Third seaport at Payra

Govt aims to turn it into deep sea facility gradually; WB ready to fund underground rail in Dhaka

The Payra seaport in Patuakhali would be operational from December on a limited scale. The government plans to gradually turn it into a deep seaport. "Apart from a deep seaport in Matarbari, another one will be constructed in Payra," Planning Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal told the press after an Ecnec meeting chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday.

The Executive Committee of the National Economic Council (Ecnec) approved a Tk 1,128 crore project to develop primary infrastructures and

Another victim of Hossaini Dalan blast died at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital yesterday, raising the death toll from the bombings to two.

Jamal Uddin, 55, a Sunni, was a hawker who used to sell fashion accessories like ribbons, sequins, and laces at different areas in Old Dhaka. He breathed his last at the hospital's intensive care unit around 9:00am, said relatives and hospital sources.

Khwaja Abdul Gafur, an assistant director at DMCH, said Jamal died of severe head injuries. A fivemember medical board was formed for his treatment after he was admitted to the hospital on Saturday, he added.


Restaurant owner known as living terror to his staff

Ariful Islam Sohel, owner of Ghoroa Hotel and Restaurant in Motijheel, had been furious with his 16-year-old staff Riad since the boy asked for a raise four months ago.

He would similarly get infuriated with any employee who would ask for a pay hike or want to quit, a number of Ghoroa staff told The Daily Star.

At times, Sohel would come to the restaurant drunk and threaten the workers brandishing his

there was not a damn thing anyone could do to him as he was very close to police. Early Wednesday, the restaurant owner

allegedly shot Riad to death with a revolver at his under-construction building in Swamibagh. He went into hiding after the incident.

Riad was about to leave his job and join another restaurant, where he would have

got Tk 6,500 per month, according to his brother Ripon. His salary was Tk 3,600 at Ghoroa.


BNP vice-chairman and former diplomat Shamsher M Chowdhury has resigned from the party citing health reasons.

But party sources said he was "disappointed and upset" with the party high-ups, particularly with Tarique Rahman for his "undue" interference in party decisions in recent months.

In his letter to party chief Khaleda Zia, now in London, Shamsher said, "As you are aware I was seriously wounded in the Bangladesh War of Liberation. For that I had to undergo major medical treatment both at home and abroad over the years. At present my health condition has further deteriorated.

"In view of my prevailing health condition I have decided to retire from politics with immediate effect. In SEE PAGE 17 COL

Bangladeshi women's bravery on celluloid

A new documentary on the courage of Bangladeshi women police officers in peacekeeping operations will be screened at the prestigious Mumbai Academy of Movie Image festival today.

Made by Emmy awardwinning Indian director Geeta Gandbhir and Oscarwinning Pakistani filmmaker Sharmeen Obaid-Chinoy, the film "A Journey of a Thousand Miles: Peacekeepers" follows a unit of 160 women who, between June 2013 and July 2014, travel far from their families in Bangladesh to join the United Nations Stabilizing Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH).

If one looks at the history of the emergence of the Islamic State or IS as it is better known, and its current operations in some regions in the Mid-east, it does not seem that the militant group was behind the attack.


Conditions here are not similar to the ongoing Sunni-Shia conflicts in some other Muslim countries and there appears no justification for IS to carry out any operation here at this time.
