Toll collection of big bridges to go online

Says Obaidul Quader UNB, Dhaka

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader yesterday said the government has taken an initiative to collect toll of all the big bridges through online.

"An additional amount of Tk 30-35 lakh is now being collected from Meghna and Gomoti bridges each month as theft in toll collection has stopped. So, the government has decided to collect toll of all the big bridges like Bangabandhu Bridge through online," Obaidul Quader said.

He asked the authorities concerned to make the weight scales set up operational on highways for measuring additional weight of vehicles and directed additional secretary Faruk Jalil to check the machines and inform the ministry by next Sunday.

Kyle Haywood, a UK citizen, joined the Biman's next MD. national flag carrier as its MD and chief executive officer on January 5.

the last 10 months was not satisfactory.

HACKING OF CMCH DOCTOR

Two days have passed since a doctor of Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) was stabbed in his house at Agrabad in the port city on Monday but law enforcement agencies are yet to trace any of the assailants and the motive of the attack.

Cops still clueless

Earlier on Monday, two unidentified persons stabbed Tarek Shams, an outpatient medical officer of CMCH, leaving him critically injured at his house entering mysteriously in North Agrabad of Chittagong city.

Tarek's father, Dr Shamsul Alam, filed a case with Halishahar Police Station on Tuesday accusing two unidentified miscreants, said police. Syed Mohammad Ahsanul Islam, officer-in-charge of

Halishahar Police Station, said they recovered a cleaver from the spot. Police suspect that the attack was launched as a result of

previous enmity. However, Tarek's mother, a former principal of Agrabad Mohila College, said that her son had no enmity with

anybody as he was apolitical and popular among the locals. The victim is out of danger now, the hospital sources said. He was taken to the ICU at CMCH and undergone an operation following the incident.

Govt hatching conspiracy to keep BNP leaders away from polls Claims Nazrul Islam Khan STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Senior BNP leader Nazrul Islam Khan yesterday said though the government

was conspiring to keep their top leaders away from future polls by "punishing them in false cases", "big leaders were not necessary for winning any polls". Pointing to recent killing

of two foreign nationals, the BNP standing committee member said the government was blaming BNP without conducting any investigation.

"The government is accusing our leaders including the party's Dhaka city unit member-secretary (Habib-un-Nabi Khan Sohel)...But it is not right to accuse anyone without proper evidence," he told a doa mahfil at the BNP's Naya Paltan central office.

Jatiyatabadi Sramik Dal organised the programme seeking early recovery of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia, who is now in London for treatment.

Nazrul also said people want to see in power a representative government elected with their votes. "But this government fears to face a competitive election. The government is conspiring to hold another election like the January 5 one by keeping its main opponents out of the race," he said.

He alleged that BNP Vice Chairman Sadeque Hossain Khoka was deprived of his right to self defence and punished in a graft case.

A Dhaka court on Tuesday sentenced the former Dhaka city mayor to 13 years' imprisonment in the graft case.


