywood superstar Shah Rukh Khan may have redefined romance in "Dilwale Dulhaniya Le Jayenge" (DDLJ), but the actor says he almost refused the film as he found the role too "girlish".

Shah Rukh made this revelation in "Making of DDLJ", a documentary released to mark the 20th anniversary of the film. Directed by Aditya Chopra, the documentary also starred Kajol, Mandira Bedi, Anupam Kher, Amrish Puri and Farida Jalal. The one-hour documen-

tary features unseen footages, behind-thescene shots and interviews of the cast and Shah Rukh, who was mostly seen in darkaction-thrillers like "Darr", "Baazigar",

"Anjaam" prior to "DDLJ", confessed his apprehensions of starring in a romantic film.

He also shared how, just before starting the film, he was undergoing a low phase due to his sister's illness.

The documentary chronicles the movie's inception, with pictures of Chopra's earlier drafts of the script, its making, its release and its subsequent legacy.

The documentary is packed with interesting trivia, from Kajol's reluctance to shoot the popular song "Mere Khawbo Mein Jo Aaye" in a towel, to Shah Rukh's insistence on adding an action scene in the climax.

It also has an unseen video of actress Juhi Chawla making a cameo in the film, which did not make it to the final version.

"DDLJ" propelled Shah Rukh and Kajol to stardom. The movie also gave a platform to filmmaker Karan Johar, choreographerturned-director Farah Khan, fashion designer Manish Malhotra -- all of who feature in the

documentary -- to start their individual career. Directed by Aditya Chopra, "DDLJ"

revolves around Raj (Shah Rukh Khan) and Simran (Kajol), two young non-resident Indians, who fall in love during a vacation in Europe with their friends. The film went on to win 10 Filmfare Awards, including Best Film, Best Actor, Best Actress and Best Director at the 1996 edition of the ceremony. The film, which completed 1,000 weeks on December 12 last year, is still running at a theatre in Mumbai.

Meanwhile, Shah Rukh marked 20 years of the film's release by recreating the film's famous poster by picking up Kajol on his shoulders during the shoot of Rohit Shetty's next project, "Dilwale". The film brings the two stars together after almost five years. They had previously appeared in 2012's release "My Name Is Khan", directed by Karan Johar.
