




SPECTRE rakes in big numbers

According to The Hollywood Reporter, in just its first night of release in the UK, the latest Bond film "Spectre" has raked in \$6.4 million in just 647 locations. The film released in London a week ahead of its United States debut. The film is already tracking even with -and in some ways outperforming -- the previous Bond movie "Skyfall", which set records as the highest grossing Bond film of all time, hauling in \$1.1 billion at the global box office in 2012.



"Spectre" sees Daniel Craig return to the role of international spy James Bond, and is joined by two new Bond girls: Monica Bellucci (who plays Lucia Sicarra) and Lea Seydoux (as Madeleine Swann), Chrisoph Waltz, sharing the screen again with Seydoux (after Tarantino's "Inglourious Basterds"), plays the archetypal Bond villain Franz Oberhauser.

NAZRUL INSTITUTE REMEMBERS

ABBASUDDIN AHMED

Nazrul institute arranged a discussion along with a musical programme to celebrate the 114th birth anniversary of legendary folk singer Abbasuddin Ahmed. The programme was held at the auditorium of Nazrul Institute, in the capital on October 27.

A discussion on "Nazrul and Abbasuddin" was held first. Eminent artist and cultural personality Mustafa Monwar attended the event as chief guest while eminent singers -- Sudhin Das, Ferdausi Rahman and Dr. Nashid Kamal -- with former cultural secretary Dr. Ranjit Biswas were honourable guests. Executive Director of Nazrul Institute Ikram Ahmed delivered the welcome address while Professor Emeritus Rafiqul Islam, also the Chairman of Nazrul Institute Trustee Board, presided over the discussion.

Mustafa Monwar shared memories of Poet Kazi Nazrul Islam and Abbasuddin.

"The rendition of folk songs by Abbasuddin Ahmed evokes the visuals of idyllic Bengal. I can even envisage the colours and flavour of eternal Bengal in his rendition of Bhawaiya songs," said Mustafa Monwar.

"Abbasuddin Ahmed was a person of delicate taste. He was a complete man. Artistes have many things to learn from his unique rendition and lifestyle. The foremost contribution of the legend is to initiate music in Bangalee Muslim society that was earlier considered profane and was prohibited. We must be grateful to Kazi Nazrul Islam, Abbasuddin Ahmed, Polli Kobi Jasimuddin, Poet Golam Mostafa and others who initiated cultural practice in Muslim society," said Rafiqul Islam.

The programme also included launching of Sohrab Hossain Memorial Book, published by Nazrul Institute. The guests, along with two daughters of Sohrab Hossain -- Rowshan Ara Shoma and Rahat Ara Geeti -- unveiled the book.

A musical programme followed, where young artistes of Nazrul Institute and of Abbasuddin Academy rendered choral songs. Dr. Nashid Kamal, Kiran Chandra Roy and Chandana Majumdar were among others to render solos at the event.

Abbasuddin was born on October 27, 1901 in Cooch Behar, India. Abbasuddin was self-taught, except for a brief period when he learnt music from Ustad Zamiruddin Khan in Kolkata and Ustad Kader Buksh in Murshidabad. He sang different types of songs, though he became renowned mainly as a folk singer - singing Bhawaiya, Khirol and Chatka songs from Rangpur and Cooch Behar. He became increasingly popular with his rendition of Jari, Shari, Bhatiali, Murshidi and Bichchhedi -- especially when these were made into gramophone records. He also sang songs on Islamic themes composed by Kazi Nazrul Islam, Jasimuddin and Golam Mostafa.

"Tasher Desh" staged in Chittagong

Powerful satire

The staging of Rabindranath Tagore's play "Tasher Desh" by students of Dramatics Department of Chittagong University (CU) captivated theatre aficionados of the port city on Tuesday.

Ashim Das, a noted theatre personality of Chittagong and also Assistant Professor of Dramatics Department of CU, planned and directed the play, staged at the packed auditorium of Theatre Institute, Chittagong (TIC).

"Tasher Desh" is about a prince mired in the monotony of palace life. Joined by a fellow merchant, the prince embarks on a journey to discover the unknown and diversity of life. They arrive in another kingdom where spontaneity is dead and strict laws make for a joyless existence.



The prince brings spontaneity among the people and transforms the whole kingdom.

Through "Tasher Desh", Tagore created a mirror on colonial rule in India. The dance drama is a satire on the rigidity of class systems, both Indian and British.

Director Ashim Das and artiste Tilottama Sengupta were the choreographers of the drama. The costumes, light and stage of the musical drama were also designed by the director. The play opened with the song "Khoro Bayu Boye Bege" choreographed by Tilottama Sengupta.

Abir Mondal enacted the role of the king. Shohidul Haque and Mamunul Hauque enacted the roles of prince and merchant respectively. Nazmul, Imran, Nishi, Shakila, Muslima, Nishigondha and Latifa were also among the cast.

"Hello, is it me you're looking for?" It was Lionel Ritchie who sort of trademarked that song title, with his 1984 single that became an all-time classic, but he is not alone on that pedestal anymore. "Hello from the Other Side", Adele said in her comeback song after a three-year hiatus from music, and the whole world responded in an outburst. The British singer's latest release this week, from her upcoming album "25", has already

signs of slowing down. Anticipation has been building up to the song for a while, and for 48 straight hours after the song hit Youtube on October 23, it was streamed a staggering one million times per hour. The peak was recorded at 1.6 million in an hour, eclipsing the much-anticipated the 1.2 million mark set by "Star Wars:

The Force Awakens", and making it the biggest Youtube debut of the year. Adele also knocked off Taylor Swift from music video service Vevo's list of highest-streamed song in one day. On the first day of release, Vevo (and its partnering sites) notched a hit count of 27.7 million, surpassing "Bad Blood" (20.1 million) comfortably.

The song has been on the top of the iTunes chart since its release in 102 countries from Australia to Zimbabwe, and even pre-orders for

"25" has also put the album on the top of the album sales list in the US.

But it's not just the fanboys (and girls) going crazy over the song. A small video mash-up of Lionel Ritchie's "Hello" and Adele's "Hello" has gone viral across social media platforms, to the extent that Lionel Ritchie himself posted a split screen photo from the songs' videos and captioned it "HELLO @adele is it me you're looking for ...".




TV WATCH Shusmita Anis on ASIAN MUSIC
