'Wrong Treatment' at CMCH

Family to go to court rejecting probe

As report finds 'no negligence' in surgery, which led to amputation of girl

The probe committee formed to investigate a "botched surgery" by Chittagong Medical College Hospital that led to amputation of a forearm of a girl did not find evidence of negligence of doctors during the surgery.

Meanwhile, family members of the girl, six-year-old Waheda, rejected the probe report and announced that they would file a petition with the court for a judicial enquiry. Dr AM Kazi Harun-ur-Rashid, a relative of Waheda and

an associate professor at Chittagong University, alleged that the doctors changed the information in Waheda's medical file after amputating her forearm and also forged the signature of her guardian in the consent form for surgery.

Waheda's father, Mozaher Ahmed, said they brought allegation of negligence against Dr Mohammad Hossain, assistant professor of the hospital's

orthopaedic department; Dr Rajib Barua, the department's assistant registrar; Dr Mamun, a fellow in the department; and Nurul Huda, a nurse. The probe body headed by

Prof Dr SM Ashraf Ali of the surgery department was formed on September 27, and it SEE PAGE 4 COL 6
