

Recording of testimony in Kibria murder case deferred

The Sylhet Speedy Trial Tribunal yesterday deferred till today the recording of witnesses' testimonies in former finance minister Shah AMS Kibria murder case as eight of the 14 accused did not appear before it.

Suspended Sylhet City Corporation mayor Ariful Haque Chowdhury did not appear as he is undergoing treatment under police custody in Dhaka, while the other seven, including former state minister for home Lutfozzaman Babar, appeared before different courts in separate cases.

Today was the third day of recording, and three out of 171 witnesses, including the complainant lawmaker and Awami League Habiganj district unit's general secretary Abdul Majid Khan, have testified so far.

The then opposition lawmaker and Awami League leader Kibria and four others, including his nephew Shah Manzur Huda and local AL leader Abdur Rahim, were killed in a grenade attack on a rally in Habiganj on January 27, 2005.

The case was probed three times and the investigators pressed charges thrice against 32 people, including Babar, while the charge framing was deferred for nine times.

Correct data, political will must to ensure housing for urban poor

Speakers tell policy seminar in capital

Correct demographic data on slums and their dwellers, proper financing mechanisms and strong political will to back poor-friendly housing policies are needed to solve the housing problem of the urban poor, speakers observed at a policy seminar yesterday. "Housing Solutions for the Urban

Poor - Challenges, Opportunities and Way Forward" was hosted jointly by the Ministry of Housing and Public Works, Real Estate and Housing Association Bangladesh (REHAB) and Bangladesh Urban Forum (BUF) Secretariat at Brac Inn in the capital's Mohakhali.

Presenting the keynote paper, Prof Shahidul Ameen, Department of Architecture, Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology, pointed out the controversy about the number of slums and their dwellers.

He mentioned a 2005 slum census

by the Centre for Urban Studies (CUS), National Institute of Population Research and Training (Niport) and MEASURE Evaluation, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill which showed Dhaka's slum population to be 3.4 million.

In 2014, Bangladesh Bureau of have sprung up," he said. Statistics (BBS) came up with a census showing it to be 1.06 million.

Noting a Central Intelligence Agency estimation that each year around 6 lakh people migrate to Dhaka, Ameen asked, "So where did all these people who migrated to the city go?"

UNDP Country Director Pauline Tamesis recommended ensuring security of land tenure (rights on the land) and improving housing finance mechanism to solve the housing problem of the urban poor.

Housing and Public Works Minister Mosharraf Hossain urged the urban rich to create accommodation for their employees, including drivers and domestic helps, inside the apartment complexes they live in.

"If you had kept space on the ground floor of your luxury apartments for your drivers and domestic helps, the slums in Gulshan would not

CUS General Secretary Prof Nurul Islam Nazem pointed out that economic opportunities alone would not prevent migration from rural to urban areas.

He referred to a study of 2001 which showed that out of 30 top officials, including government employees of Khulna, only the mayor lived in the city while the rest in Dhaka because of better facilities such as reputed schools and hospitals.

3 businesses fined Tk 1.60 lakh

A mobile court yesterday fined three businesses Tk 1.60 lakh in Bibirhat area of Chittagong city.

Abdullah Al Mansur, executive magistrate of Chittagong District Administration, fined Lily Plastic Factory and Atique Metal Workshop Tk 30,000 each for not having renewed trade licence and environment clearance certificate.

Court also fined Taher Shah Enterprise Tk 1 lakh for giving less gas than the actual weight in gas-cylinders.

Officials of the Department of Environment (DoE) and members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-7) were also present during the drive.

10 illegal power connections snapped

A mobile court in Chittagong yesterday snapped 10 electricity connections and fined persons over Tk 10.67 lakh for having arrears and illegal connections.

The court, led by a senior judicial magistrate of Power Development Board, conducted the drive in Bandartila, South Halishahar and Patenga and cut three connections for not paying bills of Tk 4.28 lakh and cut seven illegal connections.

Besides, the court filed seven cases accusing 13 persons in connection with these misdeeds.

Stone trader robbed in Sylhet

transportation, infrastructure and peace-building department of Jica, said the government should view Dhaka's eastern fringe as a preferential development area for diversion of population settlement with planned transportation development.

"And to do so, coordination with private developers is very vital for a planned urban development there," she said.

The revised STP has proposed five metro rails (mass rapid transit or MRT), two rapid bus service (bus rapid transit or BRT) systems, three ring roads around the city and six expressways. Construction of one MRT, one BRT and one expressway are underway.

While construction work of MRT-6 is set to begin in February, feasibility options of MRT-1 and MRT-5 are to soon follow with Jica assistance, said Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader.

Mega transport projects like MRT, BRT, expressways and the Padma bridge would hardly help change the traffic situation unless people change their behaviour, he said, if the lawmakers and ministers break the law by driving on the wrong side of the road, general people would not abide by it.

The route alignment of MRT-1 stretches from the Shahjalal international airport to Kamalapur through Kuril, Progoti Sarani and Rampura while that of MRT-5 stretches from Gabtoli to Bhatara across Mirpur, Kemal

Ataturk Avenue and Madani Avenue. The revised STP is to be finalised by December and is expected to have cabinet approval by March next, said

the officials. On another note, Obaidul said the government has taken "adequate security measures" to ensure safety of

foreigners. "I state this boldly and emphatically that full security is there and the foreigners have no reason to be anxious over security either at home or workplaces so that no

development project is hampered," he said. DTCA Executive Director Md Kaikobad Hossain and Jica Chief Representative Mikio Hataeda also spoke.

96 BNP men sent




