A man was found murdered on the bank of the river Dashani in Kandarpara village of Islampur upazila in Jamalpur yesterday morning.

Jahidul Islam, 28, son of late Alkas Ali of the village, used to pull rickshaw in Dhaka. Criminals stabbed him

in the abdomen, throat and head, said Deen-e-Alam, officer-in-charge of Islampur Police Station. On Tuesday, he visited

his uncle Sundar Ali's house in the village for his cousin's burial and he was not found on the bed on Thursday night, police quoted locals as saying.

The next morning, locals first noticed the body on the riverbank, the OC said.

# found empty in Savar

Police yesterday found a covered van, which had gone missing on the way to Dhaka from Chittagong early Thursday with imported fabrics, abandoned and empty in Savar.

Driver Abdul Malek was admitted to Gonoshasthaya Hospital as he was drugged by robbers in Comilla's Eloitganj, said Ashulia Police Station Officer-in-Charge Mohsinul Qadir.

The van was stationed by the road in Nabinagar around 2:30pm, he said.

The driver felt sick after taking tea during a stopover near Comilla cantonment, the OC quoted Malek as saying. When he reached Eliotganj, he asked his helper Shipon

to bring him a glass of water, he said. According to Malek, he became consciousness just

after taking a sip of water. He suspects Shipon, who was employed only two days ago, worked for the robbers. Shipon has been absconding since the incident, said

police. The vehicle, owned by New Generation Fashion in

Dhaka's Jurain, was carrying 25,600 metres of fabrics worth Tk 58 lakh, said factory director Biman Bihari Talukder.

## Missing covered van Eco-friendly 'light-trap' cuts use of pesticides promoting this programme throughout the

BSS, Dhaka

Light-trap and parching, environmentally sound methods for controlling harmful insects, especially Brown Plant Hopper, are helping farmers in different areas of Rajashahi during the current Aman season.

The light-trap method is getting popular among the local farmers for its cheaper price and better feasibility in pest management on transplanted Aman paddy.

Farmers set a light source placing a pot filled with the mixture of water and detergent right under it. Light attracts the insects and the mixture kills them when they fall into it.

Farmers of the 10 unions of Godagari

Upazila, those who used this method, did not have to use any pesticides this year as they did not found any insect on their paddy fields, said the upazila agrticulture officer.


The Department of Environment has been

district for the last few years to distract farmers from using chemical pesticides which causes serious damage to the environment.

Hazrat Ali, deputy director of DoE, Rajashahi, said, "During September and October every year, farmers face serious pest attacks and they have to spend more to get rid of this. With light -trap and parching methods, we can find the culprit insect and take proper the pest control measure, which is much cheaper and environment friendly."

It has reduced indiscriminate use of pesticides by 50 percent and eventually resulted in increased production than the previous year.

Nabibur Rahman, 43, a farmer at Kachua village in Tanore upazila, said, "I cultivated high yielding flood tolerant Aman paddy on 68 decimals of land this year and got 25 kg of paddy in each decimal. It was only 18 kg last year."

Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) yesterday formed a three-member body headed by an assistant director to investigate allegations that a woman had to undergo surgery for the removal of gauze left inside during an earlier c-section and not, as the surgeon claims, for an abdominal abscess.

Nurunnahar Boby, an assistant teacher of Naumahal Government Primary School, started having abdominal pains after giving birth to a girl, her second child, on October 20, her mother Shamsunnahar Begum told The Daily Star.

An intern at unit 3 of the gynaecology ward suggested an ultrasonography, based on which Nurunnahar was operated upon early yesterday, she said, bringing up the allegation. Both the surgeon, Dr Kaniz Fatema, who is also the unit's assistant registrar, and the unit chief, Dr AKM Sadiqul Azam, refuted the allegation, saying the ultrasonography revealed an abdominal abscess.

The body was asked to submit a report in three workdays, said sources.

"We would examine the test reports and if any negligence of the doctors is found, departmental action would be taken," said MMCH Director (in-charge) Dr Tajul Islam.


Md Mamunur Rashid, president of Super Bike Auto-Rickshaw Owners Association, said they will not operate the vehicles till today following a request from the district police administration.
